## **Pastor's Notes**

I trust that your children are back in their respective schools and colleges, along with registering for our religious education program. Summer actually extends until 21 September, so I hope that you found some time during these warm months to relax and recreate with your family: along with some spiritual moments alone with the Lord. September also calls us as adults to return to our regular routines; reminding us of the fundamental goodness and dignity of the work we do in our homes, jobs, schools, communities and church. Let us all pray that our children and young people have a far better experience in their educational endeavors; especially compared to last year's challenges battling covid-19.

The American flag outside the Church has been flying at half-mast since Friday 27 August, when 13 members of the United States military died in Afghanistan; sacrificing their lives for the protection of a people yearning for freedom from religious oppression and persecution. 11 young men and 2 young women, representing the Marines, Navy and Army, lost their lives to terrorists, after an all-too-long war on a distant land. During these near-20 years in Afghanistan, more than 2400 Americans died, and well over 20,000 returned home injured. Their sacrifices were not in vain, because the fight against terrorism must continue on in the name of true justice. Let us pray for God's peace to reign supreme over all the nations of the earth; particularly over all people caught in the cross-fire of violence and blood-shed.

We call 11 September "Patriots' Day" in our country; recalling the tragic time 20 years ago when our beloved homeland was attacked by terrorists. Nearly 3000 souls from 60-plus different nations perished that day (with still more than 1000 bodies never identified). And through these many years, thousands more have died from related illnesses, especially our brave first responders.

After 9/11/2001, I was doing a lot of funeral Masses and/or memorial Masses (without a body present). At one Mass, a widowed mother whose son died that day, gave me a steel cross, given to her by fire-fighters in New York City. The steel came from the Twin Towers, for family members who lost loved ones. So much of that steel has spread throughout the USA, for countless communities to have memorials in remembrance of the faithful departed souls.

This year on 11/12 September, we invite all our parishioners at the end of all Masses, to form a procession in the center aisle, to venerate the Cross of Christ. We will attach the small steel cross to the large wooden cross, which we always use on Good Friday. In this way, we honor the memory of all those who died at the hands of terror, as we lift them up to the glory and the victory of Christ Crucified!!!

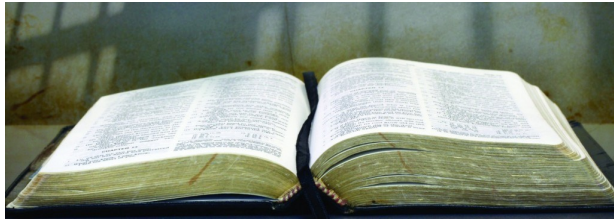

# Español

## XXIV DOMINGO DEL TIEMPO ORDINARIO



En aquel tiempo, Jesús y sus discípulos se dirigieron a los poblados de Cesarea de Filipe. Por el camino les hizo esta pregunta: *“¿Quién disse la gente que soy yo?”* Ellos contestaron: *“Algunos dicen que eres Juan el Bautista; otros, que Elías y otros, que alguno de los profetas”*. Entonces él les preguntó: *“¿Y ustedes, quién dicen que soy yo?”* Pedro le respondió: *“Tú eres el Mesías”*. Y él les ordenó que no se lo dijeran a nadie. Luego se puso a explicarles que era necesario que el Hijo del hombre padeciera mucho, que fuera rechazado por los ancianos, los sumos sacerdotes y los escribas, que fuera entregado a la muerte y resucitara al tercer día. Todo esto lo dijo con entera claridad. Entonces Pedro se lo llevó aparte y trataba de disuadirlo. Jesús se volvió, y mirando a sus discípulos, reprendió a Pedro con estas palabras: *“Apártate de mí Satanás! Porque tú no juzgas según Dios, sino según los hombres”*. Después llamó la multitud y a sus discípulos y les dijo: *“El que quiera venir conmigo, que renuncie a sí mismo, que cargue con su cruz y que me siga. Pues el que quiera salvar su vida, la perderá; pero el que pierda su vida por mí y por el Evangelio, la salvará”*.



