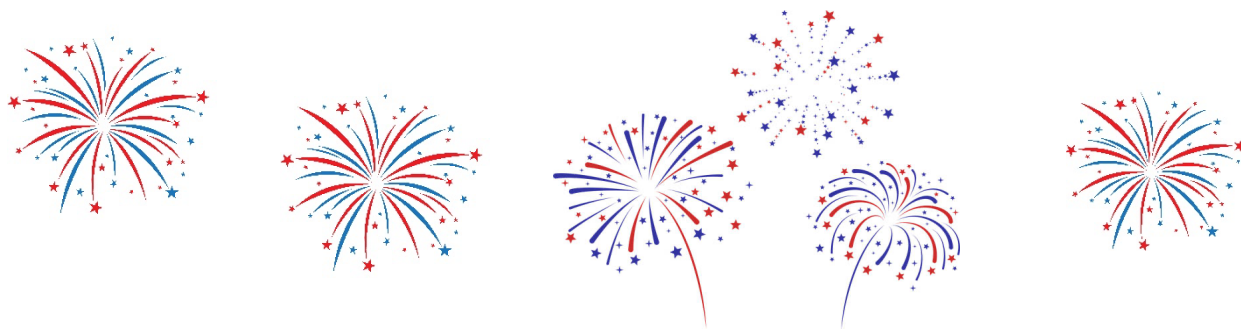

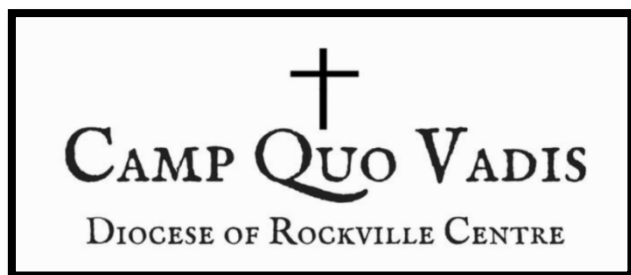

Wherever you go, I shall go/ Wherever you live, there shall I live/ Your people will be my people/ And your God will be my God, too. This promise of fidelity from the book of Ruth reminds us that Christ will live and go with us, wherever we live and wherever we go. But it also invites us to care for people because they are his people, too. Christ asks each disciple to be his partner in the work that God the Father sent him to do in this world. And he promises to be our partner, whatever our work, whatever kind of life we live, wherever we go. We follow him, trusting that he is with us, not just for a moment, but for the whole of our lives. Wherever we go, however we live, “the Lord is at my side.” His commitment to us is lifelong despite our own inability to think of him always, or even despite our occasional thoughtless rejection of him. The mystery of God’s call to us and of our response to him is that he is always there for us. “I am at your side; you are my friends,” said Jesus, even to disciples who sometimes lose the way. If we take those words to heart we can accept the risk of going out to others in his name. In saying “yes” to our life as Christian disciples, we can, like Jeremiah, go forward in a zigzag fashion, going somewhere, but not always directly or in a predictable manner. “Do not be afraid,” Christ said and still says. “With men it is impossible but not with God; for all things are possible with God.”

XIII DOMINGO DEL TIEMPO ORDINARIO



EVANGELIO DE SAN MATEO 10, 37-42

En aquel tiempo, Jesús dijo a sus apóstoles: *“El que ama a su padre o a su madre más que a mí, no es digno de mí; el que ama a su hijo o hija más que a mí, no es digno de mí; y el que no toma su cruz y me sigue, no es digno de mí. El que salve su vida la perderá y el que la pierda por mí, la salvará. Quien los recibe a ustedes me recibe a mí, y quien me recibe a mí, recibe al que me ha enviado. El que recibe a un profeta por ser profeta, recibirá recompensa de profeta; el que recibe a un justo por ser justo, recibirá recompensa de justo. Quien diere, aunque no sea más que un vaso de agua fría a uno de estos pequeños por ser mi discípulo mío, yo les aseguro que no perderá su recompensa”.*

»Quien los recibe a ustedes me recibe a mí; y quien me recibe a mí recibe al que me envió.

