

Our food pantry supplies are running low.





We are in need of the following items:

“Continuing the Educational Mission” Scholarship Award

We are pleased to announce again this year the Corpus Christi **“Continuing the Educational Mission” Scholarship** award. Even though our beloved parish school has closed, the mission of educating the young people of our parish continues. It is in this spirit that the scholarship award has been established.

A committee of educators from grammar school, middle school, high school and college as well as members from the financial community was formed and worked on this program for several months and developed this scholarship.

Based upon the successes from past years, we will continue to offer two scholarships this year:

- One for a student parishioner attending a Catholic High School
- One for a student parishioner attending, full time, a college or university.

Now two young people from our parish will each be awarded a scholarship toward their education.

A scholarship award of \$5,000 will be given to a student who will be attending a local Catholic High School starting September 2025 for the academic school year 2025/2026.

A scholarship award of \$7,000 will be given to a matriculated college student carrying a full-time course load of a minimum 12 credits/semester who will be attending starting September 2025, a 2-4-year college or university for the academic school year 2025/2025.

The scholarship will be paid directly to the school, college or university in two equal payments, one half for the fall semester and the second half for the spring semester or if the academic year is divided into trimesters, half will be paid in the first trimester and the second half paid in the third trimester.

The funding for these scholarships will come directly from the investment income earned from the proceeds of the sale of the Searing Avenue properties and **not** from any weekly or special parish collections. The announcement of the scholarship recipients will be made later this summer on or around August 9th. The scholarship is for one year. Applications must be submitted to the rectory by July 9, 2025.

SANTÍSIMO CUERPO Y SANGRE DE CRISTO



EVANGELIO DE SAN LUCAS 9, 11-17

En aquel tiempo, Jesús habló del Reino de Dios a la multitud y curó a los enfermos. Cuando caía la tarde, los doce apóstoles se acercaron a decirle: *“Despide a la gente para que vayan a los pueblos y caseríos a buscar alojamiento y comida, porque aquí estamos en un lugar solitario”*. Él les contestó: *“Denles ustedes de comer”*. Pero ellos le replicaron: *“No tenemos más que cinco panes y dos pescados; a no ser que vayamos nosotros mismos a comprar víveres para toda esa gente”*. Eran como cinco mil varones. Entonces Jesús dijo a sus discípulos: *“Hagan que se sienten en grupos como de cincuenta”*. Así lo hicieron, y todos se sentaron. Después Jesús tomó en sus manos los cinco panes y los dos pescados, y levantando su mirada al cielo, pronunció sobre ellos una oración de acción de gracias, los partió y los fue dando a los discípulos, para que ellos los distribuyeran entre la gente. Comieron todos y se saciaron, y de lo que sobró se llenaron doce canastos.



San Lucas ha presentado la multiplicación de los panes como una Eucaristía. Se ha escogido, sin duda, para la fiesta del Corpus Christi en este ciclo por ese carácter eucarístico que Lucas nos ofrece. Todo ocurre cuando el día declinaba, como en el caso de los discípulos de Emaús que terminó con aquella cena prodigiosa en la que Jesús resucitado realiza los gestos de la última Cena y desaparece. Pero apuntemos otras cosas. Jesús exige a todos los

discípulos que ellos les den de comer; son palabras para provocar, sin duda, y para enseñar también. Los cinco verbos del versículo 16: tomar, alzar los ojos, bendecir, partir y dar, denotan el tipo de lectura que ha ofrecido a su comunidad el redactor del evangelio de Lucas. Es muy elocuente cómo se introduce nuestro relato: Jesús los acogía, les hablaba del Reino de Dios y los curaba de sus males. La Eucaristía debe tener esta dimensión: acogida, experiencia del Reino de Dios y curación de nuestra vida.




La primera lectura, del libro del Génesis, habla del encuentro de Melquisedec, rey de Salem, y Abram. Con los gestos del pan y el vino que se ofrecen, las cosas más naturales de la tierra, Melquisedec, ese rey misterioso, le otorga a Abrahán un rango sagrado, casi de rey-sacerdote. El valor de nuestro texto es que sirve como plataforma teológica para un sentido nuevo y una actualización de la religión inaugurada por la vida de Cristo. En esa ofrenda de Melquisedec no se usan animales, sino las cosas sencillas de la tierra. Jesús, antes de morir, ofrecerá su vida en un poco de pan y en un poco de vino. El gesto de Melquisedec es como un signo anticipado de los gestos de Jesús en la última cena con sus discípulos.



El cristianismo primitivo tuvo que hacerse recibiendo tradiciones del Señor. Pablo, que no lo conoció personalmente, le da mucha importancia a unas pocas que ha recibido. Y una de esas tradiciones son las palabras y los gestos de la última cena.



SANTÍSSIMO CORPO E SANGUE DE CRISTO



EVANGELHO DE SÃO LUCAS 9, 11-17

Naquele tempo, estava Jesus a falar à multidão sobre o reino de Deus e a curar aqueles que necessitavam. O dia começava a declinar. Então os Doze aproximaram-se e disseram-lhe: *“Manda embora a multidão para ir procurar pousada e alimento às aldeias e casais mais próximos, pois aqui estamos num local deserto”*. Disse-lhes Jesus: *“Dai-lhes vós de comer”*. Mas eles responderam: *“Não temos senão cinco pães e dois peixes. Só se formos nós mesmos comprar comida para todo este povo”*. Eram de facto uns cinco mil homens. Disse Jesus aos discípulos: *“Mandai-os sentar por grupos de cinquenta”*. Assim fizeram e todos se sentaram. Então Jesus tomou os cinco pães e os dois peixes, ergueu os olhos ao céu e pronunciou sobre eles a bênção. Depois partiu-os e deu-os aos discípulos, para eles os distribuírem pela multidão. Todos comeram e ficaram saciados, e ainda recolheram doze cestos dos pedaços que sobraram.



No Evangelho Jesus divide cinco pães e dois peixes com uma multidão esfomeada. Os gestos feitos por Jesus nesse dia num local deserto, antecipam os gestos que ele irá fazer na última ceia, na véspera da

sua morte, ao partir e partilhar o pão e vinho com os discípulos. Partir, partilhar, dar é uma bela forma de resumir toda a vida de Jesus. Assim vivem os que estão com ele e se alimentam d’ele. As três leituras de hoje nos conduzem a refletir sobre o significado da Eucaristia e nos ensinam que ela é um alimento. Não é um remédio que produz resultados automaticamente. É preciso tomá-lo com fé, isto é, assumindo o compromisso que o gesto de comer o corpo e beber o sangue de Cristo envolve. As três leituras insistem na estreita ligação que existe entre a Eucaristia e a vida, entre o Pão que é Cristo e o pão que alimentou o corpo. Não é possível entrar em comunhão com o corpo do Senhor sem partilhar com os irmãos o pão material. É perigoso dissociar a Eucaristia da vida concreta dos homens e elevá-la às nuvens. São uma farsa as celebrações eucarísticas que não envolvam também o compromisso de toda a comunidade para que o pão material se multiplique, para que haja para todos e até haja de sobra.



A Segunda leitura da primeira carta de São Paulo aos Coríntios, oferece-nos o mais antigo relato dos gestos que Jesus fez na última ceia sobre o pão e sobre o vinho. Paulo avisa-nos que comer o pão e beber o vinho de Jesus significa compromisso com Jesus e com a sua maneira de viver e de amar. Comungar o corpo e o sangue de Jesus é, por isso, incompatível com tudo o que signifique divisão, conflito, discórdia, desprezo pelos irmãos mais pobres e mais pequenos.
