

Dear Friends and Family of Corpus Christi Church,

This year of 2025 culminates the ongoing “National Eucharistic Revival” in every Roman Catholic Church throughout our country. The front facade of Corpus Christi Church is finally finished with the beautiful mosaic of the “monstrance” holding the Most Blessed Sacrament. But more importantly inside the church, the real presence of our Risen Lord Jesus in the Eucharist is the source and summit of everything we are and all that we do as Catholics. As your Pastor, I pray that our weekly hours of Adoration (Mondays, 8:00-9:00 AM; Wednesdays, 1:00-2:00 PM; Thursday, 7:00-8:00 PM) will continue to grow with your personal prayers & presence in worship of Christ Jesus.

Autumn is always the traditional time for our once-a-year parish fundraiser, by way of the four raffle tickets we are sending to each home. They are \$25 each, which will go toward the cost of purchasing two new doors leading into the Rectory offices. The current doors are wooden, and have been in place for more than 40 years. So clearly, they are deteriorating. Any additional funds that we raise will go towards needed improvements in the two large bathrooms in the lower hall of the Church. There will be three cash prizes (\$1,500, \$1,000, \$500) to be drawn on Sunday 23 November at the end of the 11:30 AM Mass, celebrating the Solemnity of Christ the King!

We give gratitude to God for your faithful giving to our parish; most importantly by your presence and prayers. But also we are thankful for your weekly support of Corpus Christi, and the financial assistance we need to operate on a balanced budget as best as possible. Please return the raffle ticket stubs and donations to the rectory by mail, in person, or in the collection baskets.







XXVI DOMINGO DEL TIEMPO ORDINARIO



EVANGELIO SEGÚN SAN LUCAS 16, 19-31

En aquel tiempo, Jesús dijo a los fariseos: "Había un hombre rico, que se vestía de púrpura y telas finas y banqueteaba espléndidamente cada día. Y un mendigo, llamado Lázaro, yacía a la entrada de su casa, cubierto de llagas y ansiando llenarse con las sobras que caían de la mesa del rico. Y hasta los perros se acercaban a lamerle las llagas.

Sucedió, pues, que murió el mendigo y los ángeles lo llevaron al seno de Abraham. Murió también el rico y lo enterraron. Estaba éste en el lugar de castigo, en medio de tormentos, cuando levantó los ojos y vio a lo lejos a Abraham y a Lázaro junto a él.

Entonces gritó: 'Padre Abraham, ten piedad de mí. Manda a Lázaro que moje en agua la punta de su dedo y me refresque la lengua, porque me torturan estas llamas'. Pero Abraham le contestó: 'Hijo, recuerda que en tu vida recibiste bienes y Lázaro, en cambio, males. Por eso él goza ahora de consuelo, mientras que tú sufres tormentos. Además, entre ustedes y nosotros se abre un abismo inmenso, que nadie puede cruzar, ni hacia allá ni hacia acá'.

El rico insistió: 'Te ruego, entonces, padre Abraham, que mandes a Lázaro a mi casa, pues me quedan allá cinco hermanos, para que les advierta y no acaben también ellos en este lugar de tormentos'. Abraham le dijo: 'Tienen a Moisés y a los profetas; que los escuchen'. Pero el rico replicó: 'No, padre Abraham. Si un muerto va a decírselo, entonces sí se arrepentirán'. Abraham repuso: 'Si no escuchan a Moisés y a los profetas, no harán caso, ni aunque resucite un muerto' ".




Con esta parábola San Lucas contrapone dos posturas frecuentes en la sociedad: la del rico que come hasta hartarse, y la del pobre que sólo recibe la ayuda de Dios en el cielo, pues aquí en la tierra Lázaro sufre y apenas si alcanza las migajas sobrante del comilón rico. El evangelio insiste en la caducidad de la riqueza y de la pobreza frente a la suerte definitiva después de la muerte. La falta de generosidad del rico convierte sus riquezas en injustas, al no pensar más que en darse la gran vida sin preocuparse de los necesitados. El rico es culpable frente a Lázaro, no frente a los pobres en general, que siempre puede ser una excusa; frente a una persona con nombre propio que se ha encontrado en su vida. El abismo entre los ricos y los pobres, según Lucas quiere poner de manifiesto, puede y debe cambiarse en el presente. El futuro se hace en el presente y quien sabe cambiar su presente, cambia también el futuro. Este es el objetivo final también de la narración sobre el rico y el pobre Lázaro. Los que usan las riquezas sólo para sí... se están cerrando el futuro. El rico experimenta su indigencia cuando comprueba que ya no tiene poder para aliviar sus penas ni la de sus familiares.



