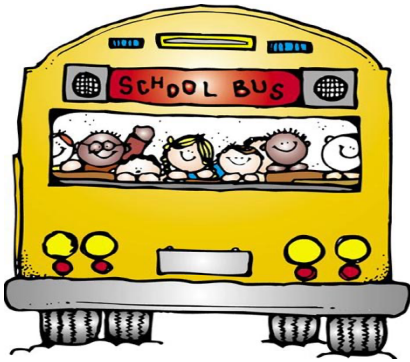

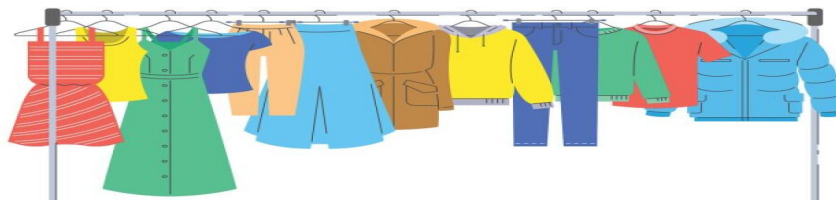

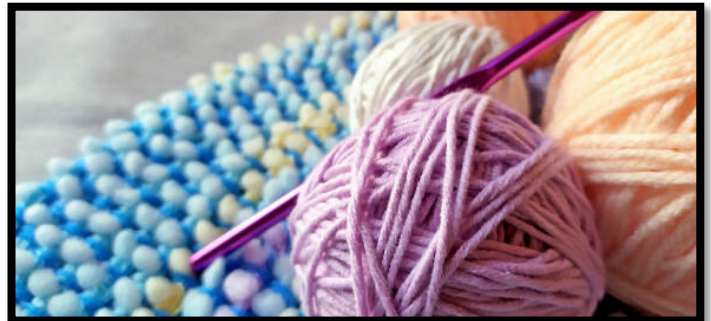

We probably all find it easier telling people who they are than listening to people tell us who they really are. In particular, we can struggle to hear the story of someone's brokenness, especially if our picture of them has been one that doesn't allow for that. Peter wasn't able to hear Jesus talking about himself as a broken, failed, rejected Messiah. It was really only after the resurrection that Peter and the disciples were able to come to terms with such brokenness, such failure. It can be a struggle for us to accept failure and brokenness in others and also to accept our own brokenness. Jesus could accept his own failure, his own brokenness, because he trusted in God as one who would make him whole. Because he could accept his own failure, his own brokenness, he was at home with the failure and brokenness of others. The broken, the failures of this world, flocked to him, and in his presence they came alive. We will more easily accept our own brokenness and failures if we know in our heart of hearts that we too can approach the Lord as one who can make us whole. The Eucharist has been described as bread broken for a broken people. The Lord who was broken on the cross for us is present in the Eucharist as our Life-Giver. We approach the Lord in the Eucharist in our own brokenness asking to be made whole, and asking also for the grace to be able to sit with others in their brokenness.

XXIV DOMINGO DEL TIEMPO ORDINARIO



EVANGELIO: SAN MARCOS 8, 27-35

En aquel tiempo, Jesús y sus discípulos se dirigieron a los poblado de Cesarea de Filipo. Por el camino les hizo esta pregunta: “¿Quién dice la gente que soy yo?” Ellos le contestaron: “Algunos dicen que eres Juan el Bautista; otros, que Elías; y otros, que alguno de los profetas”. Entonces él les preguntó: “Y ustedes, ¿quién dicen que soy yo?” Pedro le respondió: “Tú eres el Mesías”. Y él les ordenó que no se lo dijeran a nadie. Luego se puso a explicarles que era necesario que el Hijo del hombre padeciera mucho, que fuera rechazado por ancianos, los sumos sacerdotes y los escribas, que fuera entregado a la muerte y resucitara al tercer día. Todo esto lo dijo con entera claridad. Entonces Pedro se lo llevó aparte y trataba de disuadirlo. Jesús se volvió, y mirando a sus discípulos, reprendió a Pedro con estas palabras: “¡Apártate de mí, Satanás! Porque tú no juzgas según Dios, sino según los hombres”. Después llamó la multitud y a sus discípulos, y les dijo: “El que quiera venir conmigo, que renuncie a sí mismo, que cargue con su cruz y que me siga. Pues el que quiera salvar su vida, la perderá; pero el que pierda su vida por mí y por el Evangelio, la salvará”.

El evangelio nos presenta un momento determinante de la vida de Jesús en que debe plantear a los suyos las razones de su identidad para el seguimiento: a donde van? A quién siguen? El texto del evangelio tiene cuatro momentos muy precisos: la intención de Jesús y la confesión mesiánica de Pedro en nombre de los discípulos; el primer anuncio de la pasión; el reproche de Jesús a Pedro y a los discípulos por pretender un mesianismo que no entran en el proyecto de Dios, que Jesús asume hasta las últimas consecuencias, como el mismo Siervo de Yahvé. Y finalmente, los dichos sobre el seguimiento. Las palabras sobre el seguimiento de Jesús son para toda la gente, no solamente para sus discípulos. El reproche de Jesús a Pedro, uno de los más duros del evangelio, porque su mentalidad es como la de todos los hombres y no como la voluntad de Dios, es bastante significativo. Jesús les enseña que su papel mesiánico es dar la vida por los otros. El triunfo cristiano es saber entregarse a los demás.



