

XXV DOMINGO DEL TIEMPO ORDINARIO



En aquel tiempo, Jesús y sus discípulos atravesaban Galilea, pero él no quería que nadie lo supiera, porque iba enseñando a sus discípulos. Les decía: *“El Hijo del hombre va a ser entregado en manos de los hombres; le darán muerte, y três días después de muerto, resusitará”*. Pero ellos no entendían aquellas palabras y tenían miedo de pedir explicaciones. Legaron a Cafarnaún, y una vez en casa, les preguntó: De que discutían por el camino? Pero ellos se quedaron calados, porque en el camino habían discutido sobre quién de ellos era el más importante. Entonces Jesús se sentó, llamó a los Doce y les dijo: *“Si alguno quiere ser el primero, que sea el último de todos y el servidor de todos. Después, tomando a un niño, lo puso en medio de ellos, lo abrazó y les dijo: El que recibe en mi nombre a uno de estos niños, a mí me recibe. Y el que me reciba a mí, no me recibe a mí, sino aquel que me ha enviado”*.



Tanto San Marcos como Santiago son realistas y reconocen que en sus comunidades, como en las nuestras, se deja sentir el peso de la

naturaleza humana y sus apetencias, por muy cristianos que nos consideremos. A nadie le gusta ser el peor ni ocupar el último lugar. Jesús valora según otros criterios, corrige las falsas ambiciones humanas y denuncia el peligro de pretender trasladar esos errores de apreciación humana a la naturaleza del Reino de los Cielos. Ahora bien, el Evangelio no niega que haya que ocupar los primeros puestos retomando lo que Jesús ha dicho en este Evangelio: *“Si uno quiere ser el primero...”*: por lo tanto, es posible querer ser el primero, no está prohibido, no es pecado. Sólo que revela una vía nueva y diferente para realizarlo: no a costa de los demás, sino a favor de los demás. Añade, de hecho: *“sea el último de todos y el servidor de todos”*.

**Donde hay envidias
y ambiciones egoístas,
también habrá desorden
y toda clase de maldad.
Santiago 3:16**

La Segunda Lectura de este domingo sigue en la misma línea de la Primera y nos prepara para escucha del Evangelio. Las rivalidades y confrontaciones en una comunidad proceden de la ambición y de la invidia. La sabiduría de Dios es totalmente diferente a la de los hombres. La sabiduría de Dios siempre conduce a la paz, mientras la de los hombres fácilmente nos lleva a la confrontación, la guerra.



Tanto en tiempos antiguos como ahora, para los impíos, los paganos, la vida del justo les es incómoda, porque se ven en ella condenados.

DOMINGO XXV DO TEMPO COMUM



EVANGELHO DE SÃO MARCOS 9, 30-37

Naquele tempo, Jesus e os seus discípulos caminhavam através da Galileia. Jesus não queria que ninguém o soubesse, porque ensinava os discípulos, dizendo-lhes: *“O Filho do homem vai ser entregue às mãos dos homens que vão matá-lo; mas ele, três dias depois de morto, ressuscitará”*. Os discípulos não compreendiam aquelas palavras e tinham medo de o interrogar. Quando chegaram a Cafarnaum e já estavam em casa, Jesus perguntou-lhes: *“Que discutíeis no caminho?”* Eles ficaram calados, porque tinham discutido uns com os outros sobre qual deles era o maior. Então, Jesus sentou-se, chamou os Doze e disse-lhes: *“Quem quiser ser o primeiro será o último de todos e o servo de todos”*. E tomando uma criança, colocou-a no meio deles, abraçou-a e disse-lhes: *“Quem receber uma destas crianças em meu nome é a mim que recebe; e quem me receber não me recebe a mim, mas Aquele que me enviou”*.



Jesus surpreende os discípulos numa conversa pouco edificante. Tratavam de um tema que fascina aos seres humanos: quem dentre nós é o maior? Houve muitas respostas. Cada um querendo convencer aos outros de suas qualidades. O que chama à atenção é o papel que Jesus atribui à criança, que coloca no meio deles e abraça. Quem quiser ser grande deverá ter a simplicidade de uma

criança. Jesus acolhe os pequenos e deixa muito claro: o Reino de Deus pertence a eles. Temos que ter muito cuidado com o poder, com os desejos de grandeza, com as tentativas de domínio sobre os outros. Jesus é muito claro. *Os últimos serão os primeiros e os primeiros serão os últimos no Reino dos Céus.*



Na 2.^a leitura,

Tiago exorta os crentes a viverem segundo a “Sabedoria de Deus” e denuncia a desunião na sua comunidade, apontando a raiz de tudo isso:

“Onde há inveja e rivalidade, aí estão as desordens e toda a espécie de obras más...”
(Tg 3,16-4,3)

Uma oração realizada nesse clima não pode ser escutada por Deus...

A segunda leitura é um sermão para aqueles que se deixam levar pelas ambições não somente no mundo mas também dentro da própria religião. O tema desta missa é a humildade, a simplicidade e tem como exemplo a criança apresentada por Jesus no Evangelho.



A primeira leitura da missa deste domingo diz-nos que os que optam por seguir a sabedoria de Deus irão ao encontro da perseguição, porque incomodam, perturbam os que continuam a construir a própria vida segundo a lógica da competição, do domínio, da exploração dos mais fracos. As palavras desta leitura são dirigidas aos israelitas que vivem na cidade de Alexandria do Egito, mas todos notamos facilmente que correspondem ao que aconteceu a Jesus. Ele foi perseguido pelos seus próprios irmãos de fé, não porque era mau, mas porque era justo, por levar uma vida exemplar, por denunciar as injustiças e anunciar uma mensagem que provocava e embaraçava os detentores do poder. Ainda hoje, os que procuram ser fiéis ao Evangelho são desprezados, criticados, ridiculizados por aqueles que se julgam superiores.
