PASTOR'S NOTES

What a world-wide surprise to witness the white smoke billowing above the Sistine Chapel in Rome; signifying the election of Pope Leo XIV on Thursday 8 May! The Conclave of Cardinals must have been inspired by the Holy Spirit to choose this man of God, whom so few thought possible to be the new Pontiff. Nevertheless, there Pope Leo stood on the loggia balcony of St. Peters, invoking his first words as Pope to be the same first Gospel words of the Risen Christ: "Peace be with all of you!", twice!! So appropriate that his final prayer was the Ave Maria in Latin; inviting us all in our own language/culture to pray for our blessed Mother's intercession in the Church and over Pope Leo!

You may have heard this past week, that our gifted Bishop Anjay Zglejszewski will be leaving Corpus Christi, to become Pastor of St. Joseph in Garden City. He will continue his duties as an Auxiliary Bishop in the Diocese, but now with added responsibilities of shepherding the people of his new parish. Bishop Anjay has truly been a blessing to all of us these past eight years, and we will miss his joyful presence in the rectory among his brother priests. Please pray for him as he begins this new challenge of spreading the Gospel of Jesus Christ to his new flock!

All of you know our own Deacon Brian Mannix, who is a lifer here at Corpus Christi. One of the best moves I have made as Pastor, was hiring Brian eight years ago to work in the Parish as a part-time Pastoral Associate. You see him regularly on the Altar doing the sacramental ministries of the Church. But Brian does so much more behind the scenes; in helping so many people, and in assisting the business management of our Parish. On Sunday 1 June 2025 at the 11:30 AM Mass, Brian will be celebrating his 25th anniversary of Ordination to the Diaconate. His friend from past seminary days is Bishop Edward Scharfenberger of the Diocese of Albany, who will be the main celebrant, along with Father Tom Arnao (another long-time friend) who will be the homilist. Please come to pray and rejoice with Deacon Brian and his wife Sue; to thank God for his whole life here in Mineola!

Pope Francis' 2025 Jubilee Year of Hope, along with our American Bishops' Eucharistic Revival, will come together on Sunday 8 June, here in our Diocese. Two "Eucharistic Pilgrimage Processions" (one from Eastern Long Island and the other from the West) will converge at St. Anthony's High School in South Huntington for this joyful celebration with our Bishop John Barres. Part of the western procession will come through Corpus Christi, beginning with Mass celebrated by Bishop Anjay on Wednesday 4 June at 7:30am. Following the morning Mass, we will process with the Blessed Sacrament through the streets of Mineola to Chaminade High School. Please join in this Mass & procession, in part to give thanks for Bishop Anjay's time with us, and in gratitude to God for our Catholic faith in the living Body of Christ at Corpus Christi!





V DOMINGO DE PASCUA



EVANGELIO DE SAN JUAN 13,31-33. 34-35

Cuando Judas salió del cenáculo, Jesús dijo: Ahora ha sido glorificado el Hijo del hombre y “Dios ha sido glorificado en él. Si Dios ha sido glorificado en él, también Dios lo glorificará en si mismo y pronto lo glorificará. Hijitos, todavía estaré un poco con ustedes. Les doy un mandamiento nuevo: que se amen los unos a los otros, como yo los he amado; y por este amor reconocerán todos que ustedes son mis discípulos”.



Estamos, en el evangelio de Juan, en la última cena de Jesús. Ese es el marco de este discurso de despedida, testamento de Jesús a los suyos. La última cena de Jesús con sus discípulos quedaría grabada en sus mentes y en su corazón. Juan es el evangelista que más profundamente ha tratado ese momento, a pesar de que no haya descrito la institución de la eucaristía. Ha preferido otros signos y otras palabras, puesto que ya se conocían las palabras eucarísticas en los otros evangelistas. La salida de Judas del cenáculo desencadena la “glorificación” en las palabras de Jesús. No!, no es tragedia todo lo que se va a desencadenar, sino el prodigio del amor consumado con que todo había comenzado. Jesús había venido para amar y este amor se hace más intenso frente al poder de este mundo y al poder del mal. Con la

muerte de Jesús aparecerá la gloria de Dios comprometido con él y con su causa. Ser cristiano, pues, discípulo de Jesús, es amarse los unos a los otros. Ese es el catecismo que debemos vivir.



