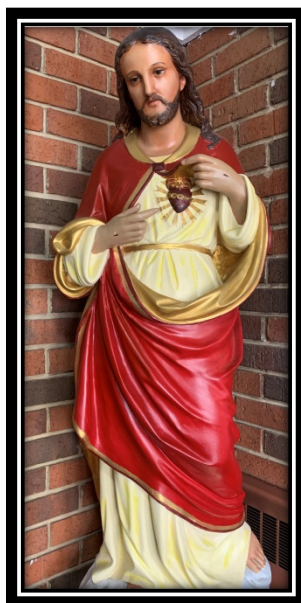

Pastor's Notes

Our own Bishop John Barres has declared that the month of June be dedicated to the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus in our Diocese. The primary feast day is Friday 16 June (followed by the Immaculate Heart of Mary on Saturday 17 June). But the whole month is a time to center our lives on the truth that “God is Love”; especially flowing from the heart of Christ.

Our parish is profoundly blessed to have a “mini-trinity” of images of the Sacred Heart. The white outdoor statue on the corner of Garfield and Willis exemplifies the “Inviting Jesus”; opening His arms and heart to all who pass by. The small statue in the lobby portrays the “Welcoming Jesus”; pointing to His heart with both hands. The original statue (over 100 years old) in the side sanctuary (where the Tabernacle of the Blessed Sacrament was for nearly 50 years) manifests the “Enduring Jesus”; one hand stretching forth to draw our hearts into His.

Please offer this “Prayer to the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus” during this summer season for our parish family of Corpus Christi. And feel free to take home one or two of the Sacred Heart Holy Cards located by the doors of the church.

PRAYER TO THE MOST SACRED HEART OF JESUS

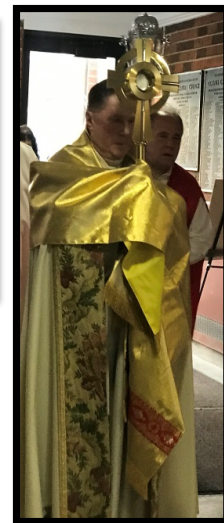

Feast of Corpus Christi

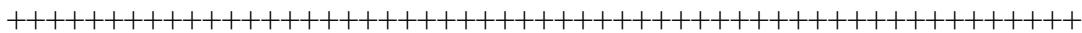

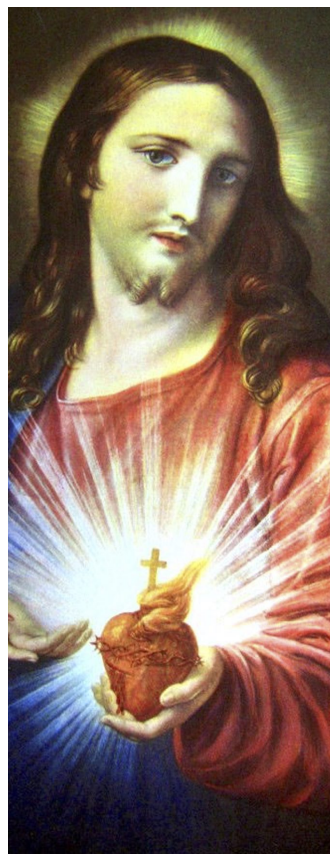

Corpus Christi's 2023 "Continuing the Educational Mission" Scholarship Award

We are pleased to announce again this year the Corpus Christi "***Continuing the Educational Mission***" **Scholarship** award. Even though our beloved parish school has closed, the mission of educating the young people of our parish continues. It is in this spirit that the scholarship award has been established.

A committee of educators from grammar school, middle school, high school and college as well as members from the financial community was formed and worked on this program for several months and developed this scholarship.

Based upon the success from past years, we will continue to offer three scholarships this year:

- One for 2 student parishioners attending a Catholic High School
- One for a student parishioner attending, full time, a college or university.

Now three young people from our parish will each be awarded a scholarship toward their education. A scholarship award of \$5,000 will be given to two students who will be attending a local Catholic High School starting September 2023 for the academic school year 2023/2024.

