

Fr. Ihor Hinda



Glory to Jesus Christ! My name is Ihor Hinda. I come from Ukraine and was born in 1992 in Burštyn. I'm the youngest of two and my parents and my sister currently live in New York. I spent my first wonderful eighteen years in Ukraine. After I graduated from college, I entered the seminary in Lublin (Poland) in 2011, where I completed my degree in theology at the Catholic University of John Paul II in 2017. After my graduation in the same year, I began my German course and subsequently 2018 my doctoral studies at the Faculty of Theology in Innsbruck (Austria). I owe my scholarship to the priestly college "Canisianum" under the direction of the Jesuit Fathers. On April 25, 2023, I successfully completed my research project in Church History.

As for my vocation, I decided many years ago to become a priest. Due to the ongoing war in my homeland since 2022, I could not be ordained at home. Therefore, I made my important life decision in Innsbruck. Specifically, I was ordained a deacon on October 16, 2022, and a priest on June 25 of 2023. The ordination took place in Innsbruck in the Jesuit church in the Ukrainian Byzantine rite.

In my seven years of living in Austria, I have not only mastered a new language and acquired expertise in my field, but I have also discovered a fascinating world rich in customs, traditions, and history. After one year of my priestly ministry in Austria, I was invited at the end of May last year by the Diplomatic Academy to complete training for the representatives of the Holy Father in Rome, Italy. Simultaneously, I am pursuing my licentiate studies in canon law at the University "Santa Croce."

My hobbies include church history, singing, various sports, and learning languages. During my studies, I learned to be open to new experiences. Instead of making decisions alone, I prefer constructive and reliable teamwork. After a long period of study, practical experience is, of course, also necessary and meaningful. For diplomatic ministry, it is also indispensable to speak foreign languages, which is why I am here, in Mineola, in your parish, with the clear goal of improving my English skills. But first and foremost, my desire is to share my faith with you. I hope this time will be a great enrichment for all of us. Please keep me in your prayers, and especially keep my country, Ukraine, in your thoughts. Let us trust in God's Providence during this time of my ministry in the midst of your community.

As Pope Benedict XVI wrote in the preface to his book "Jesus of Nazareth": *"I only ask for that advance of sympathy without which there is no understanding"*. I would like to kindly ask you to welcome me into your parish family so that we can embark on this for me new pastoral experience together with mutual respect and joy.

Corpus Christi needs new Altar Servers!!

These are some of the requirements to serve as an Altar Server:

You have to be a registered member of Corpus Christi.

The boys and girls have to have completed 4th grade.

They have to have the Sacrament of First Holy Communion.

Altar Servers form a very important part of our Parish and we are enriched through their dedication and service. They assist the priest and deacon of the parish during the celebration of the Mass. As visible members of our Parish ministry team, Altar Servers have a responsibility to serve as an example to others of one's commitment to their faith. Serving prayerfully with reverence, respect and attentiveness to the assigned tasks during the Mass is very important.

Some of the tasks Altar Servers perform include carrying the Cross during the entrance and recessional processions; presenting the bread, wine and water to the priest and assist him in receiving the gifts; as well as many other tasks throughout the Mass. These are very important tasks and therefore, the Altar Servers have to undergo extensive training with the help of the more experienced Altar Servers both during training as well as when they first altar serve in a Mass. Servers should be mature enough to understand their responsibilities and to carry them out well and with appropriate reverence.





XV DOMINGO DEL TIEMPO ORDINARIO



EVANGELIO DE SAN LUCAS 10, 25-37

En aquel tiempo se presentó ante Jesús un doctor de la ley para ponerlo a prueba y le preguntó: “Maestro, qué debo hacer para conseguir la vida eterna”? Jesús le dijo: “Qué es lo que está escrito en la ley? Qué lees en ella”? El doctor de la ley contestó: “Amarás al Señor tu Dios, con todo tu corazón, con toda tu alma, con todas tus fuerzas y con todo tu ser, y a tu prójimo como a ti mismo”. Jesús le dijo: “Has contestado bien; si haces eso, vivirás”. El doctor de la ley, para justificarse, le preguntó a Jesús: “Y quién es mi prójimo”? Jesús le dijo: “Un hombre que bajaba por el camino de Jerusalén a Jericó, cayó en manos de unos ladrones, los cuales lo robaron, lo hirieron y lo dejaron medio muerto. Sucedió que por el mismo camino bajaba un sacerdote, el cual lo vio y pasó de largo. De igual modo, un levita que pasó por ahí, lo vio y siguió adelante. Pero un samaritano que iba de viaje, al verlo, se compadeció de él, se le acercó, ungió sus heridas con aceite y vino y se las vendó; luego lo puso sobre su cabalgadura, lo llevó a un mesón y cuidó de él. Al día siguiente sacó dos denarios, se los dio al dueño del mesón y le dijo: Cuida de él y lo que gastes de más, te lo pagaré a mi regreso. Cuál de estos tres te parece que se portó como prójimo del hombre que fue asaltado por los ladrones”? El doctor de la ley le respondió: “El que tuvo compasión de él”. Entonces Jesús le dijo: “Anda y haz tú lo mismo”.



