
## **Pastor's Notes**

## Fr. Ihor Hinda



Glory to Jesus Christ! My name is Ihor Hinda. I come from Ukraine and was born in 1992 in Burštyn. I'm the youngest of two and my parents and my sister currently live in New York. I spent my first wonderful eighteen years in Ukraine. After I graduated from college, I entered the seminary in Lublin (Poland) in 2011, where I completed my degree in theology at the Catholic University of John Paul II in 2017. After my graduation in the same year, I began my German course and subsequently 2018 my doctoral studies at the Faculty of Theology in Innsbruck (Austria). I owe my scholarship to the priestly college "Canisianum" under the direction of the Jesuit Fathers. On April 25, 2023, I successfully completed my research project in Church History.

As for my vocation, I decided many years ago to become a priest. Due to the ongoing war in my homeland since 2022, I could not be ordained at home. Therefore, I made my important life decision in Innsbruck. Specifically, I was ordained a deacon on October 16, 2022, and a priest on June 25 of 2023. The ordination took place in Innsbruck in the Jesuit church in the Ukrainian Byzantine rite.

In my seven years of living in Austria, I have not only mastered a new language and acquired expertise in my field, but I have also discovered a fascinating world rich in customs, traditions, and history. After one year of my priestly ministry in Austria, I was invited at the end of May last year by the Diplomatic Academy to complete training for the representatives of the Holy Father in Rome, Italy. Simultaneously, I am pursuing my licentiate studies in canon law at the University "Santa Croce."

My hobbies include church history, singing, various sports, and learning languages. During my studies, I learned to be open to new experiences. Instead of making decisions alone, I prefer constructive and reliable teamwork. After a long period of study, practical experience is, of course, also necessary and meaningful. For diplomatic ministry, it is also indispensable to speak foreign languages, which is why I am here, in Mineola, in your parish, with the clear goal of improving my English skills. But first and foremost, my desire is to share my faith with you. I hope this time will be a great enrichment for all of us. Please keep me in your prayers, and especially keep my country, Ukraine, in your thoughts. Let us trust in God's Providence during this time of my ministry in the midst of your community.

As Pope Benedict XVI wrote in the preface to his book "Jesus of Nazareth": *"I only ask for that advance of sympathy without which there is no understanding"*. I would like to kindly ask you to welcome me into your parish family so that we can embark on this for me new pastoral experience together with mutual respect and joy.





## **Corpus Christi needs new Altar Servers!!**

These are some of the requirements to serve as an Altar Server:

- You have to be a registered member of Corpus Christi.**
- The boys and girls have to have completed 4<sup>th</sup> grade.**
- They have to have the Sacrament of First Holy Communion.**

Altar Servers form a very important part of our Parish and we are enriched through their dedication and service. They assist the priest and deacon of the parish during the celebration of the Mass. As visible members of our Parish ministry team, Altar Servers have a responsibility to serve as an example to others of one's commitment to their faith. Serving prayerfully with reverence, respect and attentiveness to the assigned tasks during the Mass is very important.

Some of the tasks Altar Servers perform include carrying the Cross during the entrance and recessional processions; presenting the bread, wine and water to the priest and assist him in receiving the gifts; as well as many other tasks throughout the Mass. These are very important tasks and therefore, the Altar Servers have to undergo extensive training with the help of the more experienced Altar Servers both during training as well as when they first altar serve in a Mass. Servers should be mature enough to understand their responsibilities and to carry them out well and with appropriate reverence.


**We must speak out to protect the dignity of every human life.** Assisted suicide is a dangerous and deadly path – one we must not go down.



## XVI DOMINGO DEL TIEMPO ORDINARIO



### EVANGELIO DE SAN LUCAS 10, 38-42

*Yendo ellos de camino, entró en un pueblo; y una mujer, llamada Marta, le recibió en su casa. Tenía ella una hermana llamada María, que, sentada a los pies del Señor, escuchaba su Palabra, mientras Marta estaba atareada en muchos quehaceres. Acercándose, pues, dijo: «Señor, ¿no te importa que mi hermana me deje sola en el trabajo? Dile, pues, que me ayude». Le respondió el Señor: «Marta, Marta, te preocupas y te agitas por muchas cosas; y hay necesidad de pocas, o mejor, de una sola. María ha elegido la parte buena, que no le será quitada».*




En nuestra vida cristiana oración y acción estén también profundamente unidas. Una oración que no conduce a la acción concreta hacia el hermano pobre, enfermo, necesitado de ayuda, el hermano en dificultad, es una oración estéril e incompleta. Pero del mismo modo, cuando en el servicio eclesial se está atento sólo al hacer, se da más peso a las cosas, a las funciones, a las estructuras, y se olvida la centralidad de Cristo, no se reserva tiempo para el diálogo con Él en la oración, se corre el riesgo de servirse a sí mismos y no a Dios presente en el hermano necesitado. San Benito resumía el estilo de vida que indicaba a sus monjes en dos palabras: "*ora et labora*", reza y trabaja. Es de la contemplación, de una fuerte relación de amistad con el Señor donde nace en nosotros la capacidad de vivir y llevar el amor de Dios, su misericordia, su ternura

hacia los demás. Y también nuestro trabajo con el hermano necesitado, nuestro trabajo de caridad en las obras de misericordia, nos lleva al Señor, porque nosotros vemos precisamente al Señor en el hermano y hermana necesitados.