A scholarship award of \$7,000 will be given to a matriculated college student carrying a full-time course load of a minimum 12 credits/semester who will be attending starting September 2023, a 2-4-year college or university for the academic school year 2023/2024.

The scholarship will be paid directly to the school, college or university in two equal payments, one half for the fall semester and the second half for the spring semester or if the academic year is divided into trimesters, half will be paid in the first trimester and the second half paid in the third trimester.

The funding for these scholarships will come directly from the investment income earned from the proceeds of the sale of the Searing Avenue properties and **not** from any weekly or special parish collections. The announcement of the scholarship recipients will be made later this summer on or around July 31. The scholarship is for one year. Applications must be submitted to the rectory by July 1, 2023.

“There but for the grace of God go I.” This idiom captures both the empathy that is expected of Vincentian home visitors, and the unmerited nature of God’s grace.

We try to refrain from judging the neighbor. That isn’t always easy when the neighbor comes from a very different background. Sometimes we feel as if we know better because we haven’t allowed ourselves to get into the circumstance of the neighbors’. The calls neighbors make, are calls of desperation. Have they made unforced choices that led them to this? Oftentimes, yes. But just as paramedics don’t pause to figure out who caused the accident before working to treat the wounds, Vincentians don’t either, we say, “There but for the grace of God go I.”

Grace is “the free and undeserved help from God.” Yet, it is also we who are called to be God’s hands. We go to the needy not to judge them but to serve them as the embodiment of Christ. We go in simplicity, humility and gentleness in witness to our Vincentian charism. A charism is a very special grace from God. So, while it may be the grace of God that saved us from the neighbors’ circumstances, it is at least equally the grace of God that sends us to sit, listen, pray, and love them – unconditionally.

We are receiving many requests for assistance. Our funds are depleting quickly. We help with rent sometimes (\$2000-\$2500). We supply furniture from the store and we pay for that also. Please think about donating to SVDP, you can drop it into the collection basket or mail it to the Rectory. All the donations go to helping neighbors in our parish. Donations can be deductible on your taxes.

XI DOMINGO DEL TIEMPO ORDINARIO



EVANGELIO DE SAN MATEO 9, 36-10.8

En aquel tiempo, al ver Jesús a las multitud, el se compadecía de ellas, porque estaban extenuadas y desamparadas, como oveja sin pastor. Entonces dijo a sus discípulos: *“La cosecha es mucha y los trabajadores, pocos. Rueguen por tato, al dueño de la mies que envíe trabajadores a sus campos”*. Después, llamando a sus doce discípulos, les dio poder para expulsar a los espíritus impuros y curar toda clase de enfermedades y dolencias. Estos son los nombres de los doce apóstoles: el primero de todos, Simón, llamado Pedro y su hermano Andrés; Santiago y su hermano Juan, hijos de Zebedeo; Felipe y Bartolomé; Tomás y Mateo, el publicano; Santiago, hijo de Alfeo, y Tadeo; Simón, el cananeo y Judas Iscariotes, que fue el traidor. A estos doce los envió Jesús con estas instrucciones: *“No vayan a tierra de paganos ni entren en ciudades de samaritanos. Vayan más bien en busca de las ovejas perdidas de la casa de Israel. Vaya y proclamen por el camino que ya se acerca el Reino de los cielos. Cure a los leprosos y demás enfermos; resuciten a los muertos y echen fuera a los demonios. Gratuitamente han recibido este poder; ejérzanlo, pues, gratuitamente”*.



Con el pasaje evangélico que acabamos de leer se inicia el discurso apostólico de Jesús, según el evangelista, San Mateo, que continuaremos leyendo los dos próximos domingos. A los doce Apóstoles les

encarga algo muy comprometedor: deberán anunciar que el Reino de los cielos ha llegado ya y, al mismo tiempo, deben curar a los enfermos, liberar a los poseídos por el demonio y hasta resucitar a los muertos y todo ello desinteresadamente, puesto que, si esos poderes los han recibido gratis, ellos también deberán hacerlo gratis. Los Doce, que son el signo de un nuevo pueblo que Jesús ha querido congregar, deberán ser pastores que no hagan lo que los sacerdotes de la religión antigua hicieron. Ahora Cristo Jesús no va por nuestras calles predicando el Reino: pero vamos nosotros, miembros de la Iglesia.



