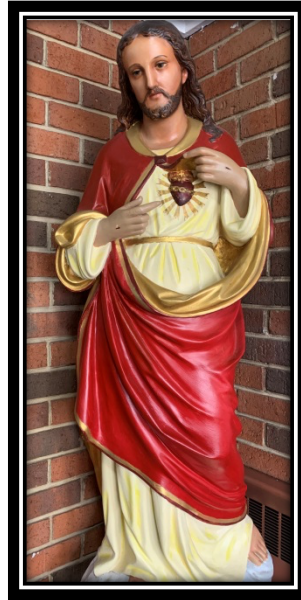

Pastor's Notes

Our own Bishop John Barres has declared that the month of June be dedicated to the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus in our Diocese. The primary feast day is Friday 16 June (followed by the Immaculate Heart of Mary on Saturday 17 June). But the whole month is a time to center our lives on the truth that “God is Love”; especially flowing from the heart of Christ.

Our parish is profoundly blessed to have a “mini-trinity” of images of the Sacred Heart. The white outdoor statue on the corner of Garfield and Willis exemplifies the “Inviting Jesus”; opening His arms and heart to all who pass by. The small statue in the lobby portrays the “Welcoming Jesus”; pointing to His heart with both hands. The original statue (over 100 years old) in the side sanctuary (where the Tabernacle of the Blessed Sacrament was for nearly 50 years) manifests the “Enduring Jesus”; one hand stretching forth to draw our hearts into His.

Please offer this “Prayer to the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus” during this summer season for our parish family of Corpus Christi. And feel free to take home one or two of the Sacred Heart Holy Cards located by the doors of the church.

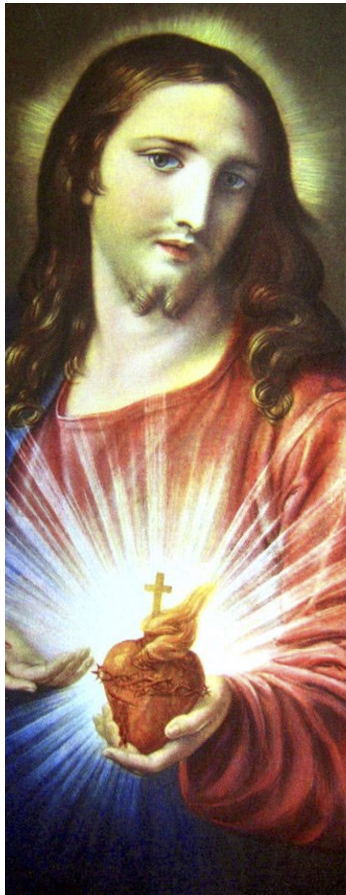

Every day, people in our community are helped because of support from funds raised through the Catholic Ministries Appeal.

Today, consider a dad like Paul. Paul saw information about the Catholic Ministries Appeal at his local parish, and he knew he had to turn to the Church for help since he had nowhere else to go. Paul had been gainfully employed for more than 10 years when he began to fall ill. Soon his medical issues made it impossible for him to keep working and he was forced to go out on disability.

After paying the co-pays on his medications, his family's rent and utilities bills, Paul had very little left to purchase food and other necessities for his family.

It was hard for him to ask for help, but with nowhere else to turn, he did. Catholic Charities found him a specialist who assessed the family's needs and directed them to appropriate resources in their community. He went to his Parish Outreach, where his family received food that allowed them to make it through the month. Paul and his family received the help they so desperately needed.

Today, Paul is back to work and the family is doing well. *"I am so thankful that I know there is somewhere I can turn, where there are people that care, people I can talk to, if I am ever in such a situation again,"* shared Paul.

Corpus Christi's 2023 "Continuing the Educational Mission" Scholarship Award

We are pleased to announce again this year the Corpus Christi "***Continuing the Educational Mission***" **Scholarship** award. Even though our beloved parish school has closed, the mission of educating the young people of our parish continues. It is in this spirit that the scholarship award has been established.

A committee of educators from grammar school, middle school, high school and college as well as members from the financial community was formed and worked on this program for several months and developed this scholarship.

Based upon the success from past years, we will continue to offer three scholarships this year:

- One for 2 student parishioners attending a Catholic High School
- One for a student parishioner attending, full time, a college or university.