Mateo 10:40 NVI

El evangelio de este domingo vuelve sobre el “discurso de misión”, en el cual Jesús envía sus apóstoles para predicar el Reino de Dios en los pueblos judíos. Mateo señala para su comunidad que ser discípulo y seguidor de Jesús lleve consigo el vivir en conflicto. Las palabras de Jesús en el evangelio nos parecen duras. Es difícil ser cristiano. Perseverar en el discipulado supone romper ciertas tradiciones que nos atan, hasta las más familiares. No se trata de romper afecto familiares, sino lazos que no nos dejan libres. Estamos ante el primer mandamiento: amar a Dios y lo que significa. Frente a las obligaciones familiares socialmente importantes o a las

sugerencias familiares materialistas, Jesús propone una radicalidad absoluta. Propone purificar lo que en nuestras relaciones familiares o sociales no genera vida porque son contrarias al evangelio. Para Mateo nadie puede estar por encima del evangelio. El seguimiento de Jesús no es un camino fácil, acompañado de aplausos, sino que es un camino radical, que obliga, muchas veces, a rupturas y a opciones exigentes. Pero el discípulo que da su testimonio de adhesión al evangelio, tendrá su recompensa.



La primera Lectura del segundo Libro de los Reyes recoge una tradición muy común de la Biblia, en la que el profeta Eliseo concede a una mujer sunamita el que sea bendecido por un hijo. Es la felicidad mayor de toda mujer ser madre y el profeta de Dios no puede concederle otra cosa, como sucedió con Sara, la madre de Isaac, como sucedió con Ana la madre de Samuel y como sucederá a Isabel, la madre de Juan Bautista. En la Biblia siempre se ha interpretado la maternidad tardía como una bendición, ya que las tradiciones populares religiosas consideraban la esterilidad como una maldición divina.

De la misma manera, también ustedes considérense muertos al pecado, pero vivos para Dios en Cristo Jesús.

- Romanos 6:11 (NVI) -

La segunda lectura recuerda que el cristiano es alguien que, por el Bautismo, se ha identificado con Jesús. Dice Pablo que “todos los que hemos sido incorporados a Cristo Jesús por medio del bautismo, hemos sido incorporados a su muerte. Si hemos muerto con Cristo, también viviremos con Él”.

DOMINGO XIII DO TEMPO COMUM



EVANGELHO DE SÃO MATEUS 10, 37-42

Naquele tempo, disse Jesus aos seus apóstolos: “Quem ama o pai ou a mãe mais do que a mim, não é digno de mim; e quem ama o filho ou a filha mais do que a mim, não é digno de mim. Quem não toma a sua cruz para me seguir, não é digno de mim. Quem encontrar a sua vida há-de perdê-la; e quem perder a sua vida por minha causa, há-de encontrá-la. Quem vos recebe, a mim recebe; e quem me recebe, recebe Aquele que me enviou. Quem recebe um profeta por ele ser profeta, receberá a recompensa de profeta; e quem receber um justo por ele ser justo, receberá a recompensa de justo. E se alguém der de beber, nem que seja um copo de água fresca, a um destes pequeninos, por ele ser meu discípulo, em verdade vos digo: Não perderá a sua recompensa”.



O evangelho que lemos hoje é o final do Sermão apostólico de Jesus. São suas palavras dirigidas para os apóstolos que ele manda a pregar o Reino de Deus aos povoados judeus. Num primeiro passo, Mateus apresenta um conjunto de exigências radicais para quem quer seguir Jesus; na segunda parte, Mateus sugere que toa a comunidade deve anunciar Jesus e põe na boa de Jesus o anúncio de uma recompensa, destinada àqueles que acolherem os mensageiros do Evangelho. Jesus define o caminho do discípulo: o discípulo tem de ser capaz de fazer de Jesus a sua

opção fundamental e seguir o seu mestre no caminho do amor e da entrega da vida. Jesus nunca escondeu que as perseguições fazem parte da evangelização. Segui-lo significa sacrifício e cruz. Por outro lado, estes pequeninos que são os apóstolos cristãos conhecerão também o acolhimento, a singela hospitalidade de um copo de água oferecido. São gestos valiosíssimos, pois é como acolher o próprio Cristo. Deus os recompensará tão bem como recompensou a hospitalidade oferecida ao profeta Eliseu que vemos na primeira leitura deste domingo.



Um dos temas da missa de hoje é o acolhimento. O episódio que a leitura nos relata descreve a generosa hospitalidade que o profeta Eliseu encontra em casa de uma mulher de Sunam, nas suas idas e vindas ao monte Carmelo pregando a mensagem de Deus. Ela não somente o recebe e o alimenta, mas manda construir para o profeta um quarto no terraço da sua casa. O gesto da mulher leva até às últimas consequências a virtude da hospitalidade. Ela reconhece que Eliseu é um “homem de Deus”. E ela recebe de Deus a recompensa.



A segunda leitura da Carta de São Paulo aos Romanos recorda que o cristão é alguém que, pelo Baptismo, se identificou com Jesus. A partir daí, o cristão deve seguir Jesus no caminho do amor e do dom da vida e renunciar definitivamente ao pecado.
