Sometimes we have it in mind to do something. Suddenly we are interrupted; someone comes along and holds us up and we don't get to do what we set out to do. If you are a certain type of person, you can get very annoyed by this. You can be there waiting for the person to move on so that you can get back to doing what you are supposed to be doing.

The gospel encourages us to pay attention to the interruptions in life. What can seem like distractions can be where the Lord is calling us to be. When our plans do not work out as we wanted because of some unexpected turn of events, it may not be the disaster that we think it is at the time. Sometimes when our plans do not work out, it can create the space for something else to happen that we did not plan but which, in itself, can have great value for ourselves and for others. Jesus gave himself fully to the interruption. He could have kept walking when the woman touched His clothing, but He paid attention to her. That was the call of the present moment for Jesus. In answering that call, he was doing God's work, and the task he initially set out to accomplish did not suffer. Jairus had his daughter restored to him. There are times in life when we need to embrace the interruptions, rather than just driving on with our head down towards the goal we have set for ourselves. We can misjudge where the real work lies. We often need to come to a deeper appreciation that the interruptions are our work, especially when they involve responding with compassion to the needs of others. When we set out on a journey, what happens on the way can be more important than arriving at our destination.

XIII DOMINGO DEL TIEMPO ORDINARIO



EVANGELIO: SAN MARCOS 5, 21-34. 35-43

En aquel tiempo, cuando Jesús regresó en la barca al otro lado del lago, se quedó en la orilla y ahí se le reunió mucha gente. Entonces se acercó uno de los jefes de la sinagoga, llamado Jairo. Al ver a Jesús, se echó a sus pies y le suplicaba con insistencia: *“Mi hija está agonizando. Ven a imponerle las manos para que se cure y viva”*. Jesús se fue con él y mucha gente lo seguía. Unos criados llegaron de casa del jefe de la sinagoga para decirle a éste: *“Ya se murió tu hija. ¿Para qué sigues molestando al Maestro?”* Jesús alcanzó a oír lo que hablaban y le dijo al jefe de la sinagoga. *“No temas. Basta que tengas fe”*. No permitió que lo acompañaran más que Pedro, Santiago y Juan, el hermano de Santiago. Al llegar a la casa del jefe de la sinagoga, vio Jesús el alboroto de la gente y oyó los llantos y los alaridos que daban. Entró y les dijo: *“¿Qué significa tanto llanto y alboroto? La niña no está muerta, está dormida”*. Y se reían de él. Entonces Jesús echó fuera a la gente, y con los padres de la niña y sus acompañantes entró donde estaba la niña. La tomó de la mano y le dijo: *“Talita, kum”!*, que significa: *“Oyeme, niña, levántate”!* La niña, que tenía doce años, se levantó inmediatamente y se puso a caminar. Todos se quedaron asombrados. Jesús les ordenó severamente que no lo dijeran a nadie y les mandó que le dieran de comer a la niña.



El evangelio de Marcos nos presenta hoy todo un proceso pedagógico de cómo debemos afrontar la vida y la muerte desde la fe. Jesús es el Señor de la Vida y así nos lo demuestran las lecturas de este domingo. Los textos son un canto a la vida y nos presentan Dios apasionado por la vida. El Evangelio nos recuerda que Cristo ha venido a dar vida: para que tengan vida y la tengan en abundancia. Muestra su poder sobre la muerte devolviendo a la vida a la hija de Jairo. También la Iglesia debe ser dadora de vida y transmisora de esperanza, cuidando a los enfermos, como ha hecho a lo largo de dos mil años, poniendo remedio a la incultura y defendiendo la vida contra todos los posibles ataques del hombre, de las guerras, de las escandalosas injusticias de este mundo, del terrorismo, así como de las perspectivas radicales del aborto o de la eutanasia o de la pena de muerte.

