“Whoever gives only a cup of cold water to one of these little ones to drink because the little one is a disciple—amen, I say to you, he will surely not lose his reward.” (Matthew 10:37-42)

The heart of the paschal mystery is dying and rising. Our own daily living can sometimes seem to have much more dying than rising. Even setting aside the issue of consciously choosing self-sacrifice, just the simple demands of our lives pull it out of us: feeding the infant in the middle of the night, ferrying the kids to soccer, helping with the homework when we are dog tired, cleaning the house and preparing meals, taking time to share some good thing with a spouse, calling and visiting an aging parent, helping the suffering and the poor. One of the great encouragements of this Sunday’s gospel is that all this behavior—like giving “a cup of cold water”—may seem small to us, but to God they are actions that correspond to those of Christ. The message is that our generosity is far surpassed by God’s generosity. A life of virtue is no accident. God gives the grace, but human effort is required to cultivate the virtue. Habits of charity, hopefulness, and justice are built, not just wished into being. Good intentions are insufficient responses to God’s grace. Virtue—a good habit, an inner readiness to accomplish moral good—has to become part of the fabric of life. For instance, by acting patiently over and over in trying situations, a person may learn patience. Virtues such as patience are important in the full living of the Christian life.

Worldwide Marriage Encounter

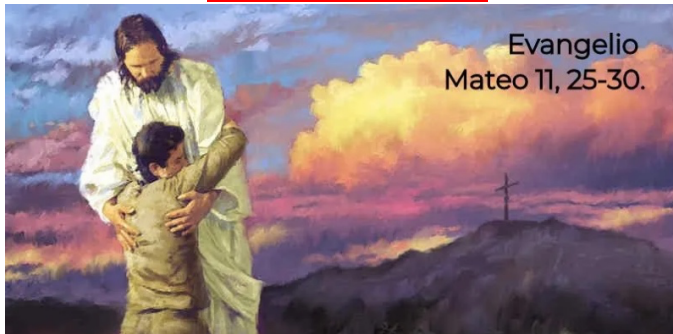

XIV DOMINGO DEL TIEMPO ORDINARIO



EVANGELIO DE SAN MATEO 11, 25-30

En aquel tiempo, Jesús exclamó: *“Te doy gracias, Padre, Señor del cielo y de la tierra, porque has escondido estas cosas a los sabios y entendidos, y las has revelado a la gente sencilla! Gracias, Padre, porque así te ha parecido bien. El Padre ha puesto todas las cosas en mis manos. Nadie conoce al Hijo sino el Padre, y nadie conoce al Padre sino el Hijo y aquel a quien el Hijo se lo quiera revelar. Vengan a mí, todos los que están fatigados y agobiados por la carga, y yo los aliviaré. Tomen mi yugo sobre ustedes y aprendan de mí, que soy manso y humilde de corazón, y encontrarán descanso, porque mi yugo es suave y mi carga ligera”*.



Jesús nos promete descanso. En el evangelio de hoy nos dice que en Él encontrarán descanso los que están cansados y agobiados. A veces cuando vienen los problemas, nos alejamos de Dios. Podemos pensar que Jesús nos agobia con sus mandamientos y nos cansa con sus exigencias. A veces vemos como una carga el vivir según la Palabra de Dios. Nada más lejos de la realidad. Ser cristiano es tener a Dios como mejor amigo. Es contar en mi vida con una presencia divina que me sostiene, me conforta, me ayuda, me guía. Jesús camina con nosotros cada día si nosotros no le cerramos la puerta. Pidamos al Señor la humildad de corazón y la mansedumbre para que encontremos siempre en Jesús el descanso que necesitamos.



La primera lectura del profeta Zacarías nos presenta a un enviado de Dios que viene al encuentro de los hombres en la pobreza, en la humildad, en la sencillez; y es esa forma como se eliminan los instrumentos de la guerra y de la muerte y se instaaura la paz definitiva. Zacarías describe en este oráculo el regreso del rey victorioso a Jerusalén. La ciudad es invitada a regocijarse pues su rey, justo y salvador, ha llegado. Ese rey humilde y pacífico tendrá la fuerza para destruir la guerra y para proclamar la paz universal.



