

# **Pastor's Notes**



11 September falls on a Monday this year; recalling the tragic time 22 years ago when our beloved homeland was attacked by terrorists. Nearly 3000 souls from 60-plus different nations perished that day (with still more than 1000 bodies never identified). And through these many years, thousands more have died from related illnesses, especially our brave first responders. After 9/11/2001, I was doing a lot of funeral Masses and/or memorial Masses (without a body present). At one Mass, a widowed mother whose son died that day, gave me a steel cross, given to her by fire-fighters in New York City. The steel came from the Twin Towers, for family members who lost loved ones. So much of that steel has spread throughout the USA, for countless communities to have memorials in remembrance of the faithful departed souls. On Saturday and Sunday 9 and 10 September, we invite all our parishioners at the end of all Masses, to form a procession in the center aisle, to venerate the Cross of Christ. We will attach the small steel cross to the large wooden cross, which we always use on Good Friday. In this way, we honor the memory of all those who died at the hands of terror, as we lift them up to the glory and the victory of Christ Crucified!!! Please join me and the civic leaders of Mineola on Monday 11 September at 7:00 PM, at the Mineola Memorial Park in a remembrance ceremony of prayer and peace, for all the faithful departed souls of 9/11/2001.

What does the Lord want from us? What does he mean by "renounce yourself," "lose your life for my sake," "carry your cross," or "present your bodies as a holy sacrifice?" Surely these words don't refer to anything suicidal, to devaluing of this present life, its joys and its achievements. And yet, are these not something more than a pious way of saying: Put up with what cannot be changed? These are questions to revolve in the mind, without expecting any quick or simple solution. God's Word challenges us out of any complacency with a comfortable, conforming religion. It unmasks our many evasions, our double standards, our desire for "cheap grace" — wanting salvation at a cut price, unwilling to involve ourselves in sacrifice. Perhaps a clue to this demand is in the first reading in Jeremiah's extraordinary accusation that he was seduced by God. Letting his prophetic vocation overpower him, Jeremiah was involved in many a thankless task. He had fallen in love with God, so that nothing held him back from doing God's will, no matter where this might lead. Have we fallen in love with Christ? Are we seduced by him, so as to give to his service all that is ours to give? Wouldn't that be becoming a living sacrifice?

All growth, all lasting achievement demands effort and sacrifice. Yet the sacrifice can be a satisfying part of experience, when orientated towards a high and valued goal, like practicing any skill. So, the self discipline involved in Catholic life, and accepting the circumstances in which God places us, contribute to our personal destiny. And we look forward in hope to the great reward of loyal service — when the Son of man, coming in glory, will reward all according to their behavior.

# Español XXII DOMINGO DEL TIEMPO ORDINARIO



### EVANGELIO DE SAN MATEO 16, 21-27

En aquel tempo, comenzó Jesús a anunciar a sus discípulos que tenía que ir a Jerusalén para padecer allí mucho de parte de los ancianos, de los sumos sacerdotes y de los escribas; que tenía que ser condenado a muerte y resucitar al tercer día. Pedro se lo llevó aparte y trató de disuadirlo, diciéndole: "No lo permita Dios, Señor. Eso no puede suceder a ti". Pero Jesús se volvió a Pedro y le dijo: "Apártate de mí, Satanás, y no intentes hacerme tropezar en mi camino, porque tu modo de pensar no es el de Dios, sino el de los hombres". Luego Jesús dijo a sus discípulos: "El que quiera venir conmigo, que renuncie a sí mismo, que tome su cruz y me siga. Pues el que quiera salvar su vida, la perderá; pero el que pierda su vida por mí, la encontrará. De qué le sirve a uno ganar el mundo entero si pierde su vida? Y qué podrá dar uno a cambio para recobrarla? Porque el Hijo del hombre ha de venir rodeado de la gloria de su Padre, en compañia de sus ángeles, y entonces le dará a cada uno lo que merecen sus obras".



Este domingo, el Evangelio nos muestra a Jesús explicando a sus discípulos seriamente que la misión que había traído con Él, le iba a exigir padecer mucho. Pedro quería tanto al Maestro que solo pensar en lo que le estaba diciendo le entristecía.