Now three young people from our parish will each be awarded a scholarship toward their education. A scholarship award of \$5,000 will be given to two students who will be attending a local Catholic High School starting September 2023 for the academic school year 2023/2024.

A scholarship award of \$7,000 will be given to a matriculated college student carrying a full-time course load of a minimum 12 credits/semester who will be attending starting September 2023, a 2-4-year college or university for the academic school year 2023/2024.

The scholarship will be paid directly to the school, college or university in two equal payments, one half for the fall semester and the second half for the spring semester or if the academic year is divided into trimesters, half will be paid in the first trimester and the second half paid in the third trimester.

The funding for these scholarships will come directly from the investment income earned from the proceeds of the sale of the Searing Avenue properties and **not** from any weekly or special parish collections. The announcement of the scholarship recipients will be made later this summer on or around July 31. The scholarship is for one year. Applications must be submitted to the rectory by July 1, 2023.

In Mark's Gospel (12:38-44) we hear Jesus warmly praising the old woman putting her two small copper coins, worth about a couple of cents, into the collection box. She gave more than all the others; for they gave from their surplus while she gave from her dire need. The widow gave herself totally to the Lord.

The phrase "widow's mite" has made its way into the English language. It often refers to something small which, nonetheless, displays a tremendous generosity of spirit. Jesus identifies her to his own disciples as an example of a wonderful generosity of spirit. Jesus often encouraged his disciples to learn from people who were not his disciples. At this point in the gospel Jesus is in the Jerusalem, about to face into his passion. This woman who gave everything was a figure of Jesus who was soon to give everything on the cross. This seemingly insignificant widow who seemed to give next to nothing was, in reality, a living witness of divine generosity. The widow reminds us that there are saints in our midst that we don't often notice. A wonderful generosity of spirit can reveal itself in gestures that appear very ordinary and even insignificant to those observing. There can be times in our lives when we appear to have very little, in all kinds of ways, but if we give generously out of the little we have, we are rich in the eyes of the Lord. Corpus Christi St. Vincent de Paul is a way to help those in need. There is no gift that is insignificant. Every gift goes to help someone in need in our community. The need is great. The funds are scarce.

SANTÍSIMO CUERPO Y SANGRE DE CRISTO



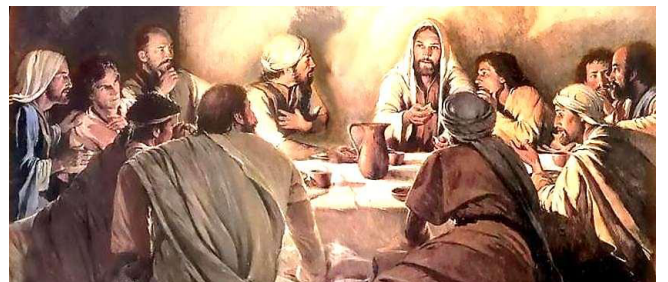
EVANGELIO DE SAN JUAN 6, 51-58

En aquel tiempo, Jesús dijo a los judíos: *“Yo soy el pan vivo que ha bajado del cielo; el que come de este pan vivirá para siempre. El pan que yo les voy a dar es mi carne para que el mundo tenga vida”*. Entonces los judíos se pusieron a discutir entre sí: *“Cómo puede éste darnos a comer su carne”*? Jesús les dijo: *“Yo les aseguro: Si no comen la carne del Hijo del hombre y no beben su sangre, no podrán tener vida en ustedes. El que come mi carne y bebe mi sangre, tiene vida eterna y yo lo resucitaré el último día. Mi carne es verdadera comida y mi sangre es verdadera bebida. El que come mi carne y bebe mi sangre, permanece en mí y yo en él. Como el Padre, que me ha enviado, posee la vida y yo vivo por él, así también el que me come vivirá por mí. Esto es el pan que ha bajado del cielo; no es como el maná que comieron sus padres, pues murieron. El que come de este pan vivirá para siempre”*.

