

“Continuing the Educational Mission” Scholarship Award

We are pleased to announce again this year the Corpus Christi ***“Continuing the Educational Mission” Scholarship*** award. Even though our beloved parish school has closed, the mission of educating the young people of our parish continues. It is in this spirit that the scholarship award has been established.

A committee of educators from grammar school, middle school, high school and college as well as members from the financial community was formed and worked on this program for several months and developed this scholarship.

Based upon the successes from past years, we will continue to offer two scholarships this year:

- One for a student parishioner attending a Catholic High School
- One for a student parishioner attending, full time, a college or university.

Now two young people from our parish will each be awarded a scholarship toward their education.

A scholarship award of \$5,000 will be given to a student who will be attending a local Catholic High School starting September 2025 for the academic school year 2025/2026.

A scholarship award of \$7,000 will be given to a matriculated college student carrying a full-time course load of a minimum 12 credits/semester who will be attending starting September 2025, a 2-4-year college or university for the academic school year 2025/2025.

The scholarship will be paid directly to the school, college or university in two equal payments, one half for the fall semester and the second half for the spring semester or if the academic year is divided into trimesters, half will be paid in the first trimester and the second half paid in the third trimester.

The funding for these scholarships will come directly from the investment income earned from the proceeds of the sale of the Searing Avenue properties and **not** from any weekly or special parish collections. The announcement of the scholarship recipients will be made later this summer on or around August 9th. The scholarship is for one year. Applications must be submitted to the rectory by July 9, 2025.





VII DOMINGO DE PASCUA



EVANGELIO DE SAN JUAN 17, 20-26

En aquel tiempo, Jesús levantó los ojos al cielo y dijo: *“Padre, no sólo te pido por mis discípulos, sino también por los que van a creer en mí por la palabra de ellos, para que todos sean uno, como tú, Padre, en mí y yo en ti somos uno, a fin de que sean uno en nosotros y el mundo crea que tú me has enviado. Yo les he dado la gloria que tú me diste, para que se3an uno, como nosotros somos uno. Yo en ellos y tú en mí, para que su unidad sea perfecta y así el mundo conozca que tú me has enviado y que los amas, como me amas a mí. Padre, quiero que donde yo esté, estén también conmigo los que me has dado, para que contemplen mi gloria, la que me iste, porque me has amado desde antes de la creación del mundo. Padre justo, el mundo no t ha conocido; pero yo sí te conozco y éstos han conocido que tú me enviaste Yo les he dado a conocer tu nombre y se lo seguiré dando a conocer, para que el amor con que me amas esté en ellos y yo también en ellos”*.



Meditación del Papa Francisco

Jesús ora al Padre para que los suyos sean “perfectamente uno”: quiere que sean entre ellos “uno”, como Él y el Padre. Es su última petición antes

de la Pasión, la más sentida: que haya comunión en la Iglesia. La comunión es esencial. El enemigo de Dios y del hombre, el diablo, no puede nada contra el Evangelio, contra la humilde fuerza de la oración y de los sacramentos, pero puede hacer mucho daño a la Iglesia tentando nuestra humanidad. Provoca la presunción, el juicio sobre los demás, las cerrazones y las divisiones. Él mismo es “el que divide” y a menudo comienza haciéndonos creer que somos buenos, quizá mejor que los demás: así tiene el terreno listo para sembrar la cizaña. Es la tentación de todas las comunidades y se puede insinuar también en los carismas más bonitos de la Iglesia.



Hechos de los Apóstoles 7:54-60 relata la muerte de Esteban, el primer mártir de la iglesia. Este pasaje muestra la persecución que sufrió Esteban por su fe, su visión de Jesús en el cielo, su oración final y su muerte. El pasaje nos enseña sobre la resistencia del Espíritu Santo, la importancia de la oración y la capacidad de Dios de perdonar incluso en las circunstancias más difíciles.

La historia de Esteban demuestra que la persecución puede ser una realidad para los creyentes que defienden su fe. Sin embargo, el Espíritu Santo llena a Esteban de fortaleza, permitiéndole perseverar incluso ante la muerte.


La visión de Jesús a la derecha de Dios le da a Esteban la certeza de su victoria y le permite mantener su confianza en Dios.

La oración de Esteban, tanto para recibir su espíritu como para pedir perdón a Dios por los pecados de sus perseguidores, es un ejemplo de la importancia de la oración en momentos difíciles.

La muerte de Esteban se convierte en un testimonio de su fe y en un recordatorio de que los creyentes pueden morir por su fe, confiando en la gracia de Dios.

EVANGELHO DE SÃO JOÃO 17, 20-26

Eu dei-lhes a glória que tu me deste, para que sejam um, como nós somos um: Eu neles e tu em mim, para que sejam consumados na unidade e o mundo reconheça que tu me enviaste e que os amaste como a mim. Pai, quero que onde eu estou, também estejam comigo o que me deste, para que vejam a minha glória, a glória que me deste, por me teres amado antes da criação do mundo. Pai justo, o mundo não te conheceu, mas eu conheci-te e estes reconheceram que tu me enviaste. Dei-lhes a conhecer o teu nome e dá-lo-ei a conhecer para que o amor com que me amaste esteja neles e eu esteja neles.



A liturgia da Palavra deste domingo da 7ª semana da Páscoa, considerada na igreja a semana de oração pela unidade dos cristãos, nos coloca de encontro com esta mesma perspectiva eclesial. *"Eu te peço Pai que todos sejam um, como Tu Pai, estás em mim eu em ti"*, reza Jesus, nesta leitura bíblica segundo João. É um pedido que ainda hoje requer de nós, cristãos, um esforço, a fim de realizá-lo. Talvez o maior contratestemunho dos cristãos seja o de pregar um Deus que pede a unidade, enquanto nós vivemos

em "guerra", uma guerra silenciosa estendida no tempo, uma guerra capaz de pôr em cheque a realização do pedido de Jesus. Urge no nosso tempo um olhar cuidadoso para o tema da unidade. Para haver unidade, contudo, é preciso uma unidade das muitas instituições que formam a religião cristã, bem fundamentada e alicerçada. O medo de nos "perder" no contato com o outro, torna-nos indiferentes ao pedido de Jesus. Fechados em nós mesmos. O outro aspecto é da abertura ao diálogo com o outro, com as suas mais profundas convicções. Uma unidade bem alicerçada e a abertura ao diálogo, possibilitam o encontro, e posterior, caminho rumo à unidade.

Precisamos aprender com Jesus a viver na unidade. Se queremos viver uma vida a partir de Deus, precisamos querer viver na unidade, na diversidade do mundo e das várias outras realidades que nos cerca. Se queremos viver à semelhança de Deus, precisamos viver a unidade, pois Deus é três pessoas, igualmente distintos, porém unidos. Deus é comunhão, é relação. Uma comunhão que não exclui a singularidade, antes a torna livre e manifesta sua expressão.



A primeira leitura nos apresenta o martírio de Santo Estêvão, o primeiro mártir da Igreja. O Actos dos Apóstolos conta que ele foi apedrejado por testemunhar o seu amor a Jesus Cristo, por confessar que jamais negaria a sua fé por qualquer perseguição e sofrimento. Hoje queremos nos lembrar de milhões de cristãos que sofrem o martírio para testemunhar a sua fé.