L primera lectura es del Libro del profeta Isaías. Estamos ante el uno de los famosos cantos del Siervo de Yahvé, una de las cumbres teológicas del Antiguo Testamento desde todos los puntos de vista. La fidelidad a Dios por encima de las afrentas que debe sufrir, ponen de manifiesto el misterio del dolor como la capacidad que se debe tener frente a toda violencia. Los cristianos supieron aplicarlo a Cristo, porque encontraron en esta descripción del Siervo de Yahvé una semejanza inigualable con la vida de Jesús.

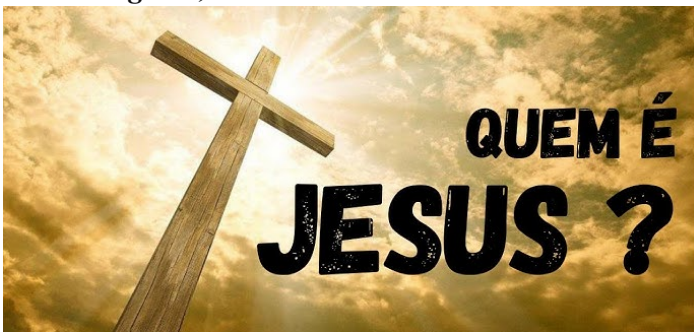

DOMINGO XXIV DO TEMPO COMUM



EVANGELHO: SÃO MARCOS 8, 27-35

Naquele tempo, Jesus partiu com os seus discípulos para as povoações de Cesareia de Filipe. No caminho, fez-lhes esta pergunta: “*Quem dizem os homens que eu sou?*”? Eles responderam: “*Uns dizem João Baptista; outros, Elias; e outros, um dos profetas*”. Jesus então perguntou-lhes: “*E vós, quem dizeis que eu sou?*”? Pedro tomou a palavra e respondeu: “*Tu es o Messias*”. Ordenou-lhes então severamente que não falassem dele a ninguém. Depois começou a ensinar-lhes que o Filho do homem tinha de sofrer muito, de ser rejeitado pelos anciãos, pelos sumos sacerdotes e pelos escribas; de ser morto e ressuscitar três dias depois. E Jesus dizia-lhes claramente estas coisas. Então, Pedro tomou-o à parte e começou a contestá-lo. Mas Jesus, voltando-se e olhando para os discípulos, repreendeu Pedro, dizendo: “*Vai-te, Satanás, porque não compreendes as coisas de Deus, mas só a dos homens*”. E chamando a multidão com os seus discípulos, disse-lhes: “*Se alguém quiser seguir-me, renuncie a si mesmo, tome a sua cruz e siga-me. Na verdade, quem quiser salvar a sua vida perdê-la-á; mas quem perder a vida, por causa de mim e do Evangelho, salvá-la-á*”.

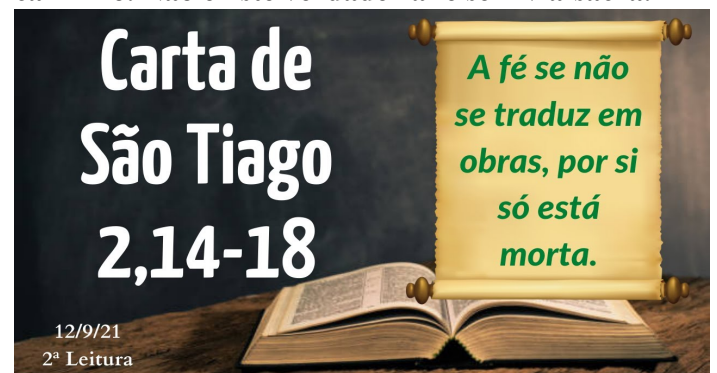


Seria bom que os cristãos sentissem como dirigida a si a pergunta que Jesus fez aos seus discípulos: Vós,

quem dizeis que eu sou? A pergunta que Jesus dirigiu aos discípulos e dirige a nós. Hoje, como então, pode haver uma grande diferença entre as palavras com que professamos a nossa fé e aquilo que realmente acreditamos de Cristo. Não se trata aqui de uma resposta meramente teórica, mas uma resposta que deve trazer repercussões na nossa vida. Talvez devêssemos pensar na pergunta de Jesus dessa forma: *Que papel Ele desempenha na minha vida? Como me relaciono com Ele? Estou disposto a renunciar a tudo para segui-lo?* Perguntas atuais numa sociedade como a nossa que virou as costas para o Cristo, afirmando ser Ele ultrapassado.



A primeira leitura, do Livro de Isaias, fala do Servo Sofredor de Deus. Ele não teme o fracasso e a perseguição, pois Deus está com ele. Acreditar em Jesus é aderir a este líder rejeitado e morto – que também será ressuscitado. É segui-lo no mesmo caminho. Não existe verdadeira fé sem via-sacra.



Na Segunda leitura São Tiago lembra aos seus irmãos na fé que o seguimento de Jesus não se concretiza com belas palavras ou com teorias, mas com gestos concretos de amor para com os irmãos.
