Corpus Christi's 2021 "Continuing the Educational Mission" Scholarship Award

Application Due Date extended to June 30, 2021

We are pleased to announce again this year the Corpus Christi "Continuing the Educational Mission" Scholarship award. Even though our beloved parish school has closed, the mission of educating the young people of our parish continues. It is in this spirit that the scholarship award has been established.

A committee of educators from grammar school, middle school, high school and college as well as members from the financial community was formed and worked on this program for a number of months and developed this scholarship.

Based upon the success from last year, this year we are expanding the scholarship program with the inclusion of an award for a student parishioner attending a Catholic grammar or middle school. Now three young people from our parish, will each be awarded a scholarship toward their Catholic education. A scholarship award of \$4,000 will be given to a student who will be attending starting September 2021 at a local Catholic school in grades 6, 7 or 8 for the academic school year 2021/2022. A scholarship award of \$5,000 will be given to a student who will be attending a local Catholic High School starting September 2021 for the academic school year 2021/2022 and a \$6,000 scholarship will be given to a matriculated college student carrying a course load of a minimum 12 credits/semester who will be attending full time starting September 2021, a 2-4 year college or university for the academic school year 2021/2022. The scholarship will be paid directly to the school, college or university in two equal payments, one half for the fall semester and the second half for the spring semester or if the academic year is divided into trimesters, half will be paid in the first trimester and the second half paid in the third trimester.

The funding for these scholarships will come directly from the investment income earned from the proceeds of the sale of the Searing Avenue properties and <u>not</u> from any weekly or special parish collections. The announcement of the scholarship recipients will be made later this summer. The scholarship is for one year.



Español xi domingo del tiempo ordinario



EVANGELIO SEGÚN SAN MARCOS 4, 26-34

En aquel tiempo, Jes'sus dijo a la multitud: El Reino de Dios se parece a lo que sucede cuando un hombre siembra la semilla en la tierra: que pasan las noches y los dias, y sin que él sepa como, la semilla germina v crece; y la tierra, por sí sola, va produciendo el fruto: primero los tallos, luego las espigas y después los granos en las espigas. Y cuando ya están maduros los granos, el hombre echa mano de la hoz, pues ha llegado el tempo de cosecha. Les dijo também: compararemos el Reino de Dios? Con qué parábolas lo podremos representar? Es como una semilla de mostaza que, cuando se siembra, es la más pequena de las semillas; pero una vez sembrada, crece y se convierte en el mayor de los arbustos y echa ramas tan grandes, que los pájaros pueden anidar a su sombra. Y con otras muchas parábolas semejantes les estuvo exponiendo su mensaje, de acuerdo con lo que elllos podían entender. Y no les hablaba sino en parábolas; pero a sus discípulos les explicaba todo en privado.



Jesús solía hablar a la gente sencilla en parábolas para exponerles sus enseñanzas de forma asequible; otra cosa es que siempre lograra que lo entendieran. Qué quiere enseñarnos Jesús sobre el Reino de Dios con estas dos parábolas? Con la de la siembra que cresce sola, sin intervención del hombre, nos enseña que el Reino de Dios es ante todo, obra divina. En efecto, una vez depositada la semilla en la tierra, crece por su fuerza vital interna, sin necesidad de la atención constante del agricultor ya sea que éste duerma o vele. De tal forma que, cuando la hora llegue, el Reino de Dios vendrá con seguridad absoluta. Su venida es sólo cosa de Dios. Con la parábola del grano de mostaza, la intención recae en persuadirnos de que el Reino de Dios está llamado a extenderse por toda la tierra, a pesar de la pequenez de su comienza, de las trabas, las persecuciones y los retrocesos. Los impérios y las civilizaciones — como obras humanas — alcanzan su apogeo y luego decaen; pero la obra de Dios perdurará por siglos sin fin.



La segunda lectura deste domingo, de Ezequiel, ejemplifica, en la rama tierna que Dios escogerá de la copa del alto cedro y que el mismo Señor plantará con su mano en la cumbre de un monte elevado, la restauración del Pueblo de Israel después de la destrucción de la Ciudad Santa y de su templo, y de la extinción de la línea dinástica. El Pueblo de Israel, Jerusalén y el templo del Señor fueron reconstruídos, aunque no así la línea monárquica de David, como el Señor habia prometido.

Porque todos tendremos que comparecer ante el tribunal de Cristo,

La segunda lectura deste domingo de la II Carta a los Corintios es una exhortación a la esperanza cristiana y a la confianza en Dios

Português domingo xi do tempo comum



EVANGELHO DE SÃO MARCOS 4, 26-34

Naquele tempo, disse Jesus à multidão. "O reino de Deus é como um homem que lançou a semente à terra. Dorme e levanta-se, noite e dia, enquanto a semente germina e cresce, sem ele saber como. A terra produz por si, primeiro a planta, depois a espiga, por fim o trigo maduro na espiga. E quando o trigo o permite, logo se mete a foice, porque já chegou o tempo da colheita". Jesus dizia ainda: "A que havemos de comparar o reino de Deus? Em que parábola o havemos de apresentar? É como o grão de mostarda, que, ao ser semeado na terra, é a menor de todas as sementes que há sobre a terra; mas, depois de semeado, começa a crescer e torna-se a maior de todas as plantas da horta, estendendo de tal forma os seus ramos que as aves do céu podem abrigar-se à sua sombra". Jesus pregava-lhes a palavra de Deus com muitas parábolas como estas, conforme eram capazes de entender. E não lhes falava senão em parábolas; mas, particular, tudo explicava aos seus discípulos.



O Evangelho de hoje está formado por duas parábolas muito breves: a da semente que germina sozinha, e a do grão de mostarda. Através destas

imagens tomadas do mundo rural, Jesus apresenta a eficácia da Palavra de Deus e as exigências do seu Reino, mostrando as razões da nossa esperança e do nosso compromisso na historia. Toda a atenção primeira parábola está centrada crescimento. O papel do homem é reduzido a lançar, a atirar a semente, isto é, a mensagem do Evangelho, para todo o lado. Porém o processo é lento e progressivo e não pode ser apressado. O Reino de Deus é uma iniciativa divina e, mesmo aceitando a colaboração humana, está sempre acima de qualquer tentativa humana de conduzir o curso da operação. O tempo da ceifa é uma referência ao juízo no fim de tudo.

A segunda parábola parte da constatação do tamanho minúsculo da semente da mostarda. Evidencia a capacidade de crescimento do Reino de Deus, apesar da humildade e simplicidade com que se apresenta. O seu início é modesto e quase imperceptível, mas a sua dinâmica interna, que depende de Deus, impele com grande força além do que poderiam fazer as lutas e tarefas humanas.



Na primeira leitura deste domingo, o profeta Ezequiel assegura ao Povo de Deus, exilado na Babilónia, que Deus não esqueceu a Aliança, nem as promessas que fez no passado. Apesar das crises que as voltas da história comportam, Israel deve continuar a confiar nesse Deus que é fiel e que não desistirá nunca de oferecer ao seu Povo um futuro de tranquilidade, de justiça e de paz sem fim.