Pedro y los discípulos La oposición de Pedro y de los discípulos significa que su comprensión del misterio de Jesús todavía es muy imperfecta. Para Pedro y los discípulos la misión del Mesías es una misión gloriosa y vencedora. Su comportamiento se interponía entre Jesús y el cumplimiento de la misión que el Padre le había encomendado. Jesús avisa a los discípulos de que el camino de vida verdadera no pasa por los triunfos humanos, sino que pasa por el amor y por la entrega de la vida. Jesús va a recorrer ese camino; y quien quiera ser su discípulo, tiene que aceptar el recorrer un camino semejante.



En la primera lectura el profeta Jeremías estaba apasionado por la Palabra de Dios y sabía que no tendría descanso si no la proclamaba con fidelidad. El texto nos presenta una desconcertante oración de Jeremías realizada en un momento dramático de desilusión y de desánimo, cuando preso por los ministros del rey Sedecías, es echado en una cisterna y se hunde en el lodo. El amor por Dios y por su Palabra está tan vivo en el corazón del profeta que es inútil resistir. La Palabra de Dios es un fuego devorador, que consume el corazón del profeta y que no le deja abandonar la misión. La historia de Jeremías es la historia de todos aquellos a los que Dios llama a ser profetas. Dios nunca ha prometido a ningún profeta un camino fácil de glorias y de triunfos.



En la segunda lectura, San Pablo nos exhorta a no ajustarnos a este mundo. Nuestra obligación es transformarnos para poder discernir la voluntad de Dios.

# Português domingo xxII do tempo comum



# EVANGELHO DE SÃO MATEUS 16, 21-27

Naquele tempo, Jesus começou a explicar aos seus discípulos que tinha de ir a Jerusalém e sofrer muito da parte dos anciãos, dos príncipes dos sacerdotes e dos escribas; que tinha de ser morto e ressuscitar ao terceiro dia. Pedro, tomando-o à parte, começou a contestá-lo, dizendo: "Deus te livre de tal, Senhor! Isso não há-de acontecer"! Jesus voltou-se para Pedro e disse-lhe: "Vai-te daqui, Satanás. Tu és para mim uma ocasião de escândalo, pois não tens em vista as coisas de Deus, mas dos homens". Jesus disse então aos seus discípulos: "Se alguém quiser seguir-me, renuncie a si mesmo, tome a sua cruz e siga-me. Pois quem quiser salvar a sua vida há-de perdê-la; mas quem perder a sua vida por minha causa, há-de encontrá-la. Na verdade, que aproveita ao homem ganhar o mundo inteiro, se perder a sua vida? Que poderá dar o homem em troca da sua vida? O Filho do homem há-de vir na glória de seu Pai, com os seus Anjos, e então dará a cada um segundo as suas obras".



O Evangelho de hoje continua o do domingo passado e, até mesmo, o pressupõe. No domingo passado, os apóstolos, sobretudo Pedro, confessaram que Jesus de Nazaré era o Cristo, o Filho de Deus vivo. Mas imaginavam um Messias triunfante e dominador. Hoje, Jesus corrige o retrato, anunciando-lhes a paixão, a morte e a ressurreição, coisas que eles não podiam sequer imaginar, pois se Jesus era o Filho de

Deus, não podia morrer. Foi muito difícil para Jesus, explicar aos discípulos o seu caminho de libertação e santidade. Os discípulos sempre haviam pensado numa libertação temporal, na qual Jesus, como Moisés antes, conduziria o povo judeu, libertando-o da dominação romana. Os discípulos não entendiam e se confundiam, como nos mostra o Evangelho. Jesus chama Pedro de pedra de tropeço ou pedra de escândalo. Isso logo depois de afirmar que sobre ele, Pedro (pedra) fundaria a Igreja. Jesus chama a Pedro de satanás. Satanás é aquele que se opõe aos planos de Deus. Pedro, sem maldade, está pensando em dissuadir Jesus de ir a Jerusalém ao encontro da Paixão. Por isso Jesus o repele.



Na primeira leitura, o profeta Jeremias descreve a sua experiência. Seduzido por Yahwéh, Jeremias colocou toda a sua vida ao serviço de Deus e dos seus projectos. Nesse caminho, ele teve que enfrentar os poderosos, conhecer o sofrimento, a solidão e a perseguição.



Na segunda leitura Paulo convida os cristãos a oferecerem toda a sua existência de cada dia a Deus. Isso significa não nos conformarmos com a lógica do mundo.