El evangelio de hoy es una de las narraciones más majestosas de todo el Nuevo Testamento y del evangelio de Lucas. Una narración que solamente ha podido salir de los labios de Jesús. El escriba quiere asegurarse la vida eterna, la salvación, y quiere que Jesús le puntualice exactamente qué es lo que debe hacer para ello. Quiere una respuesta jurídica que le complazca. Jesús cuenta una parábola. La parábola habla de una solidaridad humana. A la pregunta del conocedor de la Ley, Jesús le responde devolviendo el sentido verdadero de la Ley. “Amarás el Señor tu Dios con todo tu corazón y con toda alma y con todas tus fuerzas y con todo tu ser. Y al prójimo como a ti mismo”. Sí, sólo el amor nos hace vivir, sólo cuando somos capaces de ver al prójimo y amarle como Dios nos ama, vivimos el verdadero sentido de la Ley. La parábola del buen samaritano nos enseña que no basta conocer la ley, ser un experto de la misma, para garantizar el cumplimiento de la misma.



La primera lectura está tomada de uno de los libros que más ha influenciado en la vida y la teología del pueblo del Antiguo Testamento, el Deuteronomio. El texto de hoy es de lo más densos, profundos y expresivos. Lo que Dios quiere para su pueblo y para cada uno de nosotros es muy fácil de entender. Lo que Dios quiere que hagamos no hay que ir a buscarlo más allá del cielo o a las profundidades del mar: lo bueno, lo hermoso, lo justo, es algo que debe estar en nuestro corazón; debe nacer de nosotros mismos.

DOMINGO XV DO TEMPO COMUM



EVANGELHO DE SÃO LUCAS 10, 25-37

Naquele tempo, levantou-se um doutor da lei e perguntou a Jesus para o experimentar: “Mestre, que hei-de fazer para receber como herança a vida eterna”? Jesus disse-lhe: “Que está escrito na lei? Como lês tu”? Ele respondeu: “Amarás o Senhor teu Deus com todo o teu coração e com toda a tua alma, com todas as tuas forças e com todo o teu entendimento; e ao próximo como a ti mesmo”. Disse-lhe Jesus: “Respondeste bem. Faz isso e viverás”. Mas ele, querendo justificar-se, perguntou a Jesus: “E quem é o meu próximo”? Jesus, tomando a palavra, disse: “Um homem descia de Jerusalém para Jericó e caiu nas mãos dos salteadores. Roubaram-lhe tudo o que levava, espancaram-no e foram-se embora, deixando-o meio morto. Por coincidência, descia pelo mesmo caminho um sacerdote; viu-o e passou adiante. Do mesmo modo, um levita que vinha por aquele lugar, viu-o e passou também adiante. Mas um samaritano que ia de viagem, passou juto dele e, ao vê-lo, encheu-se de compaixão. Aproximou-se, ligou-lhe as feridas deitando azeite e vinho, colocou sobre a sua própria montada, levou-o para uma estalagem e cuidou dele. No dia seguinte, tirou duas moedas, deu-as ao estalajadeiro e disse: Trata bem dele; e o que gastares a mais eu to pagarei quando voltar. Qual destes três te parece ter sido o próximo daquele homem que caiu nas mãos dos salteadores”? O doutor da lei respondeu: “O que teve compaixão dele”. Disse-lhe Jesus: “Então vai e faz o mesmo”.

No evangelho, Jesus ajuda um mestre da Lei a perceber que a vida deve ser construída à volta de dois eixos fundamentais: o amor a Deus e a compaixão pelo próximo. Para que as coisas fiquem perfeitamente claras, Jesus conta uma parábola que define claramente quem é esse próximo: é qualquer pessoa com quem nos cruzamos e que necessita do nosso cuidado, da nossa solicitude, do nosso amor. Quem vive guiado pelo amor caminha em direção à vida eterna. A nossa fidelidade e o nosso amor a Deus – ensina-nos o Evangelho de hoje – serão avaliados de conformidade com as atitudes que assumirmos em relação aos outros. Esta é a verdadeira religião: a religião da vida, não a das conversas vazias. O samaritano a praticou porque tinha um coração puro, um coração capaz de experimentar os sentimentos de Deus, isto é, capaz de sentir compaixão.



A primeira leitura, do Livro Deuteronomio nos ensina que os mandamentos não são uma imposição vinda de fora, mas uma exigência profunda do nosso coração.



Carta de São Paulo aos Colossenses 1,15-20

Na Segunda leitura Paulo nos ensina que Jesus foi o primeiro em tudo, também no amor para os irmãos. Foi o primeiro autêntico samaritano da humanidade.