La primera lectura es la descripción del primer viaje apostólico en que Lucas ha resumido la actividad misionera de la comunidad de Antioquía, y de Pablo mas concretamente. Es en la comunidad de Antioquía, donde los discípulos reciben un nombre nuevo, el de cristianos. La iniciativa de predicar a los gentíos, la lleva la comunidad de Antioquía de Siria, no la de Jerusalén. Sabemos que algunos de Jerusalén, ni siquiera veían con buenos ojos estas iniciativas, porque parecían demasiado arriesgadas. En esas ciudades evangelizadas, algunos judíos y sinagogas no aceptarían a Pablo y Bernabé con su doctrina.


Al final de este viaje de Pablo y Bernabé habrá que sentarse a hablar y discernir en Jerusalén qué es lo que Dios quiere de los suyos.



La Segunda lectura del Libro de Apocalipsis es una lectura grandiosa. Se anuncia una ciudad nueva, un cielo nuevo y una tierra nueva, de la que descende una nueva Jerusalén, que representa la ciudad de la paz y la justicia, de la felicidad. La Iglesia es el nuevo pueblo de Dios, en la figura de la esposa amada que va a desposarse con su prometido.

AMAI-VOS UNS
AOS OUTROS,

EVANGELHO DE SÃO 13.31-33. 34-35

Quando Judas saiu do Cenáculo, disse Jesus aos seus discípulos: *“Agora foi glorificado o Filho do homem e Deus foi glorificado nele. Se Deus foi glorificado nele, Deus também o glorificará em si mesmo e glorificá-lo á sem demora. Meus filhos, é por pouco tempo que ainda estou convosco. Dou-vos um mandamento novo: que vos ameis uns aos outros. Como eu vos amei, amai-vos também uns aos outros. Nisso conhecerão todos que sois meus discípulos: se vos amardes uns aos outros”*.



Estamos na última ceia; Jesus sabe que lhe restam poucas horas de vida e sente-se na obrigação de deixar o seu testamento. Da mesma forma que os filhos consideram sagradas as palavras que o pai lhes diz no leito antes da morte, também Jesus quer que os seus discípulos não esqueçam nunca as palavras que está para lhes dirigir. Eis o seu testamento: Dou-vos um novo mandamento: amai-vos uns aos outros como eu vos tenho amado. Ele fala como alguém que quer deixar alguma coisa como herança. O mandamento deixado como herança por Jesus é um presente: é o caminho que conduz à felicidade, aqui e agora. O evangelho fala do mandamento novo. Não é uma imposição, mas um ideal novo, o da doação de si mesmo.



A primeira leitura deste domingo, dos Actos dos Apóstolos, nos apresenta São Paulo e Barnabé concluindo a primeira viagem missionária que durou três anos. Atravessaram muitas regiões, anunciaram a Boa Nova em várias cidades e, antes de voltar para a comunidade de Antioquia, pela qual tinham sido enviados e à qual devem prestar contas das próprias atividades decidem rever as jovens comunidades que tinham surgido nos lugares onde eles tinham pregado a Palavra de Deus. Estas precisam ser confirmadas na fé e orientadas para aprimorarem a própria organização; por isso nomeiam em cada uma delas um grupo de anciãos.



A Segunda leitura deste domingo, do Livro do Apocalipse, nos transmite uma mensagem de alegria e de esperança. Descreve o encerramento da história da humanidade. Todos os males do mundo desaparecerão: um novo céu e uma nova terra serão criados.
