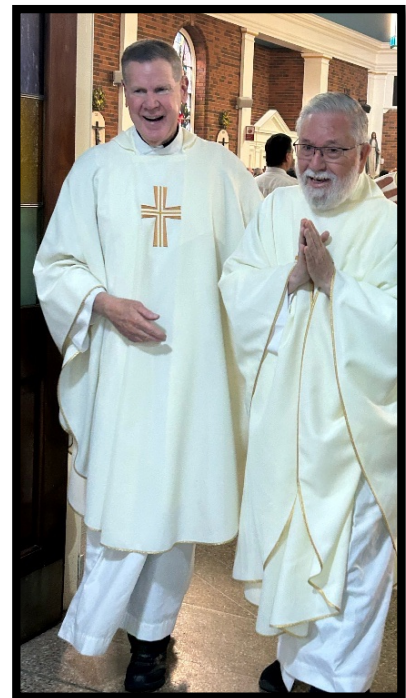

## Pastor's Notes

In honor of the 250<sup>th</sup> anniversary of our nation signing the Declaration of Independence on 4 July 1776, the Roman Catholic Bishops of the United States are consecrating our country under the entrustment of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus this month of June, and all year long. The very Heart of Christ Himself always leads us to truth, to freedom, to love!!!

Our parish is profoundly blessed to have a “mini-trinity” of images of the Sacred Heart. The white outdoor statue on the corner of Garfield and Willis exemplifies the “Inviting Jesus”; opening His arms and heart to all who pass by. The small statue in the lobby portrays the “Welcoming Jesus”; pointing to His heart with both hands. The original statue (over 100 years old) in the sanctuary (where the Tabernacle of the Blessed Sacrament was for nearly 50 years) manifests the “Enduring Jesus”; one hand stretching forth to draw our hearts into His. 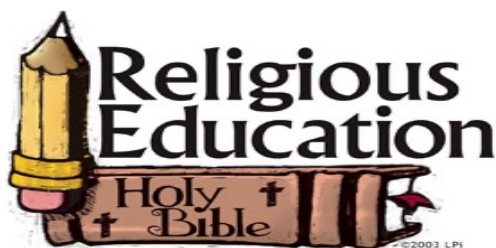

### ***“Continuing the Educational Mission” Scholarship Award***

We are pleased to announce the Corpus Christi ***“Continuing the Educational Mission”*** Scholarship award will be offered once again this year. Even though our beloved parish school has closed, the mission of educating the young people of our parish continues. It is in this spirit that the scholarship award was established.

Based upon the success from past years, we will continue to offer two scholarships this year:

- One for a student parishioner attending a Catholic High School
- One for a student parishioner attending, full time, a college or university carrying a minimum course load of 12 credits.

Now two young people from our parish will each be awarded a scholarship toward their education.

A scholarship award of \$5,000 will be awarded to one student who will be attending a local Catholic High School, starting September 2026, for the academic school year 2026/2027.

A scholarship award of \$7,000 will be awarded to one college student carrying a full-time course load of a minimum 12 credits/semester starting September 2026, attending a 2-4-year college or university for the academic school year 2026/2027.

The scholarship will be paid directly to the school, college or university in two equal payments, one half for the fall semester and the second half for the spring semester or if the academic year is divided into trimesters, half will be paid in the first trimester and the second half will be paid in the third trimester.

The funding for these scholarships will come directly from the investment income earned from the proceeds of the sale of the Searing Avenue properties and **not** from any weekly or special parish collections. The announcement of the scholarship recipients will be on or about August 2nd. The scholarship is for one year.

#### **Requirements:**

- Completion and submission of an application to the rectory by hand or mail by June 24, 2026
- Applicant’s family must be registered in our parish records for one year prior to submission of the application.
- Applicant for the High School and College scholarship award must have received all three of the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Holy Eucharist & Confirmation)
- Applicant must be involved in service to either our parish, community, or school. 50% of the service must be to our parish such as: Altar Serving, Junior Lectoring, assisting our Religious Education Center as either a Hall Monitor, Teacher’s Aide, Teacher or assisting with our Sunday 20 Minutes with the Director or assisting with CYO. The remaining 50% of service given to school, community, or civic/cultural groups.

