Our heavenly Father draws people towards Himself in strange, unpredictable ways. The rejection of Our Savior by the Jews resulted in His more rapid acceptance throughout the Gentile world. Even the lapses and sins of mankind can be turned to good account, says Paul in a section of his letter to the Romans: "God has imprisoned all men in disobedience only to show mercy on all." Our own past sins will not bar us from Christ-they only show us how much we need Him."

Why would Jesus want to limit himself to "the lost sheep of the house of Israel?" Was He not concerned for people of other nations, like that foreign woman who pleaded for is help? (1)She didn't give up; (2) she found the perfect answer: "Even the pups get the crumbs that fall from the master's table!".(3) her prayer was answered, and her faith praised. But still, what do we make of the initial remark? Jesus's primary mission was the conversion of his own people. He first wanted to revive the Jewish People, so that these in turn would furnish a "house of prayer for all nations." However, even during His lifetime He was willing to receive those pagans who came to Him; and He predicted that in future "many will come from East and West, and will sit down at the table in the Kingdom of God." Which was the world-wide mission of the disciples, after the Resurrection! We (the pups) got the crumbs (the word of God) that the Jews rejected (fell) from the master's table".

XX DOMINGO DEL TIEMPO ORDINARIO



EVANGELHO DE SÃO MATEUS 15, 21-28

En aquel tiempo, Jesús se retiró a la comarca de Tiro y Sidón. Entonces una mujer cananea le salió al encuentro y se puso a gritar: *“Señor, hijo de David, ten compasión de mí. Mi hija está terriblemente atormentada por un demonio”*. Jesús no le contestó una sola palabra; pero los discípulos se acercaron y le rogaban: *“Atiéndela, porque viene gritando detrás de nosotros”*. Él les contestó: *“Yo no he sido enviado sino a las ovejas descarriadas de la casa de Israel”*. Ella se acercó entonces a Jesús y postrada ante él, le dijo: *“Señor, ayúdame”*. Él replicó: *“No está bien quitarles el pan a los hijos para echarlo a los perritos”*. Pero ella replicó: *“Es cierto, Señor; pero también los perritos se comen las migajas que caen de la mesa de sus amos”*. Entonces Jesús le respondió: *“Mujer, qué grande es tu fe! Que se cumpla lo que deseas”*. Y en aquel mismo instante quedó curada su hija.

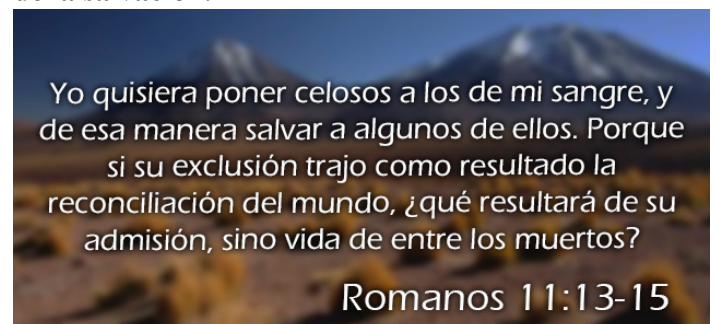


En el evangelio, la actitud de Jesús hacia la mujer cananea puede parecer, inicialmente, una actitud dura. La mentalidad judía consideraba que el pan de los hijos (los judíos) no debía darse a los perros (los paganos). El pan hacía referencia a las promesas y bendiciones de Dios. La mujer no es hija de Israel y no tiene derecho a pedir lo que pide y a decir lo que dice. No obstante, la mujer cananea, con gran audacia, con toda la fuerza de su amor maternal y

con toda la esperanza puesta en Jesús, suplica que su hija sea curada. Esta actitud dará paso a una incondicional acogida por parte de Jesús, manifestándole: *Mujer, qué grande es tu fe. Que se cumpla lo que deseas*. El evangelio anuncia que, con Jesús, se produce un gran cambio: el fin del exclusivismo religioso para abrir el horizonte de la salvación a todos. La lección es para los discípulos de Jesús: esta mujer se comporta mejor que los judíos, es más que una hija de Israel, es capaz de mover el mundo y llegarse al corazón de Dios. Jesús actúa de acuerdo con las leyes judías y muestra como quién es el y qué ha venido a hacer: llamar a todos, salvar a todos.



La primera lectura es del profeta Isaías. Para Israel, era impensable que los extranjeros pudiesen formar parte del pueblo elegido, pero esa lectura anuncia el deseo de Dios de que todos participen de la salvación. *“A los extranjeros los traeré a mi monte santo, los llenaré de júbilo en mi casa de oración”*. Se amplían los horizontes. Es el gran anuncio de la universalidad de la salvación.



El apóstol Pablo, judío y fariseo, sufría al ver que sus hermanos los judíos se resistían a aceptar a Jesús como el Salvador; pero recuerda que los dones y la llamada divina son irrevocables. Por eso confiesa a los romanos (gentiles, non judíos) que desea despertar los celos de su pueblo y lograr salvar algunos de ellos.

DOMINGO XX DO TEMPO COMUM



EVANGELHO DE SÃO MATEUS 15, 21-28

Naquele tempo, Jesus retirou-se para os lados de Tiro e Sidónia. Então, uma mulher cananeia, vinda daqueles arredores, começou a gritar: *“Senhor, Filho de David, tem compaixão de mim. Minha filha está cruelmente atormentada por um demónio”*. Mas Jesus não lhe respondeu uma palavra. Os discípulos aproximaram-se e pediram-lhe: *“Atende-a, porque ela vem a gritar atrás de nós”*. Jesus respondeu: *“Não fui enviado senão às ovelhas perdidas da casa de Israel”*. Mas a mulher veio prostrar-se diante dele, dizendo: *“Socorre-me, Senhor”*. Ele respondeu: *“Não é justo que se tome o pão dos filhos para o lançar aos cachorrinhos”*. Mas ela insistiu: *“É verdade, Senhor, mas também os cachorrinhos comem das migalhas que caem da mesa de seus donos”*. Então Jesus respondeu-lhe: *“Mulher, é grande a tua fé. Faça-se como desejas”*. E, a partir daquele momento, a sua filha ficou curada.



As três leituras deste domingo coincidem em acentuar o universalismo da salvação de Deus. No Evangelho Jesus demonstra como eram ridículas as atitudes de discriminação dos pagãos propostas pela religião oficial judaica. Deus ama cada um dos seus filhos e a todos convida para o banquete do Reino. O Evangelho apresenta a realização da profecia que encontramos na primeira leitura. Jesus, depois de constatar como os fariseus e os doutores da Lei recusam a sua proposta do Reino, entra numa região

pagã e demonstra como os pagãos são dignos de acolher o dom de Deus. No novo Povo de Deus têm lugar tanto os judeus, cujas promessas e chamamento Deus não anula, como os gentios e pagãos. Face à grandeza da fé da mulher cananeia, Jesus oferece-lhe essa salvação que Deus prometeu derramar sobre todos os homens e mulheres, sem excepção. A mulher cananéia é um modelo de fé e oração unidas, isto é, de fé suplicante.



Na primeira leitura deste domingo, do Livro do profeta Isaías, Jahvéh garante aos seu Povo a chegada de uma nova era, na qual se vai revelar plenamente a salvação de Deus. No entanto, essa salvação não se destina apenas a Israel: destina-se a todos.



A segunda leitura, da Carta de Paulo aos Romanos, sugere que a misericórdia de Deus se derrama sobre todos os seus filhos, mesmo sobre aqueles que, como Israel, rejeitam as suas propostas. Deus respeita sempre as opções dos homens.