Esta palabra de Dios nos enfrenta este domingo con la cuestión que es la clave de nuestro cristianismo: ¿quién es Jesús para nosotros? La pregunta nos la hace el mismo Cristo, como entonces se la dirigió a

sus discípulos. Seguro que no es la primera vez que la escuchamos. Pues bien: hemos sido bautizados en el nombre de la Santa Trinidad: Padre, Hijo y Espíritu Santo; hemos sido instruidos en las enseñanzas de Jesús; por los sacramentos participamos de la gracia salvífica de Dios; procuramos llevar una vida ordenada según el espíritu del Evangelio, a pesar de nuestras caídas en el pecado. Nos preguntamos qué más podemos y debemos hacer para obtener la salvación, la vida eterna? La piedra de toque es el concepto de Mesías. Para los judíos, el Mesías había de restaurar el reino de David, de expulsar los romanos, extender las fronteras de Israel, darle la supremacía sobre los reinos de la tierra; un Mesías poderoso, glorioso, que impondría por la fuerza la ley y la justicia. Pero Jesús tenía otras intenciones, según los proyectos de Dios. Por eso declaró a Pilato que su reino no era de este mundo. La máxima expresión de la entrega del hombre a Dios es Jesucristo crucificado, que entrega su vida entera en manos del Padre. ¿Quién es un discípulo aplicado de Jesús? Bien está creer y practicar, pero el verdadero discípulo de Jesús trata de imitarlo en su entrega generosa, pues esto es lo que se ajusta a la voluntad del Padre. Si confiamos en Dios y caminamos en su presencia, nuestro Dios compasivo nos salvará.



El Siervo Sufriente es un hombre fiel a Dios, perseguido y atacado. Él sabe que el Señor lo asiste y por tanto nadie podrá acusarlo.

**Así también la fe, si no tiene obras, es muerta en sí misma.**

Las obras de caridad realizadas con amor por el necesitado permiten exteriorizar el compromiso con el Evangelio. (segunda lectura)

## Português

### DOMINGO XXIV DO TEMPO COMUM



#### EVANGELHO DE SÃO MARCOS 8, 27-35

Naquele tempo, Jesus partiu com os seus discípulos para as povoações de Cesareia de Filipe. No caminho, fez-lhes esta pergunta: *“Quem dizem os homens que eu sou?”* Eles responderam: *“Uns dizem João Baptista; outros, Elias; e outros, um dos profetas”*. Jesus então perguntou-lhes: *“E vós, quem dizeis que eu sou?”* Pedro tomou a palavra e respondeu: *“Tu és o Messias”*. Ordenou-lhes então severamente que não falassem dele a ninguém. Depois, começou a ensinar-lhes que o Filho do homem tinha de sofrer muito, de ser rejeitado pelos anciãos, pelos sumos sacerdotes e pelos escribas, de ser morto e ressuscitar três dias depois. E Jesus dizia-lhes claramente estas coisas. Então, Pedro tomou-o à parte e começou a contestá-lo. Mas Jesus, voltando-se e olhando para os discípulos, repreendeu Pedro, dizendo: *“Vai-te, Satanás, porque não compreendes as coisas de Deus, mas só as dos homens”*. E chamando a multidão com os seus discípulos, disse-lhes: *“Se alguém quiser seguir-me, renuncie a si mesmo, tome a sua cruz e siga-me. Na verdade, quem quiser salvar a sua vida perdê-la-á; mas quem perder a vida, por causa de mim e do Evangelho, salvá-la-á”*.



Jesus é conhecido em todo o mundo, mas para muitos ele não passa de um grande profeta, de um líder ou mesmo de um revolucionário. Para nós, cristãos, Jesus é o Messias, o Filho de Deus. Professar a nossa fé, nós o fazemos tantas vezes, mas, para muitos, como para Pedro, acreditar que Jesus é o Messias, não quer dizer aceitar o caminho que ele tomou para salvar-nos. A cruz é sempre difícil de ser aceita. Preferimos uma fé vitoriosa, como os discípulos, e não a vitória através da cruz. Acreditar em Jesus é aderir a este líder rejeitado e morto – que também será ressuscitado. É segui-lo no mesmo caminho. Não existe verdadeira fé sem a via-sacra.



Quem são as pessoas que contam na nossa sociedade? De quem se fala com admiração? Dos que têm sucesso, dos fortes, dos vencedores, dos que conseguem impor-se na política, no comércio, no desporto etc. E os que são derrotados? São os falhados. Todos os dias verificamos que as pessoas se deixam levar facilmente pelas aparências. Quando confrontamos os nossos juízos com os de Deus, damos-nos conta de que os critérios que Ele segue são muito diferentes dos nossos. Na Primeira Leitura deste domingo, o profeta Isaías fala do “Servo do Senhor”. Ele é a figura do Cristo sofredor.
