Corpus Christi needs new Altar Servers!!

These are some of the requirements to serve as an Altar Server:

- You have to be a registered member of Corpus Christi.**
- The boys and girls have to have completed 4th grade.**
- They have to have the Sacrament of First Holy Communion.**

Altar Servers form a very important part of our Parish and we are enriched through their dedication and service. They assist the priest and deacon of the parish during the celebration of the Mass. As visible members of our Parish ministry team, Altar Servers have a responsibility to serve as an example to others of one's commitment to their faith. Serving prayerfully with reverence, respect and attentiveness to the assigned tasks during the Mass is very important.

Some of the tasks Altar Servers perform include carrying the Cross during the entrance and recessional processions; presenting the bread, wine and water to the priest and assist him in receiving the gifts; as well as many other tasks throughout the Mass. These are very important tasks and therefore, the Altar Servers have to undergo extensive training with the help of the more experienced Altar Servers both during training as well as when they first altar serve in a Mass. Servers should be mature enough to understand their responsibilities and to carry them out well and with appropriate reverence.



XVIII DOMINGO DEL TIEMPO ORDINARIO




EVANGELIO DE SAN LUCAS 12, 13-21

En aquel tiempo, hallándose Jesús en medio de una multitud, un hombre le dijo: *“Maestro, dile a mi hermano que comparta conmigo la herencia”*. Pero Jesús le contestó: *“Amigo, ¿quién me ha puesto como juez en la distribución de herencias?”* Y dirigiéndose a la multitud, dijo: *“Eviten toda clase de avaricia, porque la vida del hombre no depende de la abundancia de los bienes que posea”*. Después les propuso esta parábola: *“Un hombre rico obtuvo una gran cosecha y se puso a pensar: ‘¿Qué haré, porque no tengo ya en dónde almacenar la cosecha? Ya sé lo que voy a hacer: derribaré mis graneros y construiré otros más grandes para guardar ahí mi cosecha y todo lo que tengo. Entonces podré decirme: Ya tienes bienes acumulados para muchos años; descansa, come, bebe y date a la buena vida’. Pero Dios le dijo: ‘¡Insensato! Esta misma noche vas a morir. ¿Para quién serán todos tus bienes?’ Lo mismo le pasa al que amontona riquezas para sí mismo y no se hace rico de lo que vale ante Dios”*.



La parábola del rico que acumula la gran cosecha y engrandece sus graneros, en vez de distribuirlo entre los que no tienen para comer, es toda una lección de cómo Jesús ve las cosas de esta vida, aunque él persiga objetivos más grandes. Lucas es defensor de los pobres,

aunque no de la pobreza. Jesús, el profeta, no ha venido para ser juez de causas familiares. Los que siguen Jesús, pues, tienen que sacar las conclusiones del seguimiento del maestro. Si no se desprenden de las riquezas, si se preocupan de amasarlas constantemente, además de cometer injusticia con los que no tienen, se encontrarán, al final, con las manos vacías ante Dios, porque todo su corazón estará puesto en tener un tesoro en la tierra.

Eclesiastés 1:2,3


La primera lectura del Libro de Eclesiastés es un libro de sabiduría que aborda el significado y el propósito de la vida. Se atribuye tradicionalmente al rey Salomón. El capítulo 1, versículo 1, presenta al autor como "el Predicador, hijo de David, rey en Jerusalén", que es otra forma de referirse a Salomón. Eclesiastés comienza afirmando que «todo es vanidad» y termina con la misma declaración (1:1; 12:8). El libro afirma de manera enfática y en repetidas ocasiones que todo carece de sentido («vanidad») sin un enfoque adecuado en Dios. Eclesiastés revela la necesidad de temer a Dios en un mundo caído y frecuentemente confuso y frustrante.



La frase "Busquen los bienes de arriba, donde está Cristo" se encuentra en Colosenses 3:1, la segunda lectura de este domingo. Pablo anima a los creyentes a enfocar su atención y deseos en las cosas espirituales, celestiales, en lugar de las cosas terrenales. Se refiere a buscar la comunión con Cristo y las recompensas eternas que ofrece, en lugar de las posesiones materiales o placeres temporales de este mundo.

DOMINGO XVIII DO TEMPO COMUM



EVANGELHO DE SÃO LUCAS 12, 13-21

Naquele tempo, alguém, do meio da multidão, disse a Jesus: «Mestre, diz a meu irmão que reparta a herança comigo». Jesus respondeu-lhe: «Amigo, quem Me fez juiz ou árbitro das vossas partilhas?» Depois disse aos presentes: «Vede bem, guardai-vos de toda a avareza: a vida de uma pessoa não depende da abundância dos seus bens». E disse-lhes esta parábola: «O campo dum homem rico tinha produzido excelente colheita. Ele pensou consigo: 'Que hei de fazer, pois não tenho onde guardar a minha colheita? Vou fazer assim: Deitarei abaixo os meus celeiros para construir outros maiores, onde guardarei todo o meu trigo e os meus bens. Então poderei dizer a mim mesmo: Minha alma, tens muitos bens em depósito para longos anos. Descansa, come, bebe, regala-te'. Mas Deus respondeu-lhe: Insensato! Esta noite terás de entregar a tua alma. O que preparaste, para quem será?' Assim acontece a quem acumula para si, em vez de se tornar rico aos olhos de Deus».



Malgrado algumas disputas, os irmãos, normalmente, gostam uns dos outros. Até quando? Até o dia em que são chamados a dividir a herança. Diante do dinheiro e dos bens, até mesmo as melhores pessoas, até mesmo os cristãos acabam muitas vezes por perder a cabeça. O trecho do Evangelho de Lucas 12:13-21 narra a

parábola do rico insensato, onde Jesus adverte sobre a ganância e a importância de não colocar a segurança da vida na acumulação de bens materiais. Ele enfatiza que a vida de uma pessoa não se resume à quantidade de bens que possui e que a verdadeira riqueza está em ser rico para Deus. A riqueza é um mal? Não, de modo absoluto. Jesus nunca a condenou, nunca convidou alguém a deitá-la fora, mas pôs em guarda para os sérios perigos que ela esconde. O ideal do cristão não é uma vida miserável. No final da parábola é indicado o erro cometido pelo agricultor rico. Ele não é condenado porque produziu muitos bens, porque trabalhou, porque se empenhou, mas porque acumulou para si próprio, e não enriqueceu aos olhos de Deus.



Um sábio de Israel (Cohélet) oferece-nos a sua reflexão sobre o sentido da vida. Com pessimismo, mas também com realismo, constata que não vale a pena o homem afadigar-se a acumular bens que um dia abandonará. Esses bens nunca encherão de sentido a vida do homem. Embora a reflexão do “Cohélet” não vá mais além, constitui um patamar para partirmos à descoberta de Deus e para encontrarmos em Deus o sentido último da nossa existência.



Na Segunda leitura Paulo convida-nos a optar pelas coisas do alto, em detrimento das coisas da terra.
