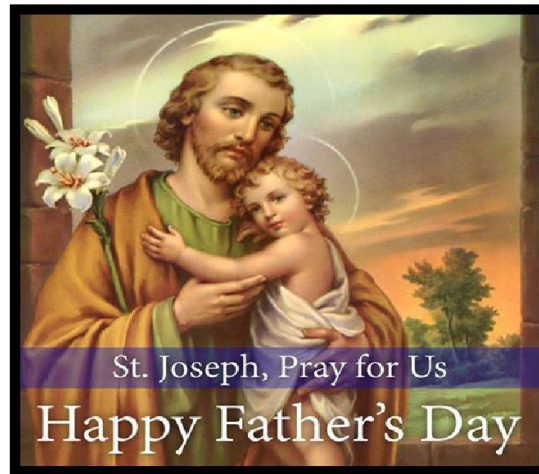

## Corpus Christi Church

### ***“Continuing the Educational Mission” Scholarship Award***

We are pleased to announce the Corpus Christi ***“Continuing the Educational Mission”*** Scholarship award will be offered once again this year. Even though our beloved parish school has closed, the mission of educating the young people of our parish continues. It is in this spirit that the scholarship award was established.

Based upon the success from past years, we will continue to offer two scholarships this year:

- One for a student parishioner attending a Catholic High School
- One for a student parishioner attending, full time, a college or university carrying a minimum course load of 12 credits.

Now two young people from our parish will each be awarded a scholarship toward their education.

A scholarship award of \$5,000 will be awarded to one student who will be attending a local Catholic High School, starting September 2026, for the academic school year 2026/2027.

A scholarship award of \$7,000 will be awarded to one college student carrying a full-time course load of a minimum 12 credits/semester starting September 2026, attending a 2-4-year college or university for the academic school year 2026/2027.

The scholarship will be paid directly to the school, college or university in two equal payments, one half for the fall semester and the second half for the spring semester or if the academic year is divided into trimesters, half will be paid in the first trimester and the second half will be paid in the third trimester.

The funding for these scholarships will come directly from the investment income earned from the proceeds of the sale of the Searing Avenue properties and **not** from any weekly or special parish collections. The announcement of the scholarship recipients will be on or about August 2nd. The scholarship is for one year.

#### **Requirements:**

- Completion and submission of an application to the rectory by hand or mail by June 24, 2026
- Applicant’s family must be registered in our parish records for one year prior to submission of the application.
- Applicant for the High School and College scholarship award must have received all three of the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Holy Eucharist & Confirmation)
- Applicant must be involved in service to either our parish, community, or school. 50% of the service must be to our parish such as: Altar Serving, Junior Lectoring, assisting our Religious Education Center as either a Hall Monitor, Teacher’s Aide, Teacher or assisting with our Sunday 20 Minutes with the Director or assisting with CYO. The remaining 50% of service given to school, community, or civic/cultural groups.

- Applicant must obtain 3 letters of recommendation attesting to the applicant's character from either a teacher, administrator, coach, scout leader, civic leader, or leader of the group to which the applicant is giving service. Additionally, the author of the letter of recommendation will also need to complete a form evaluating the applicant's character.
- Applicant for the High School will need to write a brief essay of no less than 500 words responding to one of the following topics: ***“As a faithful member of Corpus Christi (The Body of Christ) Parish, what does the Eucharist mean to me and how does it allow me to grow in my faith and influence my life? OR “Forgiveness is such an important aspect in our Christian life. What does Forgiveness mean to me and how can I forgive those who may have hurt me deeply?”***
- The applicant for the college scholarship award must write an essay on one of the same topics of at least 750 words.  
**N.B. Essays must be original in their composition. Any essay found to be aided by AI (Artificial Intelligence) will automatically be rejected and the application process will not move forward in the review process.**

Based upon the review of the applications and evaluations by a team of grammar school, middle school, high school, and college educators, the top five applicants for each scholarship will be required to participate in an interview (in-person) by our team of educators. The interviews will be conducted at the rectory of Corpus Christi in mid-July, 2026.

- All Applicants may re-apply for the scholarship the following year/s; however, Applicants may only be awarded the scholarship once in the High School category and once in the College category.

**Timing/milestone dates:**

- All applications, letters of recommendations and evaluation forms must be submitted by hand or by mail to the rectory by June 24, 2026.
- All interviews of the top five candidates in each academic category will begin mid-July 2026.
- Announcement of the scholarship winners will be on or about August 2, 2026.

The decision of the Scholarship committee and our pastor, Fr. Malcolm Burns, will be final.

