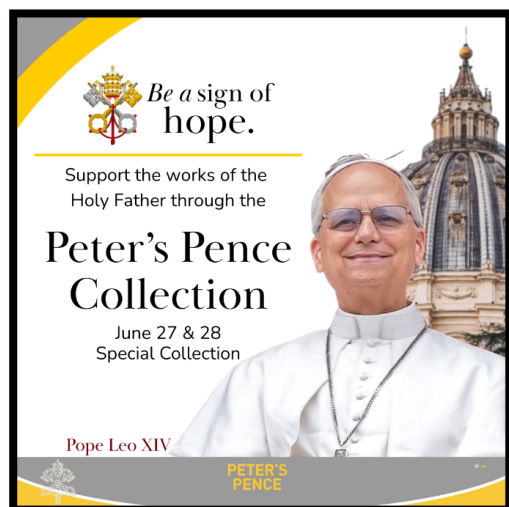

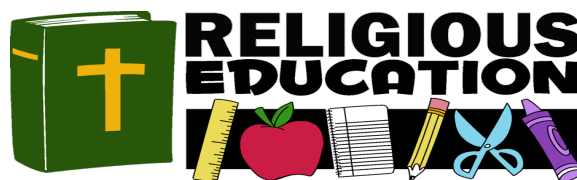




## **Peter's Pence Collection** **June 27<sup>th</sup> & 28<sup>th</sup>**

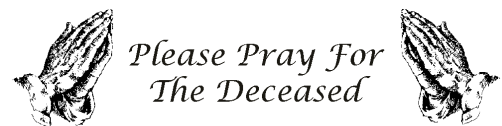

*Español***XIII DOMINGO DEL TIEMPO  
ORDINARIO****EVANGELIO DE SAN MATEO 10, 37-42**

En aquel tiempo, dijo Jesús a sus apóstoles: «El que quiere a su padre o a su madre más que a mí no es digno de mí; y el que quiere a su hijo o a su hija más que a mí no es digno de mí; y el que no toma su cruz y me sigue no es digno de mí. El que salve su vida, la perderá, y el que pierda su vida por mí la encontrará. El que los recibe a ustedes me recibe a mí, y el que me recibe, recibe al que me ha enviado. El que recibe a un profeta porque es profeta tendrá paga de profeta; y el que recibe a un justo porque es justo tendrá paga de justo. El que dé a beber, aunque no sea más que un vaso de agua fresca, a uno de estos pequeños, por ser mi discípulo, yo les aseguro que no perderá su recompensa.



El evangelio de este domingo vuelve sobre el "discurso de misión". Mateo señala para su comunidad que ser discípulo y seguidor de Jesús lleva consigo el vivir en conflicto. Perseverar en el discipulado supone romper ciertas tradiciones que nos atan, hasta las más familiares. No se trata de romper afectos familiares, sino lazos que no nos dejan libres. Las palabras que leemos en el evangelio de este día parecen duras y exigentes. ¿Será que Jesús nos está invitando a no amar a nuestros padres, a no amar a nuestros hijos? Eso estaría en contradicción con el 4º mandamiento de honrar a padre y madre, y no puede ser posible que haya contradicción en los mismos mandamientos. No se

trata de no amar a nuestros padres o de no amar a nuestros hijos, sino más bien de que ese amor no nos aleje del amor de Dios, por eso dice: "el que ame a su padre o a su madre más que a mí, no es digno de mí" (Mt 10, 37). La invitación no es a no amar sino más bien, a tener clara nuestras prioridades, como dice el primer mandamiento de la Ley de Dios. "amar a Dios sobre todas las cosas y al prójimo como a ti mismo". Por eso, no se trata de no amar a nuestra familia, a nuestros padres, a nuestros hijos, sino de que eso no nos aleje del amor de Dios.



La historia de Eliseo y la mujer sunamita (narrada en la primera lectura (2 Reyes 4) es un relato bíblico de hospitalidad, fe y milagros. Destaca cómo la generosidad de una mujer hacia el profeta fue recompensada con el nacimiento de un hijo y, posteriormente, con la resurrección de este tras una tragedia. La mujer sunamita (una mujer noble y adinerada de Sunem) acostumbraba hospedar al profeta Eliseo cada vez que pasaba por su ciudad. Incluso le construyó un cuarto privado en la azotea. En agradecimiento, Eliseo le preguntó qué podía hacer por ella. Al enterarse de que no tenía hijos y su esposo era mayor, Eliseo le profetizó que al año siguiente tendría un hijo, lo cual se cumplió. Años después, el niño sufrió un dolor de cabeza repentino y murió. Desesperada, la sunamita viajó al monte Carmelo para buscar a Eliseo. El profeta fue a su casa, oró y el niño resucitó.

# Português

## DOMINGO XIII DO TEMPO COMUM



### EVANGELHO DE SÃO MATEUS 10. 37-42

Naquele tempo, disse Jesus aos seus apóstolos: “Quem ama o pai ou a mãe mais do que a Mim, não é digno de Mim; e quem ama o filho ou a filha mais do que a Mim, não é digno de Mim. Quem não toma a sua cruz para Me seguir, não é digno de Mim. Quem encontrar a sua vida há-de perdê-la; e quem perder a sua vida por minha causa, há-de encontrá-la. Quem vos recebe, a Mim recebe; e quem Me recebe, recebe Aquele que Me enviou. Quem recebe um profeta por ele ser profeta, receberá a recompensa de profeta; e quem recebe um justo por ele ser justo, receberá a recompensa de justo. E se alguém der de beber, nem que seja um copo de água fresca, a um destes pequeninos, por ele ser meu discípulo, em verdade vos digo: não perderá a sua recompensa”.



O Evangelho é uma catequese sobre o discipulado, com vários passos. Num primeiro passo, define o caminho do discípulo: o discípulo tem de ser capaz de fazer de Jesus a sua opção fundamental e seguir o seu mestre no caminho do amor e da entrega da

vida. Num segundo passo, sugere que toda a comunidade é chamada a dar testemunho da Boa Nova de Jesus. No terceiro passo, promete uma recompensa àqueles que acolherem, com generosidade e amor, os missionários do “Reino”. Dentro do quadro de exigências que Jesus apresenta aos discípulos, sobressai a exigência de preferir Jesus à própria família. Isso não significa, evidentemente, que devemos rejeitar os laços que nos unem àqueles que amamos... No entanto, significa que os laços afectivos, por mais sagrados que sejam, não devem afastar-nos dos valores do “Reino”? As pessoas têm mais importância, para mim, do que o “Reino”? Já me aconteceu renunciar aos valores de Jesus por causa de alguém? Outra exigência que Jesus faz aos discípulos é a renúncia à própria vida e o tomar a cruz do amor, do serviço, do dom da vida. O que é mais importante para mim: os meus interesses, os meus valores egoístas, ou o serviço dos irmãos e o dom da vida?



O episódio da primeira leitura do Livro dos Reis descreve a generosa hospitalidade que Eliseu encontra em casa de uma mulher sunamita. A mulher sunamita e seu marido costumavam hospedar Eliseu sempre que ele passava pela cidade. Para acomodá-lo melhor, ela construiu um quarto exclusivo para o profeta. Como forma de agradecimento, Eliseu profetizou que, mesmo sendo o casal de idade avançada, eles teriam um filho. A história procura ensinar que colaborar com Deus na realização do plano de salvação/libertação que ele tem para os homens é uma fonte de vida e de bênção. Deus não deixa de recompensar todos aqueles que com ele colaboram.