- Applicant must obtain 3 letters of recommendation attesting to the applicant's character from either a teacher, administrator, coach, scout leader, civic leader, or leader of the group to which the applicant is giving service. Additionally, the author of the letter of recommendation will also need to complete a form evaluating the applicant's character.
- Applicant for the High School will need to write a brief essay of no less than 500 words responding to one of the following topics: ***“As a faithful member of Corpus Christi (The Body of Christ) Parish, what does the Eucharist mean to me and how does it allow me to grow in my faith and influence my life? OR “Forgiveness is such an important aspect in our Christian life. What does Forgiveness mean to me and how can I forgive those who may have hurt me deeply?”***
- The applicant for the college scholarship award must write an essay on one of the same topics of at least 750 words.  
**N.B. Essays must be original in their composition. Any essay found to be aided by AI (Artificial Intelligence) will automatically be rejected and the application process will not move forward in the review process.**

Based upon the review of the applications and evaluations by a team of grammar school, middle school, high school, and college educators, the top five applicants for each scholarship will be required to participate in an interview (in-person) by our team of educators. The interviews will be conducted at the rectory of Corpus Christi in mid-July, 2026.

- All Applicants may re-apply for the scholarship the following year/s; however, Applicants may only be awarded the scholarship once in the High School category and once in the College category.

**Timing/milestone dates:**

- All applications, letters of recommendations and evaluation forms must be submitted by hand or by mail to the rectory by June 24, 2026.
- All interviews of the top five candidates in each academic category will begin mid-July 2026.
- Announcement of the scholarship winners will be on or about August 2, 2026.

The decision of the Scholarship committee and our pastor, Fr. Malcolm Burns, will be final.

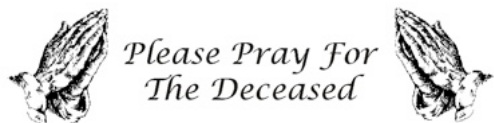

## XI DOMINGO DEL TIEMPO ORDINARIO

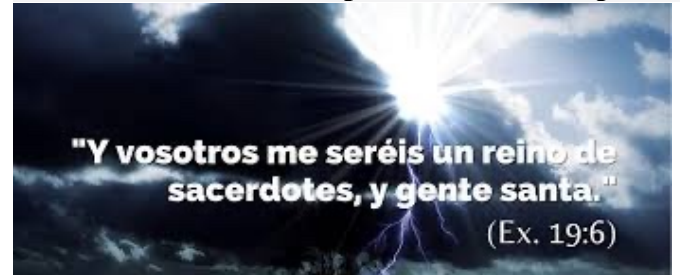


### EVANGELIO DE SAN MATEO 9, 36-10,8

En aquel tiempo, al ver Jesús a las gentes, se compadecía de ellas, porque estaban extenuadas y abandonadas, como ovejas que no tienen pastor. Entonces dijo a sus discípulos: «La mies es abundante, pero los trabajadores son pocos; rogad, pues, al Señor de la mies que mande trabajadores a su mies.» Y llamando a sus doce discípulos, les dio autoridad para expulsar espíritus inmundos y curar toda enfermedad y dolencia. Éstos son los nombres de los doce apóstoles: el primero, Simón, llamado Pedro, y su hermano Andrés; Santiago el Zebedeo, y su hermano Juan; Felipe y Bartolomé, Tomás y Mateo, el publicano; Santiago el Alfeo, y Tadeo; Simón el Celote, y Judás Iscariote, el que lo entregó. A estos doce los envió Jesús con estas instrucciones: «No vayáis a tierra de gentiles, ni entréis en las ciudades de Samaría, sino id a las ovejas descarriadas de Israel. Id y proclamad que el reino de los cielos está cerca. Curad enfermos, resucitad muertos, limpiad leprosos, echad demonios. Lo que habéis recibido gratis, dadlo gratis.»



El evangelio nos ofrece el testimonio de la elección de los Doce y su misión, en la perspectiva de un nuevo pueblo de la Alianza. Debemos notar una diferencia con la teología de la I<sup>a</sup> Lectura donde la fuerza de la Alianza se resolvía en la identidad de un pueblo de sacerdotes y apartado del mundo por la santidad. Jesús de Nazaret, el Hijo de Dios, ha venido a dar un nuevo rostro más humano a este pueblo. Ya no es la teología de lo sagrado lo que prevalece, sino la identidad de un pueblo sencillo, perdido, débil, sin pastores, sin santidad aparente. Para esto se instituye a los "Doce", cuya misión no será apartarlo de los demás pueblos, sino curar sus heridas, sus miserias y atender a sus necesidades. Y el verdadero modelo es el mismo Jesús que nos es presentado como el "pastor" que "se compadece" del pueblo. Los "Doce", que son el signo de un nuevo pueblo que Jesús ha querido congregar, deberán ser "pastores" que no hagan lo que los sacerdotes de la religión antigua hicieron: no se compadecieron del pueblo.



En la primera lectura de este domingo nos situamos en un momento decisivo, pues el pueblo había salido de la esclavitud, pero no sabe vivir como pueblo libre. Habían salido de Egipto pero Egipto todavía vivía dentro del corazón del pueblo. Y es ahí donde Dios irrumpe, no con imposiciones, sino con una declaración, semejante a las declaraciones de amor: «os he llevado sobre alas de águila y os he traído a mí».