El pasaje de Génesis 18:1-10 describe la aparición de tres hombres a Abraham, uno de los cuales es identificado como el Señor, en el encinar de Mamre. Abraham los recibe con hospitalidad, ofreciéndoles agua para lavar sus pies y comida. Uno de los visitantes anuncia que Sara tendrá un hijo dentro de un año, lo cual provoca la risa de Sara al escuchar la promesa a sus espaldas. En la primera lectura nos encontramos con una de las estampas más evocadoras de los relatos en torno al padre del pueblo de Israel, Abrahán. Es un relato que tiene todas las connotaciones de leyenda sagrada, pero que expresa el misterio de la vida de este personaje que todo se lo jugó apoyado en la palabra de Dios, en su promesa de dar una tierra y una heredad.



La carta a los Colosenses, específicamente los versículos 1:24-28, trata sobre el ministerio de Pablo y el mensaje de Cristo. La lectura pone de manifiesto que el misterio de Dios se ha revelado a los suyos, a la Iglesia, por medio de su ministro. Pablo expresa alegría por sus sufrimientos, los cuales considera parte del cumplimiento de la obra de Cristo por la iglesia. Anuncia a Cristo, aconsejando y enseñando a todos para presentarlos perfectos en Cristo.

## Português

### DOMINGO XVI DO TEMPO COMUM



#### EVANGELHO DE SAN LUCAS 10, 38-42

Naquele tempo, Jesus entrou em certa povoação e uma mulher chamada Marta recebeu-o em sua casa. Ela tinha uma irmã chamada Maria, que sentada aos pés de Jesus, ouvia a sua palavra. Entretanto, Marta atarefava-se com muito serviço. Interveio então e disse: Senhor, não te importas que minha irmã me deixe sozinha a servir? Diz-lhe que venha ajudar-me. O Senhor respondeu-lhe: Marta, Marta, andas inquieta e preocupada com muita coisa, quando uma só é necessária. Maria escolheu a melhor parte, que não lhe será tirada.



No evangelho duas irmãs – Marta e Maria – acolhem Jesus na sua casa. Marta prepara para o hóspede uma boa refeição. Maria senta-se aos pés de Jesus, a escutar o que Jesus diz. São duas atitudes válidas. Um grande mal em nossa sociedade, e também na Igreja, é o ativismo, a falta de disposição para aprofundar o essencial, sob o pretexto de tarefas urgentes. A observação que Jesus faz a Marta – que ela anda ocupada com muitas coisas, mas que uma só é necessária não é uma recusa do empenho da hospitalidade, mas indica uma escala de valores. Maria escolheu a melhor parte! O que Maria faz é

fundamental: escutar. O resto é importante: os afazeres da hospitalidade etc. Jesus censura Marta não porque ela cuida da cozinha, mas porque quer tirar Maria do escutar, para fazê-la entrar no ritmo das suas próprias ocupações. Marta não conhecia a escala de valores de Jesus. Como é desagradável quando vamos visitar alguém e as pessoas ficam tão ocupadas em preparar alguma coisa para comer, e se esquecem que o que nós queremos é conversar, é compartilhar tantas coisas importantes. Marta e Maria, respetivamente a discípula que vive para servir e a discípula que se senta aos pés de Jesus para escutar a Palavra, não representam duas realidades opostas; mas representam duas facetas que, no conjunto, “compõem” a figura do verdadeiro discípulo. Viver como discípulo de Jesus não se resume simplesmente em “fazer coisas”, ainda que boas e úteis. Por outro lado, viver como discípulo de Jesus também não é ficar simplesmente sentado a “olhar para o céu”, desligado das realidades da terra, alheio às necessidades, aos sofrimentos e às alegrias dos homens. O discípulo de Jesus senta-se primeiro aos pés de Jesus, como Maria, a fim de escutar as indicações de Jesus e receber as indicações que Ele dá; depois, como Marta, dispõe-se a servir os irmãos, com dedicação e generosidade.



A primeira leitura do Livro do Gênesis propõe-nos o exemplo de Abraão, o homem que não se importa de gastar tempo com o outro. Quando aparecem junto da sua tenda três visitantes inesperados, Abraão acolhe-os, prepara-lhes um banquete, oferece-lhes o que tem de melhor.