La solemnidad del Cuerpo y la Sangre de Cristo se celebra en la Iglesia universal desde el año 1264. El papa Urbano IV estableció esta fiesta e invitó a todos los cristianos a abrazar con la mente y el espíritu a la Eucaristía, sacramento de la presencia real de Jesucristo. El texto del Evangelio de Juan es una elaboración teológica y catequética del simbolismo del maná, el alimento divino de la tradición bíblica. Juan no nos ha transmitido la institución de la eucaristía en la última cena del Señor. La predicación de Jesús en la sinagoga de Cafarnaún es muy fuerte en todos los sentidos. Como el pueblo de Israel, en el camino del desierto, Dios le alimentó con el maná, también a nosotros, en el camino siempre difícil de la vida, Cristo nos da a comer su Cuerpo y su Sangre: es el verdadero alimento para el camino, alimento que es fortaleza y alegría.



La primera lectura de Deuteronomio nos habla del maná, que ha sido en la Biblia el símbolo de un alimento divino en el desierto. El maná era solamente para el día, sin estar preocupados por el día siguiente y por los otros días. Y era inútil por la situación del calor del desierto guárdalo, ya que llegaba a pudrirse. A Israel se le enseñaba así a tener verdadera confianza en la providencia misericordiosa de Dios.



El texto de la segunda lectura no es el de las palabras de Jesús en la última cena sobre el pan y sobre la copa, sino una interpretación de Pablo del doble rito de la eucaristía: sobre el cáliz de bendición y sobre el pan. En esta carta de Pablo a los Corintios que estaban divididos, el recuerda a la comunidad que no es posible que haya divisiones. *“Vosotros sois el Cuerpo de Cristo”*.

SANTÍSSIMO CORPO E SANGUE DE CRISTO



EVANGELHO DE SÃO JOÃO 6, 51-58

Naquele tempo, disse Jesus à multidão: *“Eu sou o pão vivo descido do Céu. Quem comer deste pão viverá eternamente. E o pão que eu hei-de dar é a minha Carne, que eu darei pela vida do mundo”*. Os judeus discutiam entre si: *“Como pode ele dar-nos a sua Carne a comer”*? Jesus disse-lhes: *“Em verdade, em verdade vos digo: Se não comerdes a Carne do Filho do homem e não beberdes o seu Sangue, não tereis a vida em vós. Quem come a minha Carne e bebe o meu Sangue tem a vida eterna; e eu o ressuscitarei no último dia. A minha Carne é verdadeira comida e o meu Sangue é verdadeira bebida. Quem come a minha Carne e bebe o meu Sangue permanece em mim e eu nele. Assim como o Pai, que vive, me enviou, e eu vivo pelo Pai, também aquele que me come viverá por mim. Este é o pão que desceu do Céu; não é como aquele que os vossos pais comeram, e morreram; quem comer deste pão viverá eternamente”*.



As visões de uma freira agostiniana chamada Juliana deram início ao movimento da exposição do Santíssimo Sacramento. Em 1209 na diocese de Liege, na Bélgica, essa religiosa começa a ter visões eucarísticas, que se vão suceder por um período de quase trinta anos. Quando as ideias de Juliana chegaram ao bispo, ele acabou por acatá-las, na sua diocese e em 1246 celebrou-se na sua diocese a

primeira festa do Corpo de Cristo. O bispo de Juliana vem a tornar-se o Papa Urbano IV, que estende a festa de Corpus Christi para toda a Igreja no ano de 1264. No Evangelho deste domingo Jesus escandaliza os judeus ao afirmar que a sua carne é verdadeira comida e o seu sangue, verdadeira bebida. Na Eucaristia, Cristo identifica a comida partilhada com sua própria vida e pessoa. O pão repartido se torna presença de Cristo. Onde não se reparte o pão, Cristo não pode estar presente.



Na primeira leitura do livro do Deuterónimo, Moisés lembra ao Povo de Deus, os Israelitas, que Deus é fiel e nunca abandona o seu povo. Enfrentando a fome e a sede no deserto, os israelitas aprenderam a ter confiança em Deus e nas suas promessas. Também no deserto da nossa vida, quando enfrentamos as dificuldades da vida, não podemos nos esquecer que Deus está sempre ao nosso lado. Mas não podemos nos esquecer de que nem só de pão vive o homem, mas de toda a palavra que sai da boca do Senhor.



Na segunda leitura deste domingo Paulo escreve aos coríntios sobre a unidade que deve existir entre os cristãos. *“Visto que há um só pão, nós, embora sejamos muitos, formamos um só corpo porque participamos do mesmo pão”*. A Eucaristia é para os cristãos o sinal da unidade.
