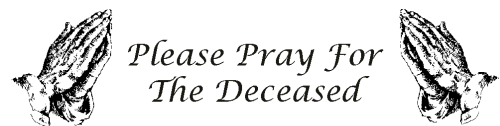

*Español***XIV DOMINGO DEL TIEMPO  
ORDINARIO****EVANGELIO DE SAN MATEO 11, 25-30**

En aquel tiempo, Jesús exclamó: “¡Te doy gracias, Padre, Señor del cielo y de la tierra, porque has escondido estas cosas a los sabios y entendidos, y las has revelado a la gente sencilla! ¡Gracias, Padre, porque así te ha parecido bien! El Padre ha puesto todas las cosas en mis manos. Nadie conoce al Hijo sino el Padre, y nadie conoce al Padre sino el Hijo y aquel a quien el Hijo se lo quiera revelar. Vengan a mí, todos los que están fatigados y agobiados por la carga, y yo los aliviaré. Tomen mi yugo sobre ustedes y aprendan de mí, que soy manso y humilde de corazón, y encontrarán descanso, porque mi yugo es suave, y mi carga ligera”.

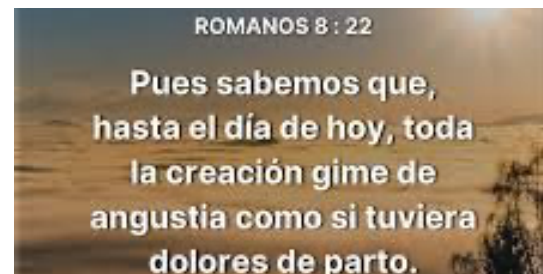


Jesús bendice al Padre porque ha revelado sus secretos a los pequeños. No se trata de una exaltación de la ignorancia ni de un desprecio de la inteligencia. Lo que Jesús alaba es la actitud de quien permanece abierto al don. Hay un cansancio que nace de la autosuficiencia. Cuando creemos que todo depende de nosotros,

terminamos cargando pesos que nunca fuimos llamados a llevar. La humildad evangélica consiste en reconocer nuestra necesidad de Dios. Los pequeños son aquellos que saben recibir. Son capaces de dejarse enseñar, corregir y acompañar. No tienen todas las respuestas, pero permanecen disponibles para escuchar. Y es precisamente en esa actitud donde Dios encuentra espacio para actuar.



La segunda lectura del libro del profeta Zacarías es una de las profecías mesiánicas más conocidas del Antiguo Testamento. Anuncia la llegada del Mesías como un rey justo, victorioso y humilde, que entrará en Jerusalén montado en un burro y traerá paz universal. Se le ordena a Sión (Jerusalén) que se alegre por la venida de su Rey. A diferencia de los conquistadores de la época que montaban imponentes caballos de guerra, este Mesías es "humilde y cabalgando sobre un burrito." En la antigüedad, el burro era un símbolo de paz. El Mesías eliminará los instrumentos de guerra de Israel (caballos y carros). Se establece que él "hablará paz a las naciones" y su reino se extenderá de mar a mar, simbolizando un dominio universal y sin violencia.



La segunda lectura, Romanos 8:18-23 enseña que los sufrimientos terrenales presentes no pueden compararse con la futura gloria de los creyentes. El apóstol Pablo explica que la creación entera gime a la espera de la redención final, y los cristianos, que poseen el Espíritu Santo, también aguardan ansiosamente la adopción plena y la resurrección corporal.

## Português

### DOMINGO XIV DO TEMPO COMUM



#### EVANGELHO DE SÃO MATEUS 11, 25-30

Naquele tempo, Jesus exclamou: “Eu Te bendigo, ó Pai, Senhor do céu e da terra, porque escondeste estas verdades aos sábios e inteligentes e as revelaste aos pequeninos. Tudo me foi dado por meu Pai. Sim, Pai, Eu Te bendigo, porque assim foi do teu agrado. Ninguém conhece o Filho senão o Pai e ninguém conhece o Pai senão o Filho e aquele a quem o Filho o quiser revelar. Vinde a Mim, todos os que andais cansados e oprimidos, e Eu vos aliviarei. Tomai sobre vós o meu jugo e aprendei de Mim, que sou manso e humilde de coração, e encontrareis descanso para as vossas almas. Porque o meu jugo é suave e a minha carga é leve”.



No Evangelho, Jesus louva o Pai porque a proposta de salvação que Deus faz aos homens (e que foi rejeitada pelos “sábios e inteligentes”) encontrou acolhimento no coração dos “pequeninos”. Os “grandes”, instalados no seu orgulho e não têm tempo nem disponibilidade para os desafios de Deus; mas os “pequenos”, na sua pobreza e simplicidade, estão sempre disponíveis para acolher a novidade libertadora de Deus. • Na verdade, os critérios de Deus são bem estranhos, vistos de cá da terra. Nós, homens, admiramos os sábios, os inteligentes, os intelectuais, os ricos, os

poderosos, e queremos que sejam eles (“os melhores”) a dirigir o mundo, a fazer as leis que nos governam, a ditar as ideias, a definir o que é correcto ou não é correcto. Mas Deus diz que as coisas essenciais são muito mais depressa percebidas pelo “pequeninos”: são eles que estão sempre disponíveis para acolher Deus e os seus valores. Quantas vezes os pobres, os pequenos, os humildes são ridicularizados, tratados como incapazes, pelos “importantes” que tudo sabem e que procuram impor ao mundo e aos outros as suas visões pessoais e os seus valores... A Palavra de Deus ensina: a sabedoria e a inteligência não garantem a posse da verdade; o que garante a posse da verdade é ter um coração aberto a Deus e às suas propostas.



O texto de Zacarias 9, 9-10, da primeira leitura, é uma das profecias mais conhecidas do Antigo Testamento sobre a vinda do Messias. Ele descreve um Rei que trará paz e salvação, destacando-se não pelo poder militar ostensivo, mas pela sua justiça e humildade. A profecia se divide em duas partes fundamentais: O Rei Humilde (v. 9): O profeta convida o povo a se alegrar, pois o seu Rei está chegando. Ele é descrito como justo e vitorioso, mas humilde, entrando em Jerusalém montado em um jumentinho (o que séculos depois se cumpriria na entrada triunfal de Jesus). O Reino de Paz (v. 10): O Messias acabará com as armas de guerra e com os instrumentos de batalha. Ele anunciará a paz para as nações e o seu domínio se estenderá "de mar a mar" e até aos confins da Terra.