Por la envidia del diablo entró la muerte en el mundo

El libro de la Sabiduría nos ofrece hoy una de las reflexiones más hermosas sobre la vida y la muerte. Dios ama la vida! Quiere únicamente la vida! Dios creó el hombre para la inmortalidad. Por su Hijo, nos salvó de la muerte. Sólo los impíos razonan equivocadamente que no hay vida más allá de la que disfrutamos en este mundo. Por eso tratan de aprovecharla como si fuera su único paraíso: no importa que, para ser felices, tengan que pisotear los derechos de los demás.

DOMINGO XIII DO TEMPO COMUM



EVANGELHO: SÃO MARCOS 5, 21-34.35-43

Naquele tempo, depois de Jesus ter atravessado de barco para a outra margem do lago, reuniu-se uma grande multidão à sua volta, e ele deteve-se à beira-mar. Chegou então um dos chefes da sinagoga, chamado Jairo. Ao ver Jesus, caiu aos seus pés e suplicou-lhe com insistência: *“A minha filha está a morrer. Vem impor-lhe as mãos, para que se salve e viva”*. Jesus foi com ele, seguido por grande multidão, que o apertava de todos os lados. Entretanto, vieram dizer da casa do chefe da sinagoga: *“A tua filha morreu. Porque estás ainda a importunar o Mestre?”* Mas Jesus, ouvindo estas palavras, disse ao chefe da sinagoga: *“Não temas; basta que tenhas fé”*. E não deixou que ninguém o acompanhasse, a não ser Pedro, Tiago e João, irmão de Tiago. Quando chegaram a casa do chefe da sinagoga, Jesus encontrou grande alvoroço, com gente que chorava e gritava. Ao entrar, perguntou-lhes: *“Porquê todo este alarido e tantas lamentações? A menina não morreu; está a dormir”*. Riram-se dele. Jesus, depois de os ter mandado sair a todos, levando consigo apenas o pai da menina e os que vinham com ele, entrou no local onde jazia a menina. Pegou-lhe na mão e disse: *“Talita Kum”*, que significa: *“Menina, eu te ordeno: Levanta-te”*. Ela ergueu-se imediatamente e começou a andar, pois já tinha doze anos. Ficaram todos muito maravilhados. Jesus recomendou-lhes insistentemente que ninguém soubesse do caso e mandou dar de comer à menina.



Esta passagem do evangelho fala sobre a fé. Não estamos diante de uma doença, mas perante uma situação desesperada: a morte. Humanamente não há mais nada a esperar. E, no entanto, Jesus diz ao chefe da sinagoga: *“Não temas; basta que tenhas fé”*. O poder de Jesus não retrocede sequer diante do maior inimigo do homem, a morte. Acordando a menina do sono da morte, Jesus mostra, antes de mais, que a fé nele pode obter até esta vitória. São Marcos neste evangelho pretende dizer-nos que, para quem acredita em Jesus, não há situações irrecuperáveis. As pessoas tentadas a perder a esperança de que algo possa ainda mudar, Jesus repete: *“Não temas; basta que tenhas fé”*. Quem crê nele verá ainda hoje ressurgir para uma nova vida os que todos consideram definitivamente perdidos.

Sabedoria 1,13-15;2,23-24

Não foi Deus quem fez a morte, nem Ele Se alegra com a perdição dos vivos. Pela criação deu o ser a todas as coisas, e o que nasce no mundo destina-se ao bem. Em nada existe o veneno que mata, nem o poder da morte reina sobre a terra, porque a justiça é imortal. Deus criou o homem para ser incorruptível e fê-lo à imagem da sua própria natureza. Foi pela inveja do Diabo que a morte entrou no mundo, e experimentam-na aqueles que lhe pertencem.

A primeira leitura deste domingo diz-nos que Deus está sempre ao lado da vida. O que ele quer é a vida do homem. Deus criou-nos para ser eternos. É verdade que todas as criaturas passam pela morte biológica; mas essa morte não impede que cheguemos à Vida eterna.
