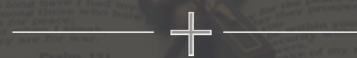

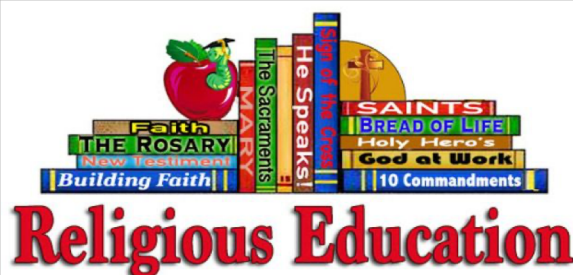
Our Parish Outreach Food Pantry **Needs Your Help**

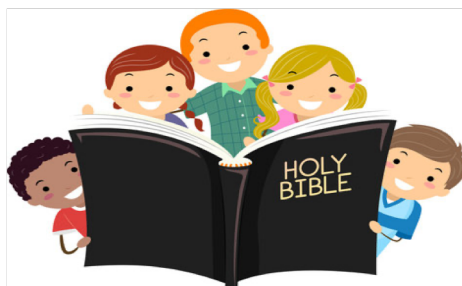

XIX DOMINGO DEL TIEMPO ORDINARIO



EVANGELIO SEGÚN SAN MATEO 14,22-33

«En aquel tiempo, inmediatamente después de la multiplicación de los panes, Jesús hizo que sus discípulos subieran a la barca y se dirigieran a la otra orilla, mientras él despedía a la gente. Después de despedirla, subió al monte a solas para orar. Llegada la noche, estaba él solo allí.

Entretanto, la barca iba ya muy lejos de la costa y las olas la sacudían, porque el viento era contrario. A la madrugada, Jesús fue hacia ellos, caminando sobre el agua. Los discípulos, al verlo andar sobre el agua, se espantaron, y decían: “¡Es un fantasma!” Y daban gritos de terror. Pero Jesús les dijo enseguida: “Tranquilícense y no teman. Soy yo”.

Entonces le dijo Pedro: “Señor, si eres tú, mándame ir a ti caminando sobre el agua”. Jesús le contestó: “Ven”. Pedro bajó de la barca y comenzó a caminar sobre el agua hacia Jesús; pero al sentir la fuerza del viento, le entró miedo, comenzó a hundirse y gritó: “¡Sálvame, Señor!” Inmediatamente Jesús le tendió la mano, lo sostuvo y le dijo: “Hombre de poca fe, ¿por qué dudaste?”

En cuanto subieron a la barca, el viento se calmó. Los que estaban en la barca se postraron ante Jesús diciendo: “Verdaderamente tú eres el Hijo de Dios”».

El acto de Jesús caminando sobre las grandes aguas no es un simple milagro, sino que **dialoga directamente con el Éxodo**. Remite al Dios que domina el mar (Ex 14,24), que abre un camino sobre las aguas (Salmo 77,20) y traza un sendero en medio

de la corriente (Isaías 43,16). **El mismo Jesús se presenta diciendo “Yo soy”, nombre revelado por Dios a Moisés.**

Mateo utiliza el verbo griego *basanizo* para describir cómo la barca era "sacudida" o estremecida por las olas. **Es el mismo verbo que se utiliza para referirse al tormento o sufrimiento extremo causado por una parálisis (como en Mt 8,6).** En la vida misma nosotros somos sacudidos por los sufrimientos, algunos tan violentos que peligra nuestra existencia.

Cuando Pedro baja de la barca, logra lo imposible porque su atención está fijada exclusivamente en el rostro de su Maestro. El punto de inflexión ocurre cuando "ve que el viento era muy fuerte". Al cambiar la dirección de su mirada — de Jesús hacia las olas y la noche —, le entra el miedo y comienza a hundirse. **Si miramos nuestras dificultades, nuestros fracasos o los vientos contrarios, nos paralizamos y nos hundimos. La fe consiste en mantener la mirada fija en el Señor que nos invita a ir a su encuentro.** El Señor no siempre actúa para evitarnos los problemas ni desvía mágicamente todas las tormentas, sino que entrelaza su fuerza con la nuestra para sostenernos dentro de ellas.

La barca es símbolo de la Iglesia, los otros discípulos no se hunden porque están en ella. También nosotros en medio de nuestras dificultades podemos permanecer agitados por el mar, pero sin ahogarnos en cuanto no salgamos de ella.



En la primera lectura, Elías ha huido después de haber sido amenazado de muerte por Jezabel, sin embargo, en medio de esta difícil situación, el Señor se hace presente, aunque sutilmente: en la brisa suave o, literalmente en hebreo, en **la voz del silencio**.

DOMINGO XIX DO TEMPO COMUM



EVANGELHO DE SÃO MATEUS 14, 22-33

Depois de ter saciado a fome à multidão, Jesus obrigou os discípulos a subir para o barco e a esperá-lo na outra margem, enquanto Ele despedia a multidão. Logo que a despediu, subiu a um monte, para orar a sós. Ao cair da tarde, estava ali sozinho. O barco ia já no meio do mar, açoitado pelas ondas, pois o vento era contrário. Na quarta vigília da noite, Jesus foi ter com eles, caminhando sobre o mar. Os discípulos, vendo-O a caminhar sobre o mar, assustaram-se, pensando que fosse um fantasma. E gritaram cheios de medo. Mas logo Jesus lhes dirigiu a palavra, dizendo: «Tende confiança. Sou Eu. Não temais». Respondeu-Lhe Pedro: «Se és Tu, Senhor, manda-me ir ter contigo sobre as águas». «Vem!» – disse Jesus. Então, Pedro desceu do barco e caminhou sobre as águas, para ir ter com Jesus. Mas, sentindo a violência do vento e começando a afundar-se, gritou: «Salva-me, Senhor!» Jesus estendeu-lhe logo a mão e segurou-o. Depois disse-lhe: «Homem de pouca fé, porque duvidaste?» Logo que saíram para o barco, o ventou amainou. Então, os que estavam no barco prostraram-se diante de Jesus, e disseram-Lhe: «Tu és verdadeiramente o FilhodoDeus».



Depois de despedir a multidão e de obrigar os discípulos a embarcar para a outra margem, Jesus “subiu a um monte para orar, a sós. Enquanto Jesus está em diálogo com o Pai, os discípulos estão sozinhos, em viagem pelo lago. Essa viagem, no entanto, não é fácil nem serena... É de noite; o barco é açoitado pelas ondas e navega dificilmente, com vento contrário. O quadro refere-se, certamente, à situação da comunidade a que Mateus destina o seu Evangelho. A “noite” representa as trevas, a escuridão, a confusão, a insegurança em que tantas vezes “navegam” através da história os discípulos de Jesus, sem saberem exactamente que caminhos percorrer nem para onde ir... As “ondas” que açoitam o barco representam a hostilidade do mundo, que bate continuamente contra o barco em que viajam os discípulos... Os “ventos contrários” representam a oposição, a resistência do mundo ao projecto de Jesus. Quantas vezes, na sua viagem pela história, os discípulos de Jesus se sentem perdidos, sozinhos, abandonados, desanimados, desiludidos, incapazes de enfrentar as tempestades que as forças da morte e da opressão (o “mar”) lançam contra eles...



A primeira leitura convida os crentes a regressarem às origens da sua fé e do seu compromisso, a fazerem uma peregrinação ao encontro do Deus da comunhão e da Aliança; e garante que o crente não encontra esse Deus nas manifestações espectaculares, mas na humildade, na simplicidade, na interioridade.
