Church Parking

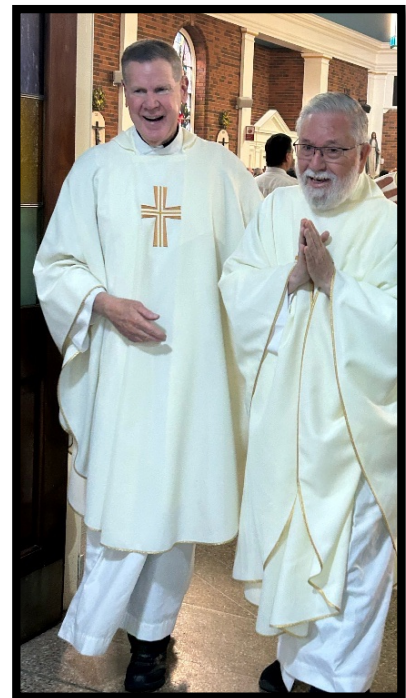

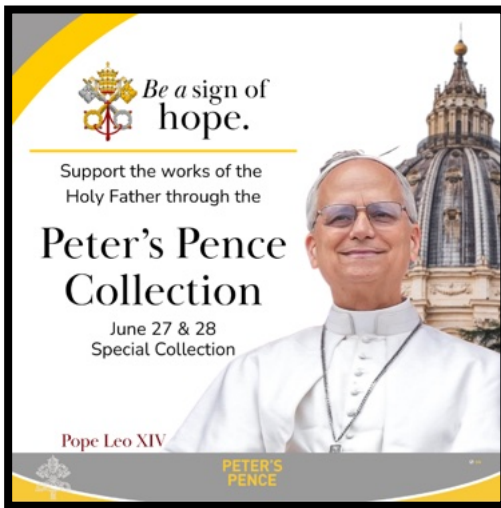

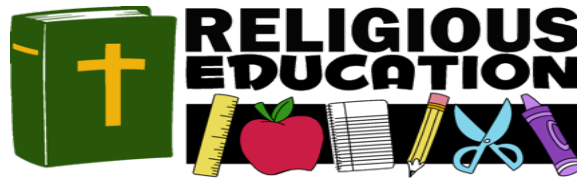

Evangelio según San Mateo 10, 26-33



EVANGELIO DE SAN MATEO 10, 26-33

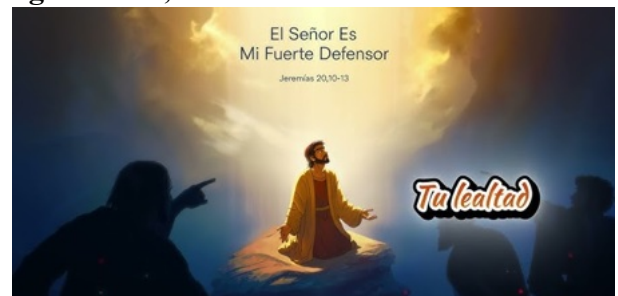
Jesús dijo a sus apóstoles: No teman a los hombres. No hay nada oculto que no deba ser revelado, y nada secreto que no deba ser conocido. Lo que yo les digo en la oscuridad, repítanlo en pleno día; y lo que escuchen al oído, proclámenlo desde lo alto de las casas. No teman a los que matan el cuerpo, pero no pueden matar el alma. Teman más bien a aquel que puede arrojar el alma y el cuerpo al infierno.

¿Acaso no se vende un par de pájaros por unas monedas? Sin embargo, ni uno solo de ellos cae en tierra, sin el consentimiento del Padre que está en el cielo. Ustedes tienen contados todos sus cabellos. No teman entonces, porque valen más que muchos pájaros. Al que me reconozca abiertamente ante los hombres, yo los reconoceré ante mi Padre que está en el cielo. Pero yo renegaré ante mi Padre que está en el cielo de aquel que reniegue de mí ante los hombres.



El evangelio de Mateo viene a ser como una respuesta al texto que se lee en la I^a Lectura sobre las confesiones de Jeremías. Allí podíamos sacar en consecuencia que, ante este tipo de experiencias proféticas, el silencio de Dios puede llevar a un callejón sin salida. Ahora, la palabra de Jesús es radical: no temáis a los hombres que lo único que

pueden hacer es quitar la voz; pero incluso en el silencio de la muerte, la verdad no quedará oscurecida. Esta es una sección que forma parte del discurso de misión de Jesús a sus discípulos según lo entiende Mateo. No es un texto cómodo, justamente porque la misión del evangelio debe enfrentarnos con los que quieren callar la verdad, y es que la proclamación profética y con coraje del evangelio, da la medida de la libertad y de la confianza en Dios. San Mateo 10, 26-33 es un llamado radical de Jesús a vencer el temor a través de la confianza absoluta en Dios. Jesús asegura a sus discípulos que la verdad saldrá a la luz, les recuerda el valor supremo del alma y promete la protección providencial del Padre. Usando la imagen de los pajarillos y los cabellos contados, Jesús nos enseña que nada escapa al cuidado amoroso de Dios. Si Él cuida de lo más insignificante, mucho más cuidará de nosotros.



