

Bishop Andrzej (Anjay) Zglejszewski has been with us for eight years, and will depart on 25 June to become Pastor at St. Joseph in Garden City, while continuing his ministry as Auxiliary Bishop in the Diocese. His thanksgiving/farewell Mass will be Sunday 15 June at 11:30 AM.

Father Ngozi Chimezie has been our Associate Pastor for six years, and will leave on 25 June to be the same at St. Catherine of Siena in Franklin Square. His thanksgiving/farewell Mass will be with Bishop Anjay's on Sunday 15 June at 11:30 am. Reception will follow downstairs for these two gifted men of God!

VI DOMINGO DE PASCUA



EVANGELIO DE SAN JUAN 14, 23-29

En aquel tiempo, Jesús dijo a sus discípulos: *“El que me ama, cumplirá mi palabra y mi Padre lo amará y haremos en él nuestra morada. El que no me ama no cumplirá mis palabras. La palabra que están oyendo no es mía, sino del Padre, que me envió. Les he hablado de esto ahora que estoy con ustedes; pero el Consolador, el Espíritu Santo que mi Padre les enviará en mi nombre, les enseñará todas las cosas y les recordará todo cuanto yo les he dicho. La paz les dejo, mi paz les doy. No se la doy como la da el mundo. No pierdan la paz ni se acobarden. Me han oído decir: Me voy, pero volveré a su lado. Si me amaran, se alegraría de que me vaya al Padre, porque el Padre es más que yo. Se lo he dicho ahora antes de que suceda, para que cuando suceda, crean”.*



Estamos, de nuevo, en el discurso de despedida de la última cena del Señor con los suyos. Se profundiza en que la palabra de Jesús es la palabra del Padre. Según San Juan, Jesús se despide en el tono de la fidelidad y con el don de la paz. Esta lectura nos va preparando a la fiesta de Pentecostés. Esta parte del discurso de despedida está provocada por una

pregunta de Judas (no el Iscariote) de por qué se revela Jesús a los suyos y no al mundo. El mundo, en Juan, es el mundo que no ama. La propuesta es sencilla: quien ama está cumpliendo la voluntad de Dios, del Padre.



Hoy leemos, en la primera lectura, uno de los episodios más conocidos y de los más importantes del libro de los Hechos de los Apóstoles: el Concilio de Jerusalén, que viene provocado por la libertad con que actuó en la misión evangelizadora la comunidad de Antioquia de Siria, donde trabajaban apostólicamente Pablo y Bernabé. La comunidad cristiana de Jerusalén, que era de judíos que recibieron el bautismo, pensaba que para ser cristiano, primeramente se debía ser judío, ser circuncidado, admitir la ley de Moisés y otras muchas más tradiciones. Pablo, desde el principio, se va a oponer a esta distinción tan incoherente y no menos injusta desde todos los puntos de vista. Ante Dios, ante Cristo, estamos todos en igualdad de condiciones. Lo único que existe es una diferencia cultural. En el Concilio de Jerusalén la decisión fue tomada: no es necesaria la Ley para la salvación. No hay que obligar a los paganos a someterse a la circuncisión, sino a abrirse a la gracia de Dios. El cristianismo encontró su identidad abandonando la Ley (la Torah de los judíos) por un Cristo crucificado y resucitado.



La nueva Jerusalén, no tiene templo, porque el templo es el mismo Señor; presencia viva de amor y fidelidad. Es el Cielo.

DOMINGO VI DA PÁSCOA



EVANGELHO DE SÃO JOÃO 14, 23-29

Naquele tempo, disse Jesus aos seus discípulos: *“Quem me ama guardará a minha palavra e meu Pai o amará; Nós viremos a ele e faremos nele a nossa morada. Quem me não ama não guarda a minha palavra. Ora a palavra que ouvís não é minha, mas do Pai que me enviou. Disse-vos estas coisas, estando ainda convosco. Mas o Paráclito, o Espírito Santo, que o Pai enviará em meu nome, vos ensinará todas as coisas e vos recordará tudo o que eu vos disse. Deixo-vos a paz, dou-vos a minha paz. Não vo-la dou como a dá o mundo. Não se perturbe nem se intimide o vosso coração. Ouviste que eu vos disse: ficaríeis contentes por eu ir para o Pai, porque o Pai é maior do que eu. Disse-vo-lo agora, antes de acontecer, para que, quando acontecer, acrediteis”.*



Jesus, na véspera da sua morte, despede-se dos discípulos. Diz-lhes que vai para o Pai, mas que estará sempre em comunhão com eles. O Evangelho deste sexto domingo de Páscoa é extraído do primeiro dos três discursos de despedida de Jesus contido no Evangelho de João. É um discurso inteiramente dedicado ao tema do seu iminente retorno ao Pai. O clima só podia ser de preocupação e tristeza porque o destino de Jesus estava prestes a se cumprir. Sua partida era iminente. Os apóstolos ficaram perturbados com as palavras de despedida de Jesus. Só lhes restava uma palavra de consolo: amor! Diz-lhes que vai para o Pai, mas que estará

sempre em comunhão com eles. O Espírito Santo que vão receber ensinará aos discípulos todas as coisas, recordar-lhes-á tudo o que Jesus lhes disse enquanto andou com eles, fará com que eles se mantenham em comunhão com Jesus.



Na Igreja primitiva havia dois grupos: os cristãos vindos do judaísmo e os cristãos vindos do paganismo. A relação entre estes dois grupos não eram de maneira alguma tranquilas, as tensões eram muito fortes e em algumas comunidades até a Eucaristia era celebrada em separado. A questão era esta: os judeus, que tinham abraçado a fé, exigiam que os pagãos, que também tinham aderido a Cristo, cumprissem as disposições da Lei do Antigo Testamento e dos rabinos. Foram realizadas reuniões para discutir o problema. Os apóstolos e os anciãos se reúnem em Jerusalém para resolver esse problema. Essa reunião é conhecida como concílio apostólico ou concílio de Jerusalém. Paulo e Barnabé que pregavam aos pagãos em Antioquia da Síria tinham ideias definidas quanto a esse problema. Achavam que Cristo e o seu Evangelho eram suficiente e que não deviam ser impostos aos cristãos de origem pagã obrigações que não eram essenciais. Chegou-se a um consenso: os pagãos poderiam considerar-se dispensado de todas as tradições dos judeus, porém, nas comunidades mistas deveriam abster-se de carnes sacrificadas aos ídolos, do sangue, da carne sufocada e evitar também contrair matrimônio com pessoas com as quais tivessem algum parentesco.