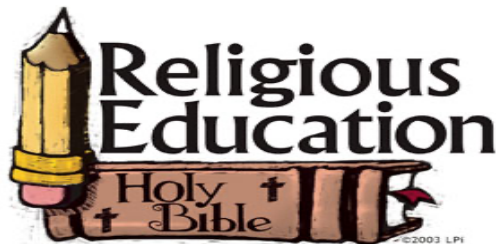
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## Catholic Daughters of the Americas®

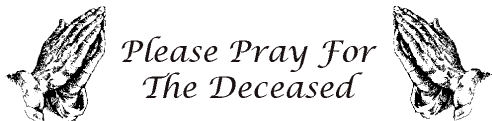

### SANTÍSIMO CUERPO Y SANGRE DE CRISTO



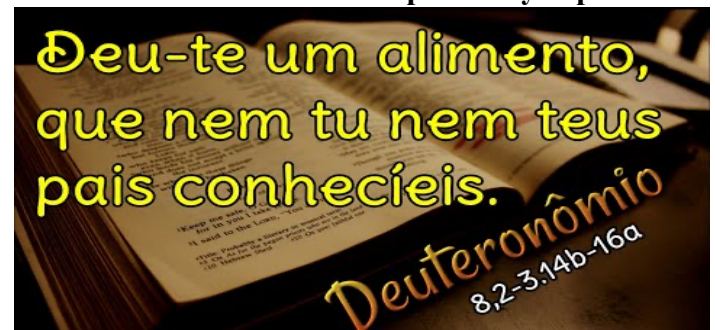
### EVANGELIO DE SAN JUAN 6, 51'58

En aquel tiempo, dijo Jesús a los judíos: “Yo soy el pan vivo bajado del cielo, el que coma de este pan vivirá para siempre. El pan que yo daré es mi carne, y la daré para la vida del mundo”. Los judíos discutían entre ellos. Unos decían: “¿Cómo este hombre va a darnos a comer su carne?” Jesús les contestó: “En verdad les digo: si no comen la carne del Hijo del Hombre, y no beben su sangre, no viven de verdad. El que come mi carne y bebe mi sangre, tiene vida eterna, y yo lo resucitaré en el último día. Mi carne es comida verdadera y mi sangre es bebida verdadera. El que come mi carne y bebe mi sangre vive en mí y yo en él. Como el Padre que vive me envió, y yo vivo en él, así, quien me come a mí tendrá de mí la vida. Este es el pan que bajó del cielo, no como el que comieron los antepasados de ustedes, los cuales murieron. El que come este pan vivirá para siempre”.

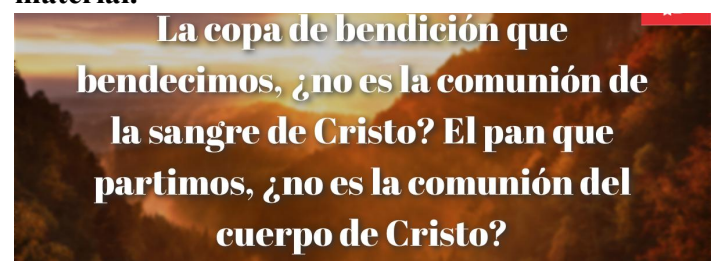


La lectura de hoy está considerada por los estudiosos bíblicos como una homilía basada en las enseñanzas de Jesús, pero elaborada más tarde por un predicador cristiano inspirado por el Espíritu Santo. En este sentido, todo el discurso del Pan de Vida viene del Señor. El texto le

señala a los lectores de hoy las dificultades que sentían los judíos al oír las palabras de Jesús. El discurso está basado en varias lecturas del Antiguo Testamento que se refieren al “alimento bajado del cielo que satisface el hambre del pueblo y al maná, pan celestial”. Los versículos del 51 al 58 son la sección final del discurso y usan un vocabulario más radical: carne, sangre, comer, alimentarse, beber. En la primera parte del discurso Jesús habló acerca de cómo alimentar a los discípulos que creían. El verbo “creer” se reemplaza aquí por: “a no ser que coman”. Estos versículos hablan claramente del alimento sacramental. Jesús proclamó una comunión misteriosa y real entre su propio Cuerpo y el nuestro. Juan, quien es el único evangelista que no relata la Última Cena, transfirió todo el contenido Eucarístico a este capítulo. Aquí él une los dos elementos esenciales de la Eucaristía cristiana: la palabra y el pan.