Jeremías 20:10-13 narra el dolor de un profeta traicionado por sus amigos, pero transformado por la certeza de que Dios es su "poderoso gigante". Esta porción nos enseña que, incluso frente a la calumnia y el aislamiento, la vulnerabilidad humana encuentra refugio y victoria en la protección divina. El profeta experimenta el rechazo extremo. Sus propios conocidos buscan su caída con murmullos y difamaciones, esperando que tropiece. A pesar de la conspiración que lo rodea, Jeremías cambia su enfoque radicalmente. Pasa de las lágrimas y la frustración a una declaración inquebrantable de fe: "Mas Jehová está conmigo como poderoso gigante". Reconoce que, aunque los hombres pueden conspirar, no prevalecerán porque su verdadera defensa y respaldo provienen del Creador.

DOMINGO XII DO TEMPO COMUM

Se Deus cuida até das aves do céus, quanto mais de você!



EVANGELHO DE SÃO MATEUS 10, 26-33

Naquele tempo, disse Jesus aos seus apóstolos: “Não tenhais medo dos homens, pois nada há encoberto que não venha a descobrir-se, nada há oculto que não venha a conhecer-se. O que vos digo às escuras, dizei-o à luz do dia; e o que escutais ao ouvido proclamai-o sobre os telhados. Não temais os que matam o corpo, mas não podem matar a alma. Temei antes Aquele que pode lançar na geena a alma e o corpo. Não se vendem dois passarinhos por uma moeda? E nem um deles cairá por terra sem consentimento do vosso Pai. Até os cabelos da vossa cabeça estão todos contados. Portanto, não temais: valeis muito mais do que os passarinhos. A todo aquele que se tiver declarado por Mim diante dos homens também Eu Me declararei por ele diante do meu Pai que está nos Céus. Mas àquele que me negar diante dos homens, também Eu o negarei diante do meu Pai que está nos Céus”.

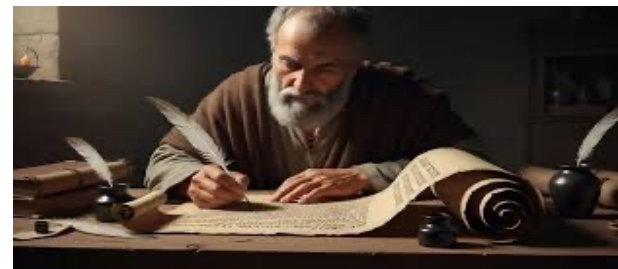


No Evangelho, é o próprio Jesus que, ao enviar os discípulos, os avisa para a inevitabilidade das perseguições e das incompreensões; mas acrescenta: “não temais”. Jesus garante aos seus a

presença contínua, a solicitude e o amor de Deus, ao longo de toda a sua caminhada pelo mundo. O tema central da nossa leitura é sugerido pela expressão “não temais”, que se repete por três vezes ao longo do texto. Ao enviar os discípulos que elegeu, Jesus assegura-lhes a sua presença, a sua ajuda, a sua proteção, a fim de que os discípulos superem o medo e a angústia que resultam da perseguição.. Jesus pede aos discípulos que não deixem o medo impedir a proclamação aberta da Boa Nova.



A primeira leitura apresenta-nos o exemplo de um profeta do Antigo Testamento – Jeremias. É uma passagem de profundo desabafo e confiança. O profeta expressa a angústia de ser perseguido e traído por amigos próximos, mas supera o medo proclamando sua fé absoluta na proteção do Senhor, que age como um guerreiro valente ao seu lado.



Em Romanos 5:12-15, o apóstolo Paulo estabelece um paralelo fundamental entre a origem do pecado através de Adão e a salvação através de Jesus Cristo. A desobediência de um único homem trouxe a morte e o pecado a toda a humanidade, mas a graça e o dom gratuito de Deus por meio de Jesus superabundaram para todos. **INTENÇÕES PARA O DIA 28 DE JUNHO**