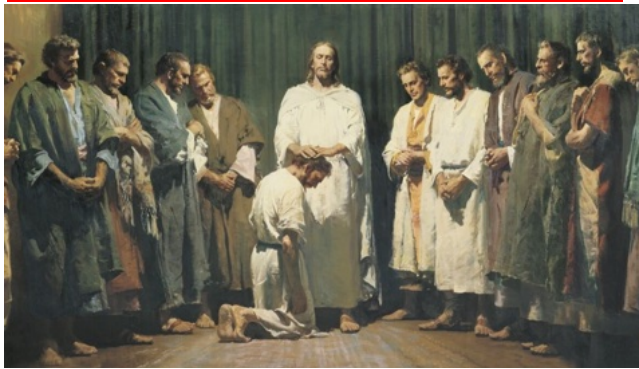

### DOMINGO XI DO TEMPO COMUM



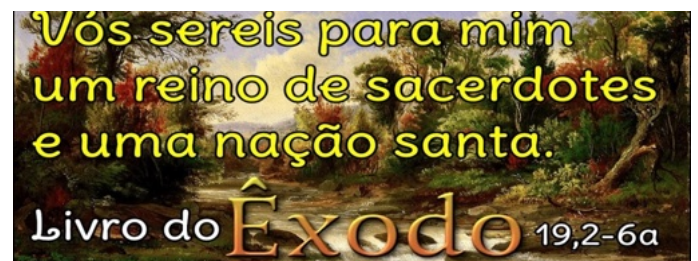
### EVANGELHO DE SÃO MATEUS 9, 36-10.8

Naquele tempo, Jesus, ao ver as multidões, encheu-se de compaixão, porque andavam fatigadas e abatidas, como ovelhas sem pastor. Jesus disse então aos seus discípulos: «A seara é grande, mas os trabalhadores são poucos. Pedi ao Senhor da seara que mande trabalhadores para a sua seara». Depois chamou a si os seus doze discípulos e deu-lhes poder de expulsar os espíritos impuros e de curar todas as doenças e enfermidades. São estes os nomes dos doze apóstolos: primeiro, Simão, chamado Pedro, e André, seu irmão; Tiago, filho de Zebedeu, e João, seu irmão; Filipe e Bartolomeu; Tomé e Mateus, o publicano; Tiago, filho de Alfeu, e Tadeu; Simão, o Cananeu, e Judas Iscariotes, que foi quem O entregou. Jesus enviou estes Doze, dando-lhes as seguintes instruções: «Não sigais o caminho dos gentios, nem entreis em cidade de samaritanos. Ide primeiramente às ovelhas perdidas da casa de Israel. Pelo caminho, proclamai que está perto o reino dos Céus. Curai os enfermos, ressuscitai os mortos, sarai os leprosos, expulsai os demónios. Recebestes de graça, dai de graça».



O Evangelho desta semana narra a primeira parte das instruções de Jesus aos seus seguidores ao

iniciarem sua missão. No início da leitura, ouvimos que Jesus simpatiza com as multidões. Ele os ama, se solidariza com eles e responde às suas necessidades, ‘porque estavam exaustos e abandonados, como ovelhas que não têm pastor’. A compaixão de Jesus pelas pessoas é o que o leva a agir. Jesus exorta todo o grupo de discípulos a orar ao Senhor da messe’ por mais trabalhadores. Em seguida, do grupo de seguidores, Jesus escolhe doze a quem Mateus chama de ‘apóstolos’ ou missionários. A estes doze, Jesus confia a missão de proclamar que o Reino de Deus está próximo. Para um povo que tinha sido constantemente dito que Deus os desprezava, que eles eram pecadores e que estavam longe do reino de Deus, isso era uma boa notícia. Jesus ordena aos discípulos que acompanhem o anúncio da Boa Nova com a cura de todas as doenças e enfermidades para romper com a ideia de que a doença (em qualquer de suas formas) era uma maldição enviada por Deus ou um castigo pelo pecado. Pelo contrário, os discípulos devem ser um sinal da bondade de Deus, que traz saúde e realização. O anúncio da Boa Nova deve ser feito sempre com generosidade e sem levar em conta as despesas. Através destas palavras do Evangelho, possamos ouvir de novo o nosso próprio chamado a sermos missionários do amor de Deus e portadores da Boa Nova.



A primeira leitura narra a chegada dos israelitas ao deserto do Sinai. Deus instrui Moisés a lembrar o povo de como os libertou do Egito e oferece uma aliança: se guardarem os mandamentos, Israel será a Sua propriedade particular, um reino de sacerdotes e uma nação santa.
