

There were people in Our Lord's time who wanted Him to separate the bad from the good as well. Among them were people who claimed the moral high ground. "Weeding out" can be the greatest threat of all to the life of the seedling. The problem is identifying which is which. In the case of human beings it is an even more risky business. Race, religion, color, sex, politics are still considered ready-reckoners for identifying society's weeds. The unborn child with abortion, euthanasia for the old, the maimed, the incurables and the burdensome. The handicapped, the institutionalized, the delinquent are penalized, the deviant are ostracized and the poor are patronized. "Weeding out" is not confined to a faceless bureaucracy. We're all tempted to try our hand at it. We are sharp at spotting the undesirables, the troublemakers, the misfits. One shudders to think of the people who might have been weeded out if God had not chosen to intervene. Probably most of the saints. Peter for example. Christ never weeded out Judas. The Church did not always show her master's tolerance. Galileo could testify to that. The spirit of the Inquisition lives on. Excommunications and anathemas may be out of fashion but old habits die hard. The parable of the weeds is starkly simple and yet widely ignored. To the question "Do you want us to go and weed it out?" the answer of Jesus is a categorical "No." And the reason is self-evident. Only God has eyes sufficiently discerning and fingers sufficiently gentle for this job. "Weeding out" is God's prerogative. Life would be so much better for everybody, if only we would leave it to him.

XVI DOMINGO DEL TIEMPO ORDINARIO



EVANGELIO DE SAN MATEO 13, 24-30

En aquel tiempo, Jesús propuso esta parábola a la muchedumbre: “El Reino de los cielos se parece a un hombre que sembró buena semilla en su campo, pero mientras los trabajadores dormían, llegó un enemigo del dueño, sembró cizaña entre el trigo y se marchó. Cuando crecieron las plantas y se empezaba a formar la espiga, apreció también la cizaña. Entonces los trabajadores fueron a decirle al amo: Señor, qué no sembraste buena semilla en tu campo? De dónde, pues, salió esta cizaña? El amo les respondió: De seguro lo hizo un enemigo mío. Ellos le dijeron: Quieres que vayamos a arrancarla? Pero él les contestó: No. No sea que al arrancar la cizaña, arranquen también el trigo. Dejen que crezcan juntos hasta el tiempo e la cosecha y, cuando llegue la cosecha, diré a los segadores: Arranquen primero la cizaña y átenla en gavillas para quemarla; y luego almacenen el trigo en mi granero”.



La fuerte imagen agrícola de hoy nos ayuda a profundar no sólo a qué se parece el Reino de los cielos. Aún más, es una invitación a revisar si estamos en parte configurando nuestra vida con el mismo. La línea general de la Escritura este Domingo gira en torno a la bondad de Dios, del Creador que ha sembrado la buena semilla, aquel que hace maravillas. En primer lugar, hay una pequeña diferencia entre la buena semilla y la mala

semilla con respecto al trigo. Esto es porque la cizaña no deja de ser también una especie de trigo, pero agreste, salvaje y que no hace bien a nuestro cuerpo. Es algo que exteriormente puede parecer lo mismo pero internamente es lo opuesto. No sólo en el mundo, sino que en nuestro propio corazón portamos ambas semillas que crecen dependiendo de cual cuidamos y atendemos más. En algunos momentos somos muy rápidos para ver y arrancar la cizaña ajena, aunque bastante lentos con la propia. Y este es que no es fácil distinguir cual tallo corresponde al uno o al otro hasta la siega. Por eso la cizaña interna es más fácil de eliminar porque podemos ver qué nos aleja o acerca a Dios.



La primera lectura del Libro de la Sabiduría nos habla de Dios, el que cuida de todo lo que existe y a nadie tiene que demostrar que es justo. El Dios de Israel al otorgar a todos los hombres la dignidad de ser hijos, significa la misma religión y condena con ello todo lo que no sea una religión de vida y de amor. Este sería el sentido actual de este texto con el que conviene medirse para que aprendamos a hacer de la religión camino de vida y no de muerte.



“Y de igual manera el Espíritu nos ayuda en nuestra debilidad; PUES QUÉ HEMOS DE PEDIR COMO CONVIENE, NO LO SABEMOS, PERO EL ESPÍRITU MISMO INTERCEDE POR NOSOTROS con gemidos indecibles.”

Por tercer domingo consecutivo, volvemos sobre la carta a los Romanos y sobre el papel del Espíritu en la vida cristiana. Cuando Dios examina nuestro corazón no lo encuentra vacío, sino que allí el Espíritu se ha metido hasta el fondo de nuestro ser.

DOMINGO XVI DO TEMPO COMUM



EVANGELHO DE SÃO MATEUS 13, 24-30

Naquele tempo, Jesus disse às multidões mais esta parábola: “O reino dos Céus pode comparar-se a um homem que semeou boa semente no seu campo. Enquanto todos dormiam, veio o inimigo, semeou joio no meio do trigo e foi-se embora. Quando o trigo cresceu e começou a espigar, apareceu também o joio. Os servos do dono da casa foram dizer-lhe: Senhor, não semeaste boa semente no teu campo? De onde vem então o joio? Ele respondeu-lhes: Foi um inimigo que fez isso. Disseram-lhe os servos: Queres que vamos arrancar o joio? Não! – disse ele – não suceda que, ao arrancardes o joio, arranqueis também o trigo. Deixai-o crescer ambos até à ceifa e, na altura da ceifa, direi aos ceifeiros: apanhai primeiro o joio e atai-o em molhos para queimar; e ao trigo, recolhei-o no meu celeiro”.



O joio e o trigo são muito parecidos, sendo possível diferenciar apenas na fase adulta quando estão nascendo as espigas. Nesta fase, o joio se mantém ereto. Já o trigo adulto, começa a se dobrar e produz espigas na cor castanha enquanto o joio produz espigas de cor preta. Apesar da semelhança, o joio é uma erva daninha que rouba os nutrientes do trigo e as suas espigas podem intoxicar o ser humano. No evangelho Jesus fala do joio e do trigo. Ele compara os dois com a construção do Reino do Céu. Os dois devem crescer juntos até o tempo da colheita. O evangelho e a primeira leitura de hoje destacam a

paciência de Deus que, porque tem em suas mãos todo o poder, se mostra tolerante com sua criatura o homem, que é fraco e peca. Isso contrasta com nossa habitual intolerância, nossos juízos negativos sobre os outros e nossa impaciência que nos leva ao desânimo. A paciência de Deus espera até que a colheita amadureça, para fazer a separação do trigo e do joio no último juízo. O bem e o mal não estão só fora de nós, mas dentro do nosso próprio coração. Somos muito propensos a classificar os outros em bons e maus, esquecendo que só Deus conhece a história de cada um.



A primeira leitura do Livro da Sabedoria fala-nos de um Deus que, apesar da sua força e omnipotência, é indulgente e misericordioso para com os homens, mesmo quando eles praticam o mal. Agindo dessa forma, Deus convida os seus filhos a terem um coração tão misericordioso e tão indulgente como o coração de Deus.



Quando rezamos, é possível que sintamos que nossas orações são vazias e inúteis. Mesmo quando não temos as palavras para dizer, oferecemos nossos corações a Deus, confiando que o Espírito Santo leva esses pensamentos, emoções e frustrações a Deus.