La primera lectura es del libro del profeta Amós. Una de las investidas más fuertes y acres del profeta es ésta que se lee en este domingo y que nos recuerda las situaciones más escandalosas de la sociedad de consumo. El profeta de la justicia social sabe advertir contra aquellos que se refugian en la riqueza. Una sociedad muy injusta. Los ricos se hacen más ricos y los pobres más pobres. El profeta no callará. Llegará, como llegó, la crisis, la destrucción por medio de la gran potencia Asiria. La injusticia trae destrucción; siempre ha sido así. El profeta Amós condena la complacencia, la opulencia y el orgullo de las elites de Israel, que viven en la comodidad mientras ignoran la ruina espiritual y social de su pueblo. El pasaje advierte que Dios los juzgará por su injusticia y les arrebatará su prosperidad, y los llevará al cautiverio al igual que le sucedió a otras ciudades que despreciaron el juicio de Dios.

DOMINGO XXVI DO TEMPO COMUM



EVANGELHO DE SÃO LUCAS 16, 19-31

Naquele tempo, disse Jesus aos fariseus: «Havia um homem rico, que se vestia de púrpura e linho fino e se banquetava esplendidamente todos os dias. Um pobre, chamado Lázaro, jazia junto do seu portão, coberto de chagas. Bem desejava saciar-se do que caía da mesa do rico, mas até os cães vinham lambe-lhe as chagas. Ora sucedeu que o pobre morreu e foi colocado pelos Anjos ao lado de Abraão. Morreu também o rico e foi sepultado. Na mansão dos mortos, estando em tormentos, levantou os olhos e viu Abraão com Lázaro a seu lado. Então ergueu a voz e disse: ‘Pai Abraão, tem compaixão de mim. Envia Lázaro, para que molhe em água a ponta do dedo e me refresque a língua, porque estou atormentado nestas chagas’. Abraão respondeu-lhe: ‘Filho, lembra-te que recebeste os teus bens em vida e Lázaro apenas os males. Por isso, agora ele encontra-se aqui consolado, enquanto tu és atormentado. Além disso, há entre nós e vós um grande abismo, de modo que se alguém quisesse passar daqui para junto de vós, ou daí para junto de nós, não poderia fazê-lo’. O rico insistiu: ‘Então peço-te, ó pai, que mandes Lázaro à minha casa paterna – pois tenho cinco irmãos – para que os previna, a fim de que não venham também para este lugar de tormento’. Disse-lhe Abraão: ‘Eles têm Moisés e os Profetas. Que os oiçam’. Mas ele insistiu: ‘Não, pai Abraão. Se algum dos mortos for ter com eles, arrependem-se-ão’. Abraão respondeu-lhe: ‘Se não dão ouvidos a Moisés nem aos Profetas, mesmo que alguém ressuscite dos mortos, não se convencerão’.



A história de um rico anónimo e de um mendigo chamado Lázaro é mais uma das “lições” que Jesus oferece enquanto caminha para Jerusalém. Trata-se de um episódio exclusivo de Lucas, que mais nenhum dos evangelistas refere. Desta vez, a “lição” de Jesus não se destina apenas aos discípulos: destina-se também aos fariseus (cf. Lc 16,14), que representam todos aqueles que amam o dinheiro e vivem em função dos bens materiais. Há uma coisa que Jesus deixa bem claro na parábola: Deus não está de acordo com a nossa insensibilidade diante do sofrimento, com a nossa indiferença face ao irmão necessitado, com o egoísmo que nos leva a olhar apenas para o nosso bem-estar, com o esbanjamento dos bens que pertencem a todos os homens.



Na maneira de pensar do povo de Israel, os ricos eram considerados como abençoados por Deus. A primeira leitura, do profeta Amós, ao invés, se opõe duramente a estas pessoas, pois, aproveitando-se da própria condição social, levavam uma vida ociosa e prazenteira. O profeta Amós denuncia violentamente o egoísmo dos ricos e poderosos, agarrados a uma vida de luxo e esbanjamento, indiferentes à sorte dos pequenos e dos pobres. O profeta avisa que Deus não está disposto a suportar uma situação que contrasta com o projeto que sonhou para o mundo e para os homens. Se Israel insistir em continuar nesse caminho, irá sofrer as consequências das suas escolhas egoístas.