En la primera lectura de hoy, del libro de Éxodo, tenemos una introducción al famoso código de la Alianza. Dios ha escogido a Israel y ha hecho Alianza con él, como hacían en la antigüedad los reyes y emperadores. El concepto ALIANZA es el hilo dorado del Antiguo Testamento y la clave de la teología y espiritualidad de la religión de Israel. Esto no lo entendió siempre así Israel, pero se vieron obligados los profetas a recordárselo para exigir muchas cosas a este pueblo y a esa religión. La lectura nos presenta una manifestación de Dios a Moisés que le va a comunicar sus decisiones más importantes y culturales sobre el pueblo.



La Carta a los Romanos, la segunda lectura de hoy, es un texto sereno y maduro, escrito por Pablo entre los años de 57/58 y en el cual el apóstol presenta una síntesis de su mensaje y de su predicación. El pretexto para la carta es un proyecto de ir a Roma. Pablo siente que ha terminado su misión en oriente y quiere anunciar el Evangelio de Jesús en occidente.

DOMINGO XI DO TEMPO COMUM



EVANGELHO DE SÃO MATEUS 9, 36-10,8

Naquele tempo Jesus, ao ver as multidões, encheu-se de compaixão, porque andavam fatigadas e abatidas, como ovelhas sem pastor. Jesus disse então aos seus discípulos: *“A seara é grande, mas os trabalhadores são poucos. Pedi ao Senhor da seara que mande trabalhadores para a sua seara”*. Depois, chamando a si os seus Doze discípulos e deu-lhes poder de expulsar os espíritos impuros e de curar todas as doenças e enfermidades. São estes os nomes dos doze apóstolos: primeiro, Simão, chamado Pedro, e André, seu irmão; Tiago, filho de Zebedeu, e João, seu irmão; Filipe e Bartolomeu; Tomé, e Mateus, o publicano; Tiago, filho de Alfeu e Tadeu; Simão, o Cananeu e Judas Iscariotes, que foi quem o entregou. Jesus enviou estes Doze dando-lhes as seguintes instruções: *“Não sigais o caminho dos gentios, nem entreis em cidade de samaritanos. Ide primeiramente às ovelhas perdidas da casa de Israel. Pelo caminho proclamai que está perto o reino dos Céus. Curai os enfermos, ressuscitai os mortos, sarai os leprosos, expulsai os demónios. Recebestes de graça, dai de graça”*.



Os estudiosos do Evangelho segundo Mateus costumam chamar ao texto do evangelho o *“discurso da missão”*: nele, Jesus envia os discípulos e define a missão desses discípulos – anunciar a chegada do Reino. Mateus escreve o seu Evangelho durante a década de 80. Dirige-se a uma comunidade viva e entusiasta, profundamente empenhada na actividade

missionária. No entanto, as dificuldades encontradas no anúncio do Evangelho e a perseguição traziam essa comunidade algo desorientada e perturbada. Mateus compôs uma espécie de manual do missionário cristão, que enraíza a missão em Jesus Cristo, apresenta os conteúdos do anúncio que os discípulos são chamados a proclamar e define as atitudes fundamentais que os missionários devem assumir.



A primeira leitura do livro do Êxodo apresenta-nos o Deus da aliança, que elege um Povo para com ele estabelecer laços de comunhão e de familiaridade; a esse Povo, Jahwéh confia uma missão sacerdotal: Israel deve ser o Povo reservado para o serviço de Jahwéh, isto é, para ser um sinal de Deus no meio das outras nações.



A segunda leitura sugere que a comunidade dos discípulos é fundamentalmente uma comunidade de pessoas a quem Deus ama. A sua missão no mundo é dar testemunho do amor de Deus pelos homens – um amor eterno, inquebrantável, gratuito e absolutamente único.