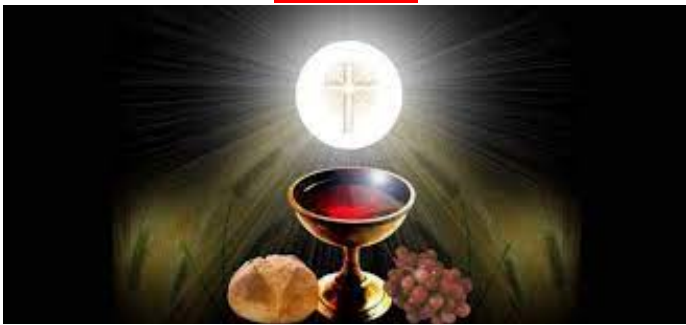
La primera lectura, tomada de la tradición bíblica, recuerda el éxodo del pueblo de Israel por el desierto. Destaca cómo las pruebas y el hambre fueron pedagógicas, enseñando la dependencia total de Dios y advirtiendo sobre el peligro de olvidar al Creador en tiempos de prosperidad material.



1 Corintios 10:16-17 nos recuerda que la Cena del Señor es mucho más que un ritual: es una unión profunda con Cristo y un llamado a la unidad. Al participar del pan y la copa, no solo nos conectamos con el sacrificio de Jesús, sino que nos volvemos un solo cuerpo con nuestros hermanos en la fe.

### SANTÍSSIMO CORPO E SANGUE DE CRISTO



### EVANGELHO DE SÃO JOÃO 6, 51-58

Naquele tempo, disse Jesus à multidão: «Eu sou o pão vivo descido do Céu. Quem comer deste pão viverá eternamente. E o pão que Eu hei de dar é a minha Carne pela vida do mundo». Os judeus discutiam entre si: «Como pode Ele dar-nos a sua Carne a comer?» Jesus disse-lhes: «Em verdade, em verdade vos digo: Se não comerdes a Carne do Filho do homem e não beberdes o seu Sangue, não tereis a vida em vós. Quem come a minha Carne e bebe o meu Sangue tem a vida eterna; e Eu o ressuscitarei no último dia. A minha Carne é verdadeira comida e o meu Sangue é verdadeira bebida. Quem come a minha Carne e bebe o meu Sangue permanece em Mim, e Eu nele. Assim como o Pai, que vive, Me enviou, e Eu vivo pelo Pai, também aquele que me come viverá por Mim. Este é o pão que desceu do Céu; não é como aquele que os vossos pais comeram, e morreram; quem comer deste pão viverá eternamente».

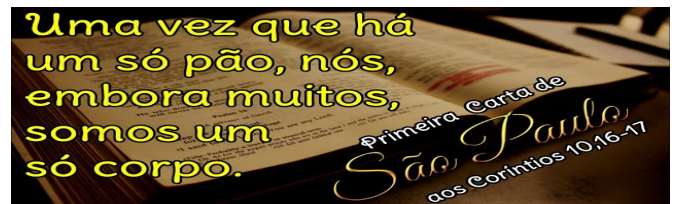


Ao longo destes domingos, a Liturgia vai propondo-nos, do Evangelho de João, o discurso de Jesus sobre o Pão da vida, que é Ele mesmo e que constitui também o sacramento da Eucaristia. O trecho de hoje apresenta a última parte de tal discurso. Algumas pessoas do meio do povo se escandalizam ao ouvirem Jesus dizer: «Quem come a minha carne e bebe o meu sangue tem a vida eterna; e Eu ressuscitá-lo-ei no último dia». O assombro dos ouvintes é compreensível. Na última

Ceia, o pão e o vinho se tornam realmente o seu Corpo e Sangue. A Eucaristia é o próprio Jesus que se entrega inteiramente por nós. Jesus conclui o seu discurso com as seguintes palavras: «Quem comer deste pão viverá eternamente». Sim, viver em comunhão concreta, real, com Jesus nesta terra já nos faz passar da morte para a vida. O Céu começa precisamente nesta comunhão com Jesus.



Na primeira leitura, o livro do Deuterónimo apresenta-se como uma recolha de discursos pronunciados por Moisés, antes de morrer; na realidade foi escrito muitos séculos depois, nos anos que antecederam a destruição de Jerusalém. É uma reflexão sobre os acontecimentos do Êxodo, com a finalidade de iluminar a situação dramática que Israel vive: está rodeado de inimigos e próximo da ruína. Que fazer num momento tão difícil? Como se fosse um refrão, no livro do Deuterónimo é dirigido ao povo um convite emocionado: *recorda, não te esqueças. Olha o teu passado, toma em consideração aquilo que Deus fez, lembra-te dos prodígios que Ele realizou em teu favor.*



Na segunda leitura, da primeira carta de Paulo aos Coríntios, o apóstolo Paulo destaca a unidade da igreja por meio da Ceia do Senhor. Ele explica que, ao compartilhar do mesmo pão e cálice, os cristãos participam do corpo e sangue de Cristo e formam, juntos, um único corpo
