

How hard it is for us older folk to cope with the volume of change in our world. We have experienced so much cultural and social change, legal and even constitutional changes, as well as having to adapt to new technologies, apps on our smartphones, and online banking. It can be tempting to look back on the “Good old Days” until we remember that there were many abuses in those old days, and many good things available to us in the here and now.

But people always had to be ready for change, in order to follow Jesus and take him as a guide for living. In Matthew’s Gospel; the difference between His message and that of John the Baptist is put in homespun imagery. They could not sew animal skins that have not been tanned onto old leather cloaks; the new would shrink and then pull away. If animal skins were used to hold fermenting wine, new skins had the elasticity to stretch, while old skins would burst open and the wine lost. This image from everyday life points to a dramatic discontinuity with the past, in Jesus’ preaching and outlook. What began as a fringe movement, now moves to the center. There is to be an entirely new cloak rather than an old one with patches, new wineskins for the new wine.

We must be willing to adapt to the conditions among which God and history have put us. The ways of Providence are surely leading towards a noble, final goal, but they pass through many vagaries of custom and circumstance. We pray to be worthy disciples of Jesus, letting Him pour his new wine into new wineskins (us), and be as realistic as He was, in accepting change.

XV DOMINGO DEL TIEMPO ORDINARIO



EVANGELIO DE SAN MATEO 13, 1-9

Un día salió de la casa donde se hospedaba y sentó a la orilla del mar. Se reunió en torno suyo tanta gente, que él se vio obligado a subir a una barca, donde se sentó, mientras la gente permanecía en la orilla. Entonces Jesús les habló de muchas cosas en parábolas y les dijo: *“Una vez salió un sembrador a sembrar, y al ir arrojando la semilla, unos granos cayeron a lo largo del camino, vinieron los pájaros y se los comieron. Otros granos cayeron en terreno pedregoso, que tenía poca tierra; ahí germinaron. Otros cayeron en gruesa; pero cuando subió el sol, los brotes se marchitaron, y como no tenían raíces, se secaron. Otros cayeron entre espinos, y cuando los espinos crecieron, sufocaron las plantitas. Otros granos cayeron en tierra buena y dieron frutos: unos, ciento por uno; otros, sesenta; y otros, treinta. El que tenga oídos, que oiga”*.



Cuando Mateo escribe su evangelio, los cristianos estaban desorientados. A través de la parábola, Mateo nos quiere dejar muy claro que el evangelio es para todos, que cada ser humano es responsable de escuchar y acoger la Palabra o de rechazarla. El centro de la parábola es la semilla, la palabra de

Dios, que al caer en el corazón del ser humano produce efectos diferentes en cada persona según la acoja o la rechace. Los cuatro tipos de terreno simbolizan los cuatro tipos de personas en quienes es sembrada la palabra. Es el momento de preguntarnos y responder: **Qué clase de tierra soy? Acojo o rechazo la Palabra de Dios? La Palabra requiere escucha.**



Sabemos que los profetas de Israel y Judá han marcado la religiosidad de su época y por eso su mensaje sigue siendo para nosotros un mensaje de alternativa. La Palabra de Dios que viene sobre el pueblo desencadena juicio y salvación a la vez. La imagen del profeta Isaías compara la Palabra de Dios a la lluvia que baja del cielo y no vuelve allá sin antes empapar la tierra, fecundarla y hacerla germinar. No es una palabra vacía de sentido, sino semilla germinante, capaz de dar pan al hambriento y nueva semilla al agricultor. Esa es la eficacia de la Palabra que Dios esparce generosamente sobre el vasto campo de la humanidad; a ésta corresponde abrir su tierra y acoger con calor la semilla divina. La tierra colabora con la semilla y la lluvia acogiendo a ambas y prestando sus nutrientes para producir y hacer eficaz la generosidad divina.



DOMINGO XV DO TEMPO COMUM




EVANGELHO DE SÃO MATEUS 13, 1-9

Naquele dia, Jesus saiu de casa e foi sentar-se à beira-mar. Reuniu-se à sua volta tão grande multidão que teve de subir para um barco e sentar-se., enquanto a multidão ficava na margem. Disse muitas coisas em parábolas, nestes termos: Saiu o semeador a semear. Quando semeava, caíram algumas sementes ao longo do caminho; vieram as aves e comeram-nas. Outras caíram em sítios pedregosos, onde não havia muita terra, e logo nasceram, porque a terra era pouco profunda; mas depois de nascer o sol, queimaram-se e secaram, por não terem raiz. Outras caíram em boa terra e deram fruto: umas cem; outras, sessenta; outras, trinta por um. Quem tem ouvidos, oiça.



O capítulo 13 do Evangelho de São Mateus é constituído por um conjunto de parábolas sobre o Reino de Deus. Jesus usa esta figura de estilo para nos fazer entender esta realidade tão importante e necessária de trazer ao mundo em que vivemos os valores e atitudes que nos transformam e transformam também este mundo. Hoje e nos próximos dois domingos, o Evangelho apresenta-nos parábolas de Jesus. Ele revela aos discípulos a realidade do Reino de Deus. O capítulo 13 do Evangelho de Mateus começa com a Parábola do Semeador, que semeava sem escolher o terreno, pois

todo tipo de terreno é merecedor de receber a boa semente. Era ele, Jesus, o semeador que espalhava sua palavra em qualquer parte onde sentia alguma esperança de que poderia germinar. Ele sabia que parte da semente se perderia em terras desiguais. O importante era a colheita final, mesmo enfrentando resistências e obstáculos. Nós somos o terreno onde a Palavra de Deus é lançada. O que quer dizer que, se a semente não frutifica, não é culpa do semeador nem por causa da semente. O problema está no campo, em nós, e na nossa capacidade de acolher essa semente e a fazer frutificar.



O autor deste texto é um profeta que exerce a sua missão entre os exilados da Babilónia, procurando consolar e manter acesa a esperança no meio do povo amargurado, desiludido e decepcionado. O profeta anuncia aos exilados a libertação do cativo e um novo êxodo do Povo de Deus rumo à Terra Prometida. O profeta relembra a eficácia da Palavra de Deus. A comunidade exilada está farta de belas palavras e de promessas de libertação que tardam a concretizar-se. Deus ter-se-á esquecido da situação do seu Povo? Não, diz o profeta. Deus não se esqueceu do seu povo. A sua Palavra não deixará de se concretizar, pois Deus é eternamente fiel às suas promessas. A Palavra de Deus é eficaz. Ela nunca falha.

Porque para mim tenho por certo que as aflições deste tempo presente não são para comparar com a glória que em nós há de ser revelada.