En la segunda lectura, Pablo invita a los creyentes, comprometidos con Jesús desde el día del bautismo, a que vivan “según el Espíritu” y no “según la carne”. Lo que Pablo predica es la vida del Espíritu, esa misma vida que Jesús reveló a la gente sencilla, la vida que Él traía del Padre para el mundo. Es cierto que el imperio romano ofrecía como vida regalada a quienes rechazaban a un Mesías que había muerto colgado en una cruz. Lo que Dios revela a la gente sencilla y esconde a los sabios y entendidos es la liberación de esta esclavitud de la carne. Descubrir que el cansancio y el agobio que la carne produce lo alivia la cercanía de Dios, nos permite cargar con la cruz de cada día sintiendo como la ayuda divina aligera hasta el peso de nuestros pecados. Vivir según el Espíritu equivale a dar muerte a las obras de la carne, es decir, no vivir carnalmente. Recordemos que según san Pablo, vivir según la carne es vivir al margen de la gracia y de la salvación que Dios ofrecen en Cristo.

DOMINGO XIV DO TEMPO COMUM



EVANGELHO DE SÃO MATEUS 11, 25-30

Naquele tempo, Jesus exclamou: *“Eu te bendigo, ó Pai, Senhor do céu e da terra, porque escondeste estas verdades aos sábios e inteligentes e as revelaste aos pequeninos. Sim, Pai eu te bendigo, porque assim foi do teu agrado. Tudo me foi dado por meu Pai. Ninguém conhece o Filho senão o Pai e ninguém conhece o Pai senão o Filho e aquele a quem o Filho o quiser revelar. Vinde a mim, todos os que andais cansados e oprimidos, e eu vos aliviarei. Tomai sobre vós o meu jugo e aprendei de mim, que sou manso e humilde de coração, e encontrareis descanso para as vossas almas. Porque o meu jugo é suave e a minha carga é leve”.*



Duas partes distintas percebemos no Evangelho de Mateus que é proclamado hoje: Ação de graças de Graças ao Pai e convite de Cristo à libertação. Jesus não se fez entender e aceitar pelos sábios e letrados, como ele mesmo reconhece: *“Sim, Pai, porque isso foi do vosso agrado”.* O anúncio de Cristo sobre o Reino de Deus, sobre o amor do Pai e seu plano de salvação do homem, sobre a paternidade de Deus e a fraternidade humana, nós não compreendemos por nossa sabedoria humana, mas por revelação de Deus

que a concede à gente simples e a nega aos sábios auto-suficientes. Na segunda parte do Evangelho, Jesus nos convida à libertação e aos descanso. Essa é a mensagem de Jesus ao jugo insuportável de formalismo estreito com que os escribas e fariseus explicavam e aplicavam a Lei à base do legalismo. Só os simples, os humildes chegam ao verdadeiro conhecimento de Deus. Cansados e oprimidos são todos aqueles que sofrem na vida por uma razão ou outra; são os pobres de Deus aos quais Jesus dirige sua mensagem do Evangelho e com os quais ele se identifica. Jesus espera por nós, espera-nos sempre, não para resolver magicamente os nossos problemas, mas para nos tornar mais fortes em relação aos nossos problemas. Ele não nos tira os pesos da vida, mas sim a angústia do coração; não nos tira a cruz, mas carrega-a juntamente conosco.



A liturgia deste domingo ensina-nos onde encontrar Deus. Garante-nos que Deus não se revela na arrogância, no orgulho, na prepotência, mas sim na simplicidade, na humildade, na pobreza, na pequenez. A primeira leitura do livro da profecia de Zacarias apresenta-nos um enviado de Deus que vem ao encontro dos homens na pobreza, na humildade, na simplicidade; e é dessa forma que elimina os instrumento de guerra e de morte e instaura a paz definitiva. Essa leitura nos lembra a entrada de Jesus em Jerusalém no Domingo de Ramos.

2ª LEITURA: (Romanos 8,9.11-13)

Leitura da Carta de São Paulo aos Romanos.



Irmãos, Vós não viveis segundo a carne, mas segundo o espírito, se realmente o Espírito de Deus mora em vós. Se alguém não tem o Espírito de Cristo, não pertence a Cristo.
